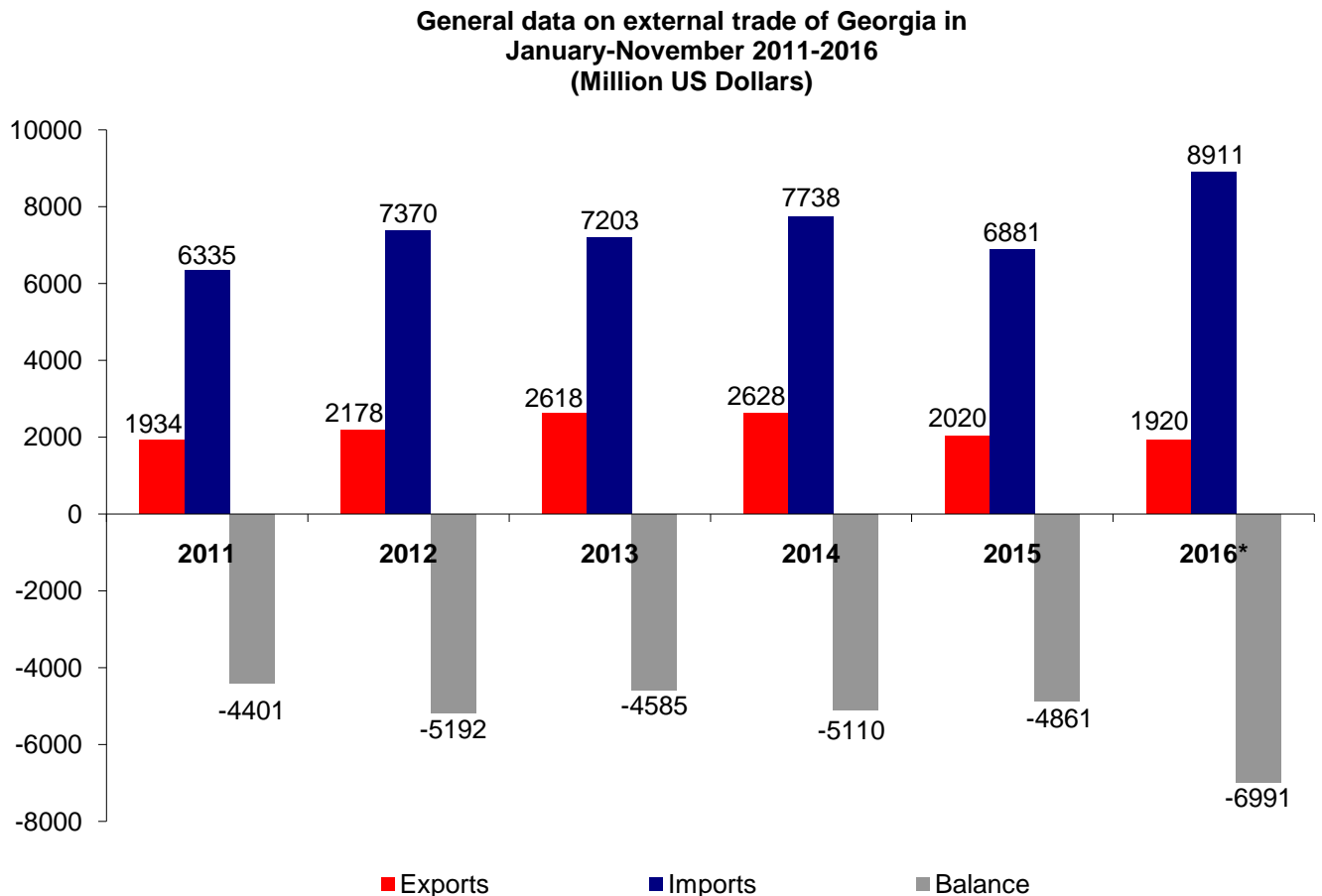
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## External Trade of Georgia in January-November 2016 (Preliminary)

