Gross Domestic Product of Georgia Second quarter of 2017


In Q2 2017 the real growth of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) amounted to 4.7 percent yearon-year, while the GDP deflator increased by 5.9 percent. The nominal GDP totaled GEL 9 066.1 million.



The largest shares of GDP by activity are held by Industry (16.7 percent) and Trade services (15.2 percent), followed by Agriculture, hunting and forestry, fishing (9.9 percent), Transport and communication services (9.8 percent), Construction (9.4 percent), Public administration (8.5 percent), Real estate, renting and business activities (6.6 percent), Health and social work (5.8 percent).

Real growth was registered in the following activities: Construction (16.4 percent), Hotels and restaurants (12.9 percent), Mining and Quarrying (7.4 percent), Real estate, renting and business activities (7.2 percent), Transport (7.0 percent), Financial Intermediation (6.4 percent), Communication (4.8 percent), Public administration (4.5 percent)

A decrease in the real value-added occurred in Agriculture, Hunting and Forestry; Fishing (-2.4 percent) and Electricity, Gas and Water Supply (-0.9 percent).

Note: The discrepancy between the totals and the sum in some cases can be explained by using rounded data.

Adjusted data will be published on November 15, 2017.

Information Note

Calculation of the quarterly Gross Domestic Product is based on a monthly and quarterly data. Therefore, there arises necessity to adjust the GDP taking into account annual data. Data from annual surveys usually differ from the quarterly data.

Before receiving annual data, the annually adjusted data from the previous year are used in quarterly calculations. For example, preliminary data for 2016 are used during the initial calculations of the GDP for the first and second quarter of 2017. In November 2017 data for the first and second quarters of 2017 will be corrected taking into consideration annually adjusted data for 2016 and changed data for quarters of 2016. Finally adjusted data for 2017 will be published by the end of November 2018, when the annual data for 2017 become available.
