Number of Population as of January 1 2018



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As of January 1, 2018 the population of Georgia equaled 3,729.6 thousand persons, up by 0.1 percent from the previous year². It should be mentioned that in 2017 the natural increase (the difference between the number of births and the number of deaths) equaled 5,471 persons.

58.3 percent of the Georgian population lives in urban settlements. At the same time, almost one third of total population lives in the capital Tbilisi.

Compare to previous year, the share of male population increased by 0.3 percent to equal 1,791.6 thousand persons, while the share of female population decreased by 0.1 percent totaling 1,938.1 thousand persons. Men and women account, respectively, for 48 percent and 52 percent of the total population.

In 2018, the median age equaled 35 years for males and 40 years for females.



In 2018 the share of persons aged 0-14 equaled 20.0 percent, the share of working age population (15-64 years old) -65.4 percent, while the share of elderly (65 years and older) was 14.6 percent.

Figure 1: Population by major age groups (%) and sex



At the young ages the share of males exceeds that of females, which women outnumber men in the age group of 65 and above due to females' higher life expectancy.




Figure 2: Population by sex and age (%)

In 2017 the life expectancy at birth equaled 73.5 years, including 69.2 years for males and 77.8 years for females.

Migration

In 2017 the number of emigrants was 85,451 persons and the number of immigrants amounted to 83,239 persons. As a result, the net migration (the difference between the number of immigrants and the number of emigrants) turned out negative equaling -2,212 persons.