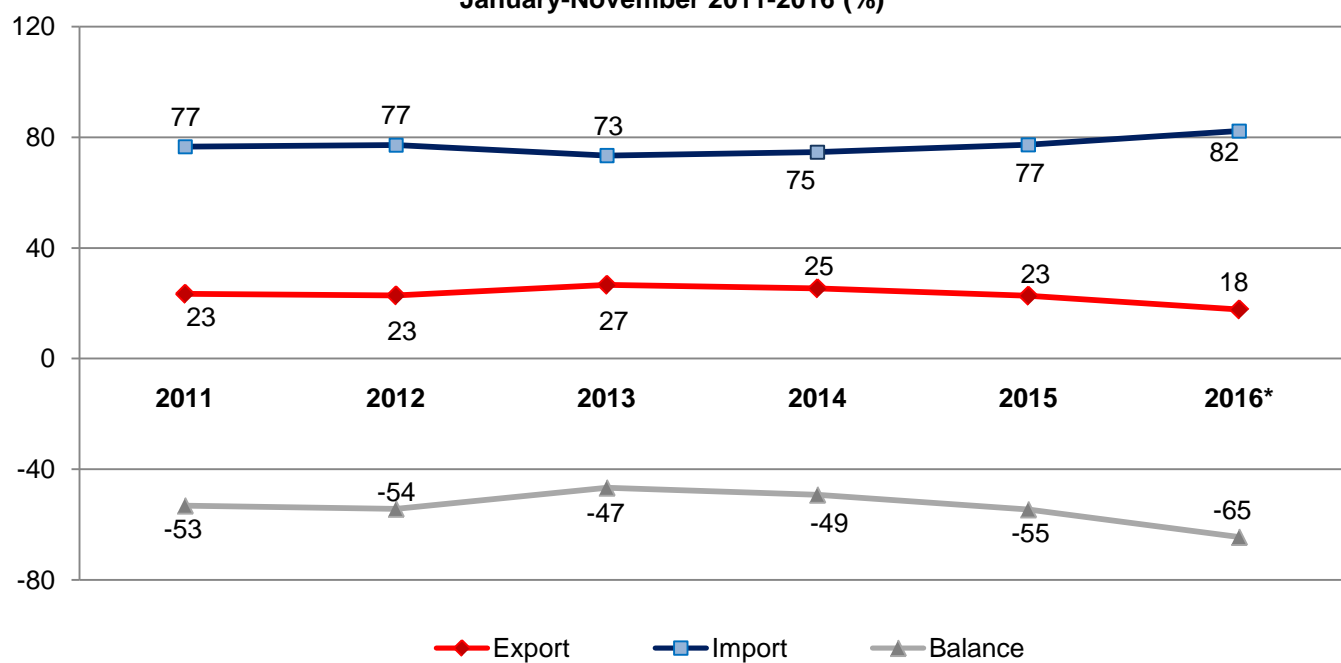
In January-November 2016 external merchandise trade (excluding non-declared trade) in Georgia amounted to USD 10830 million, 22 percent higher year-on-year. The exports equaled USD 1920 million (5 percent lower), while the imports stood at USD 8911 million (29 percent higher). It should be noticed that in the accounting period import of C hepatitis medicaments took place excluding which import equals USD 6513 million (1 percent lower). The negative trade balance was USD 6991 million in January-November 2016 and its share in external trade turnover constituted 65 percent. Export excluding re-export amounted to USD 1506 million, 0.5 percent higher year-on-year.

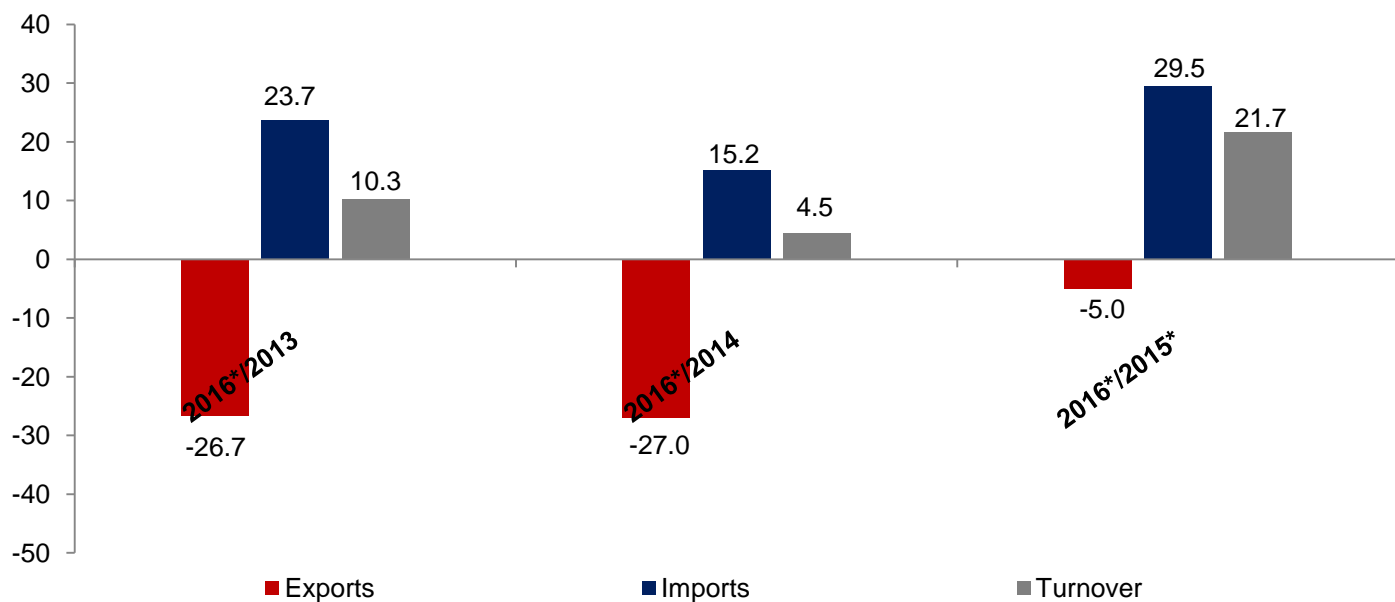

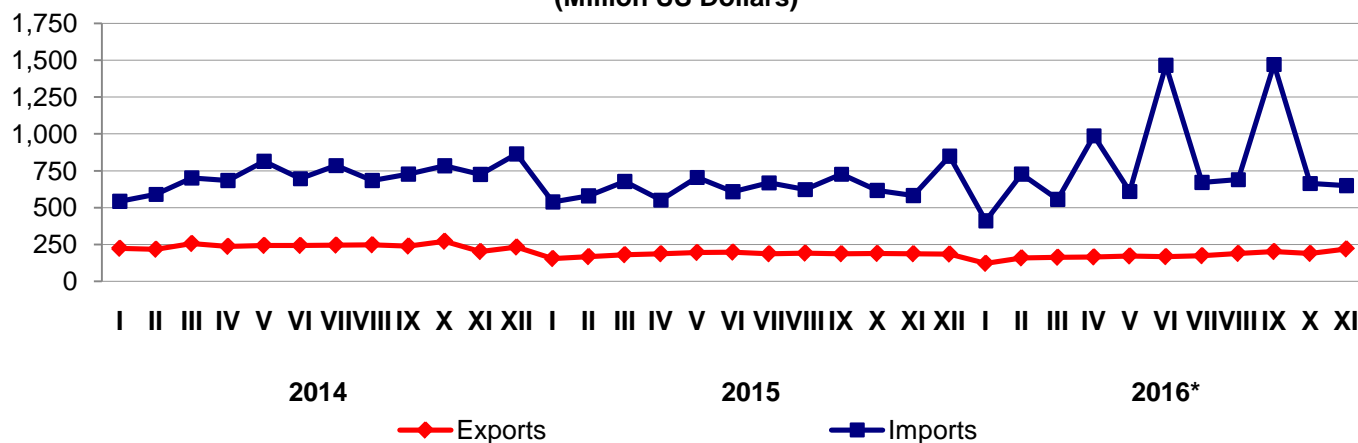

(Million US Dollars)

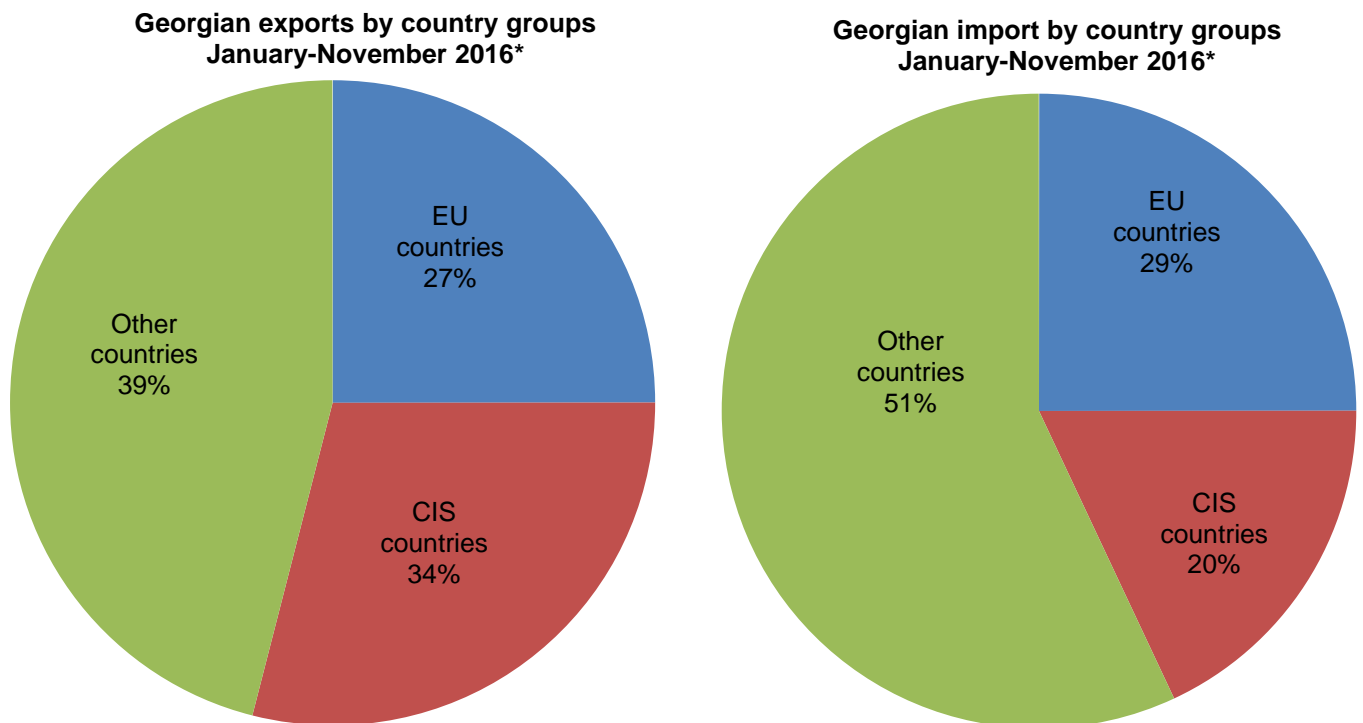

In January-November 2016 the external trade turnover of Georgia with the EU countries amounted to USD 3086 million, grew by 11 percent compared to the corresponding indicator of the previous year. Exports amounted to USD 513 million (14 percent lower), while imports amounted to USD 2573 million (17 percent higher). The share of these countries in the external trade turnover of Georgia amounted to 28 percent, 27 percent in exports and 29 percent in imports (in January-November 2015 31, 30 and 32 percent correspondingly). 29 percent of the trade deficit came to the EU countries (33 percent in January-November 2015).

In January-November 2016 the external trade turnover of Georgia with the CIS countries totaled USD 2422 million (lower by 4 percent compared to January-November 2015). Exports stood at USD 659 million (14 percent lower), while imports equaled USD 1763 million (1 percent higher). The share of the CIS countries in the external trade turnover of Georgia constituted 22 percent, 34 percent in exports and 20 percent in imports (In January-November 2015 28, 38 and 25 percent, respectively). In January-November 2016, compared to the corresponding period of the previous year, CIS countries accounted for 16 percent of the overall trade deficit (20 percent in January-November 2015).

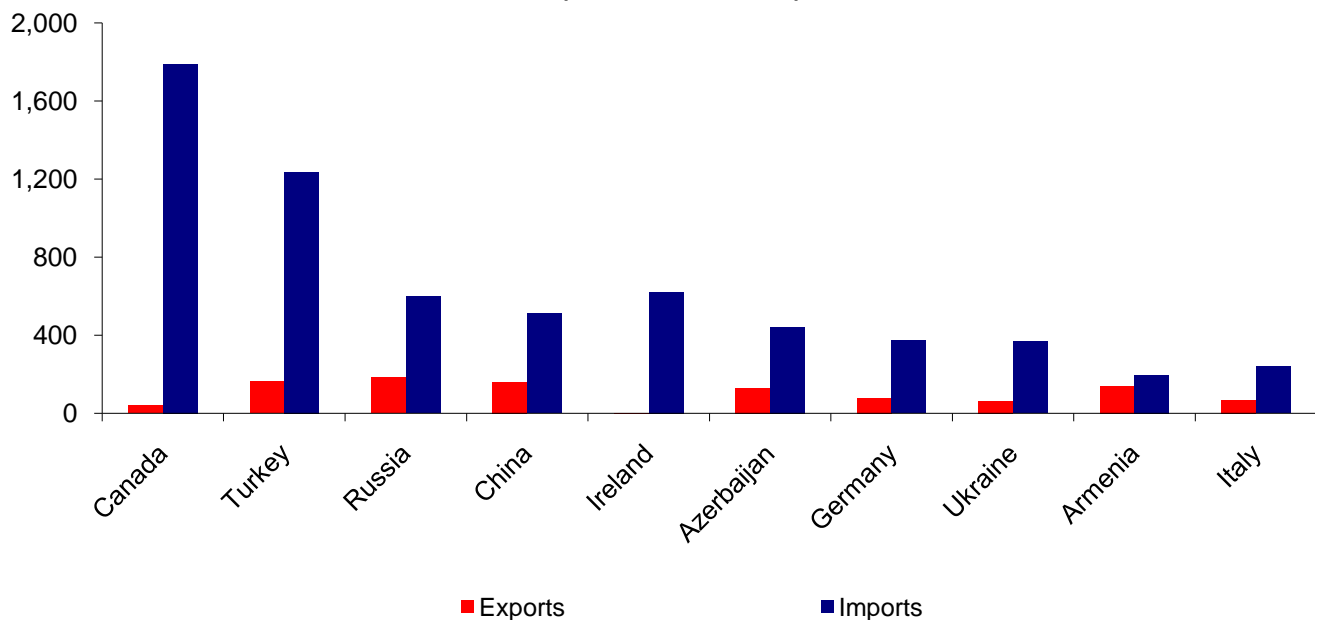
In January-November 2016 share of the top ten trading partners in the total external trade turnover of Georgia amounted to 68 percent. The top trading partners were Canada (USD 1831 million), Turkey (USD 1400 million) and Russia (USD 781 million).

(Million US Dollars)



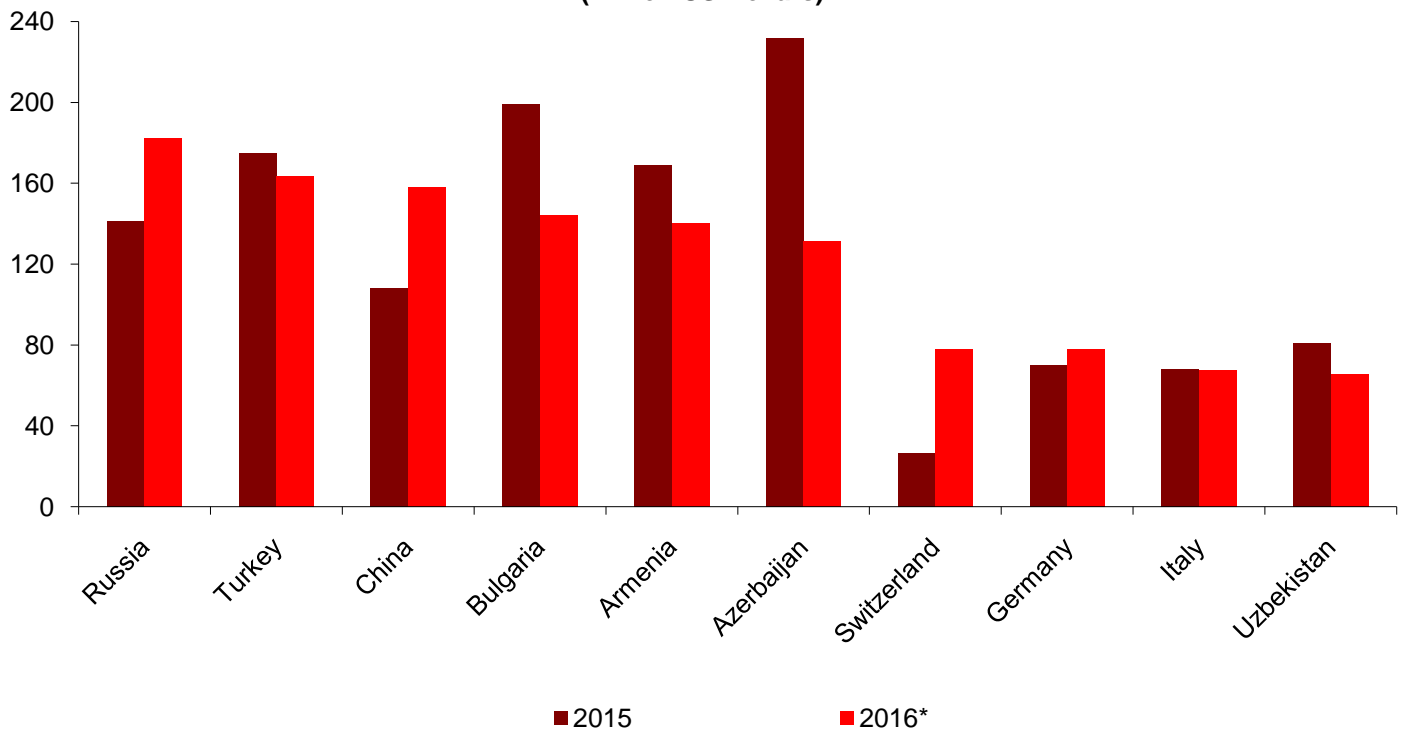

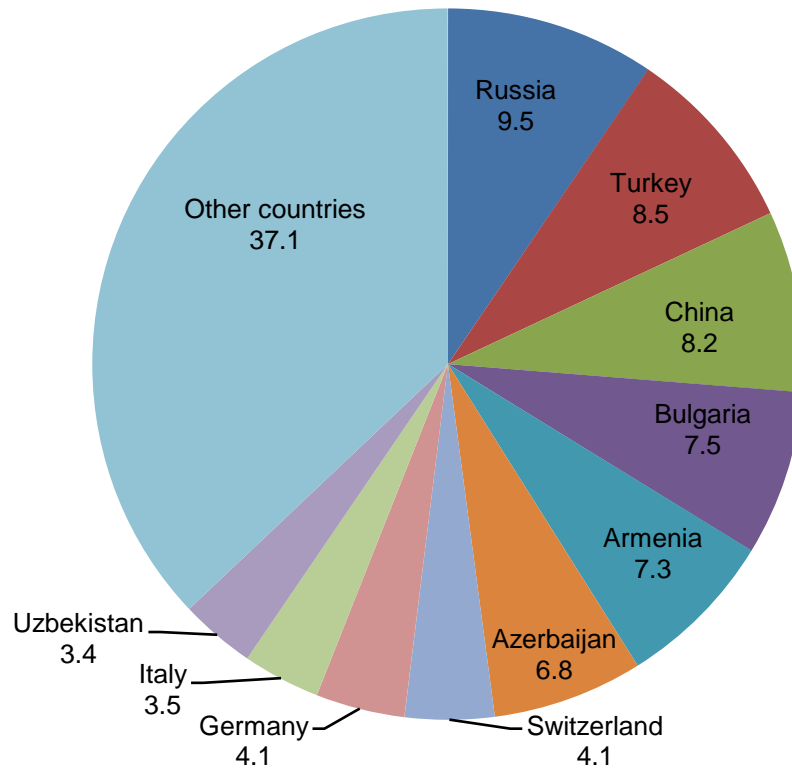

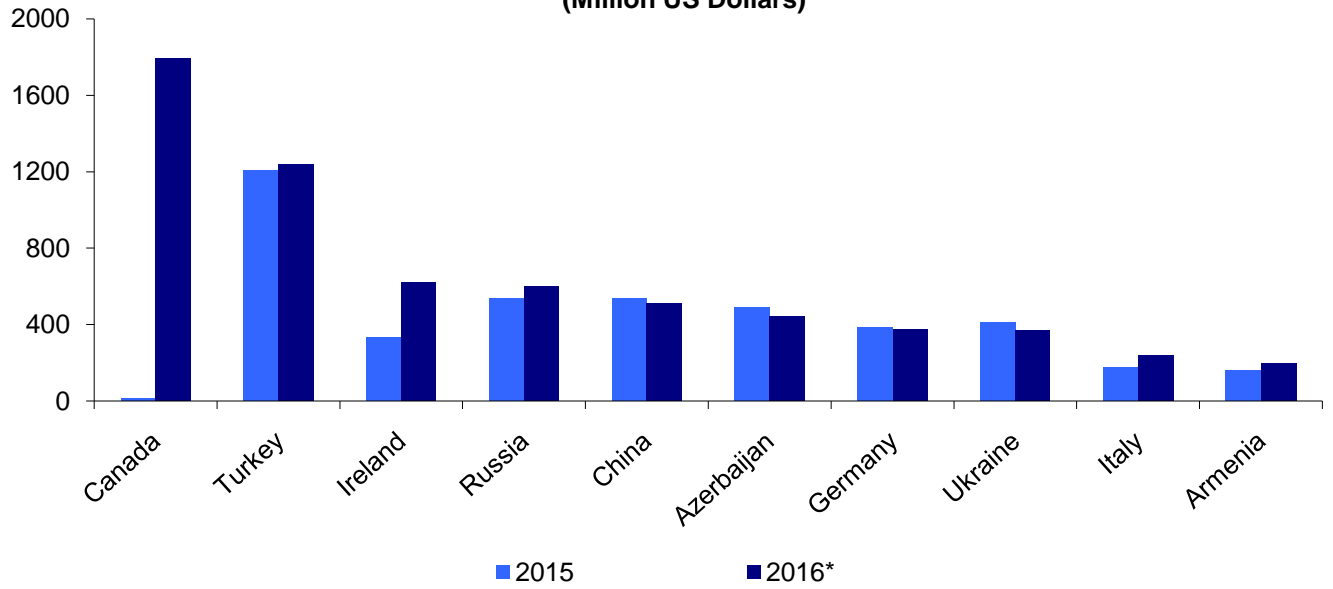

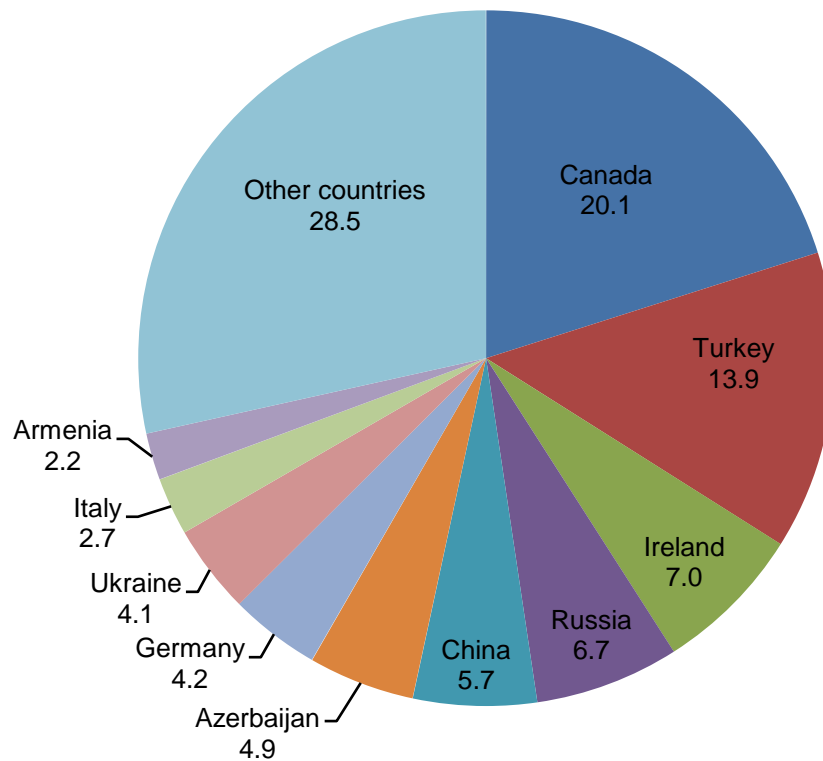


**Top trading partners by imports in January-November 2015-2016

## Major commodity groups by exports and imports

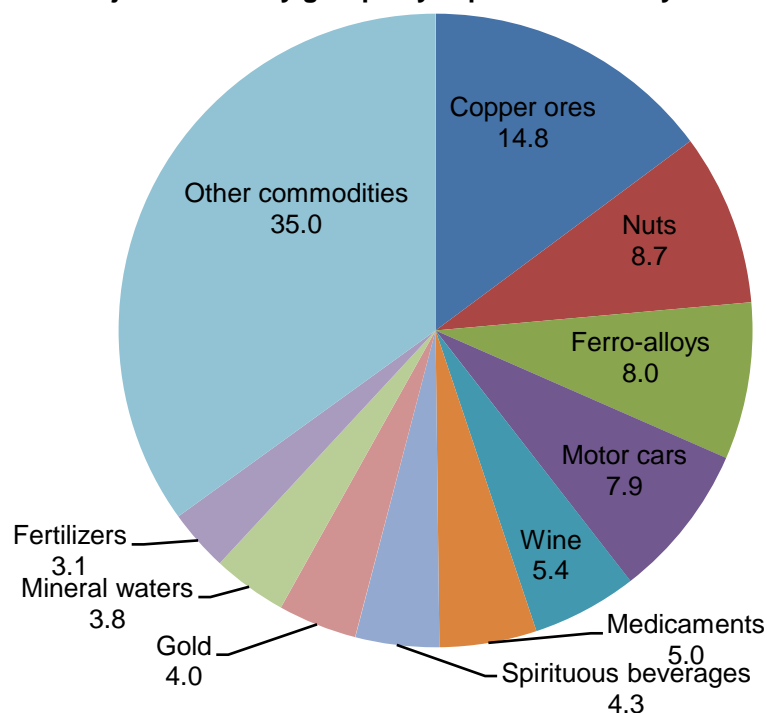
In January-November 2016 Copper ores and concentrates reclaimed the first place in the list of top export items, equaling USD 285 million, or 15 percent of total exports. Exports Nuts of totaled USD 168 million and its share in the total exports amounted to 9 percent. Ferro-alloys occupied the third place. Exports of this commodity group stood at USD 154 million and 8 percent of the total exports.

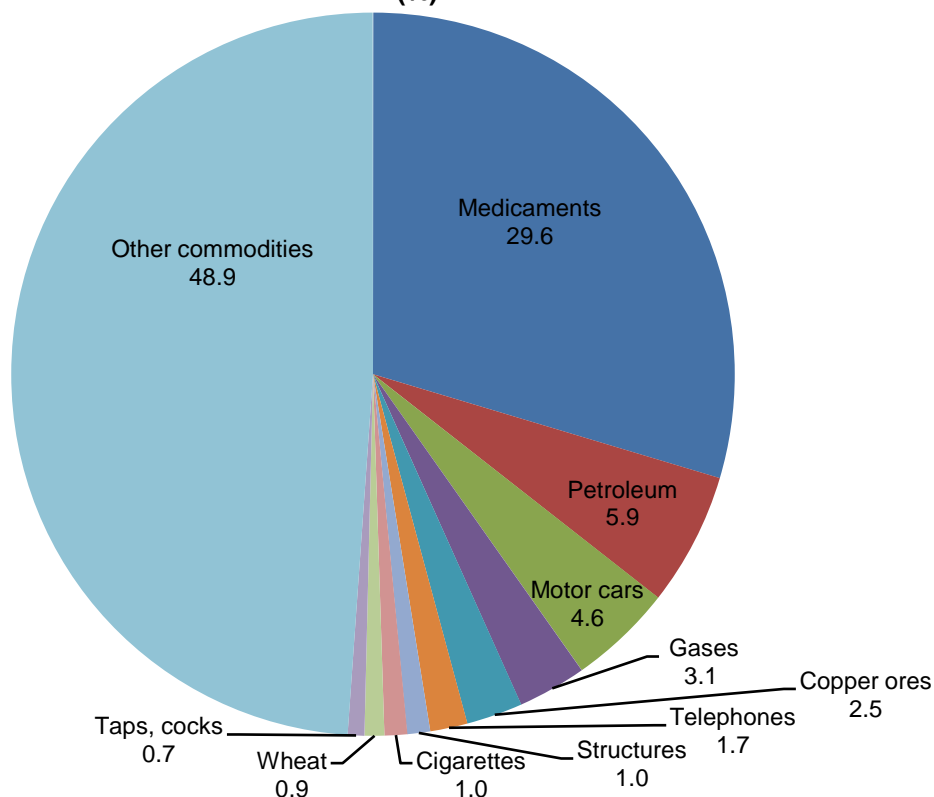
The top import commodity in January-November 2016 were Medicaments, imports of which amounted to USD 2641 million and 30 percent of the total imports from which USD 2398 million comes to the import of C hepatitis medicaments. Petroleum and petroleum oils commodity group followed in the list with USD 529 million, or 6 percent of imports. Motor cars came third with USD 414 million (5 percent of imports).

1. The discrepancy between the totals and the sum in some cases can be explained by using rounded data;
  2. Data for 2011-2015 are updated by the data of Special Customs Declarations;
  3. Information does not cover the data of Simplified Customs Declarations (Form №4);
  4. According to the international methodology, there are some difference in coverage of trade flows between external merchandise trade statistics and customs statistics. Diplomatic, temporary, transit and analogous goods are excluded from the database of external merchandise trade statistics.

**The preliminary data will be revised according to the Geostat's revision policy (based on the regular revision principle) as a result of adjusting data by respondents/administrative sources.**
