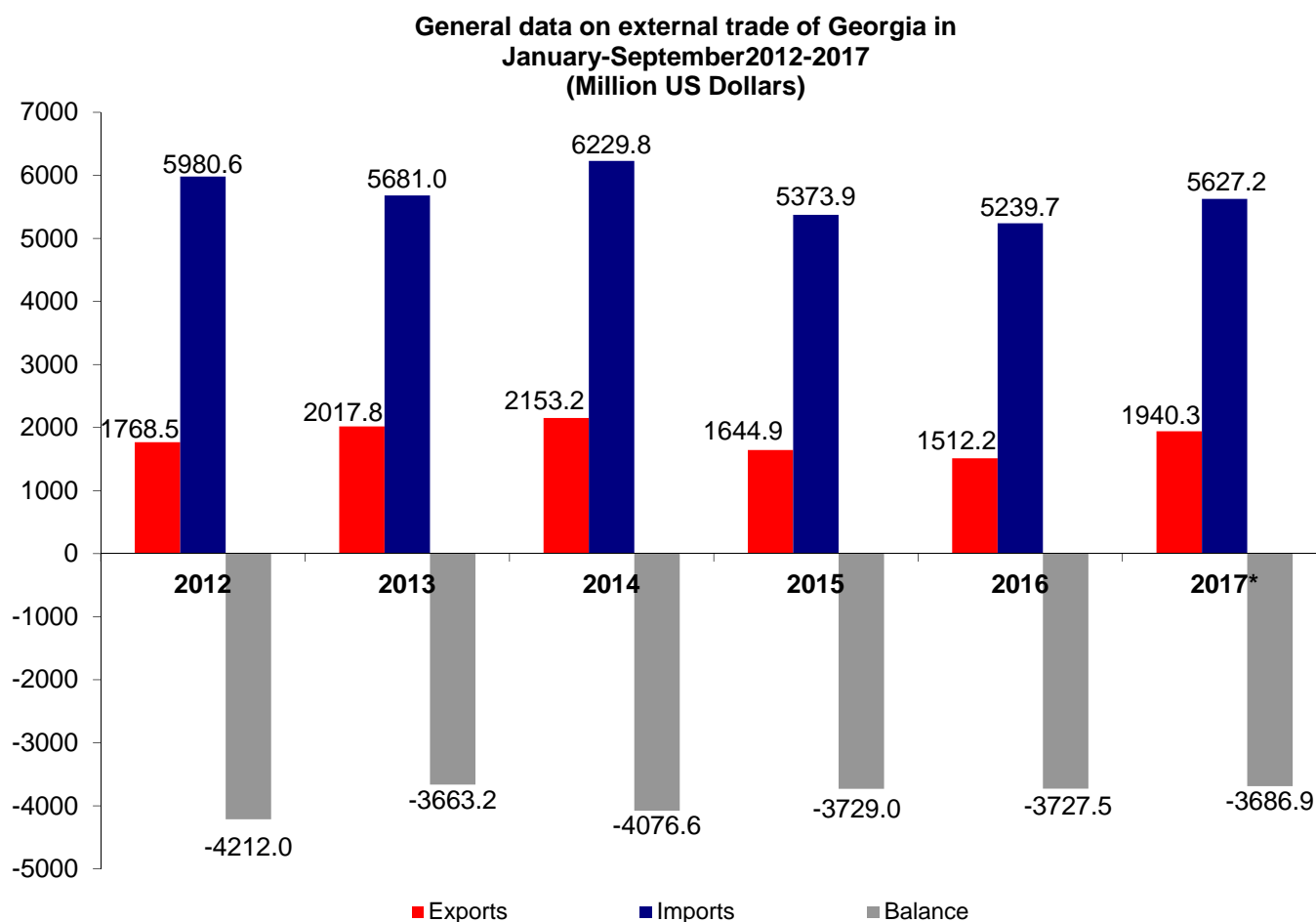
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## External Trade of Georgia in January- September 2017 (Preliminary)

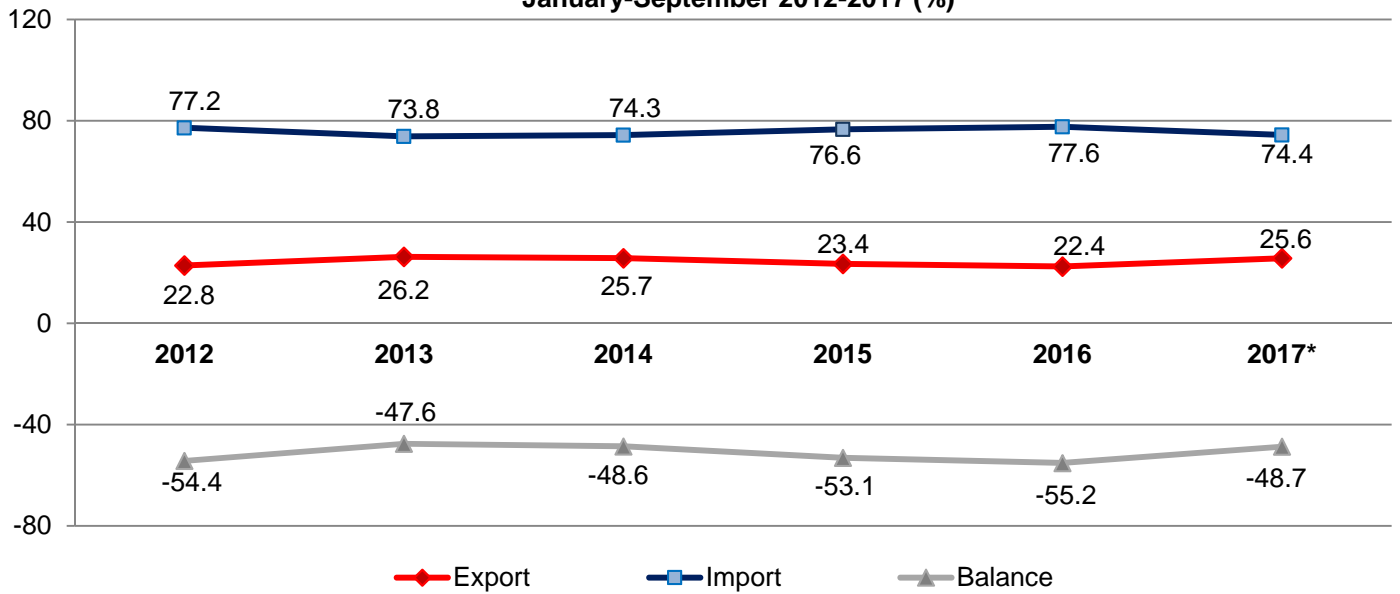
In January-September 2017 external merchandise trade (excluding non-declared trade) in Georgia amounted to USD 7567.5 million, 12.1 percent higher year-on-year. The exports equaled USD 1940.3 million (28.3 percent higher), while the imports stood at USD 5627.2 million (7.4 percent higher). The negative trade balance was USD 3686.9 million in January-September 2017 and its share in external trade turnover constituted 48.7 percent. Export excluding re-export amounted to USD 1515.3 million, 26.7 percent higher year-on-year.

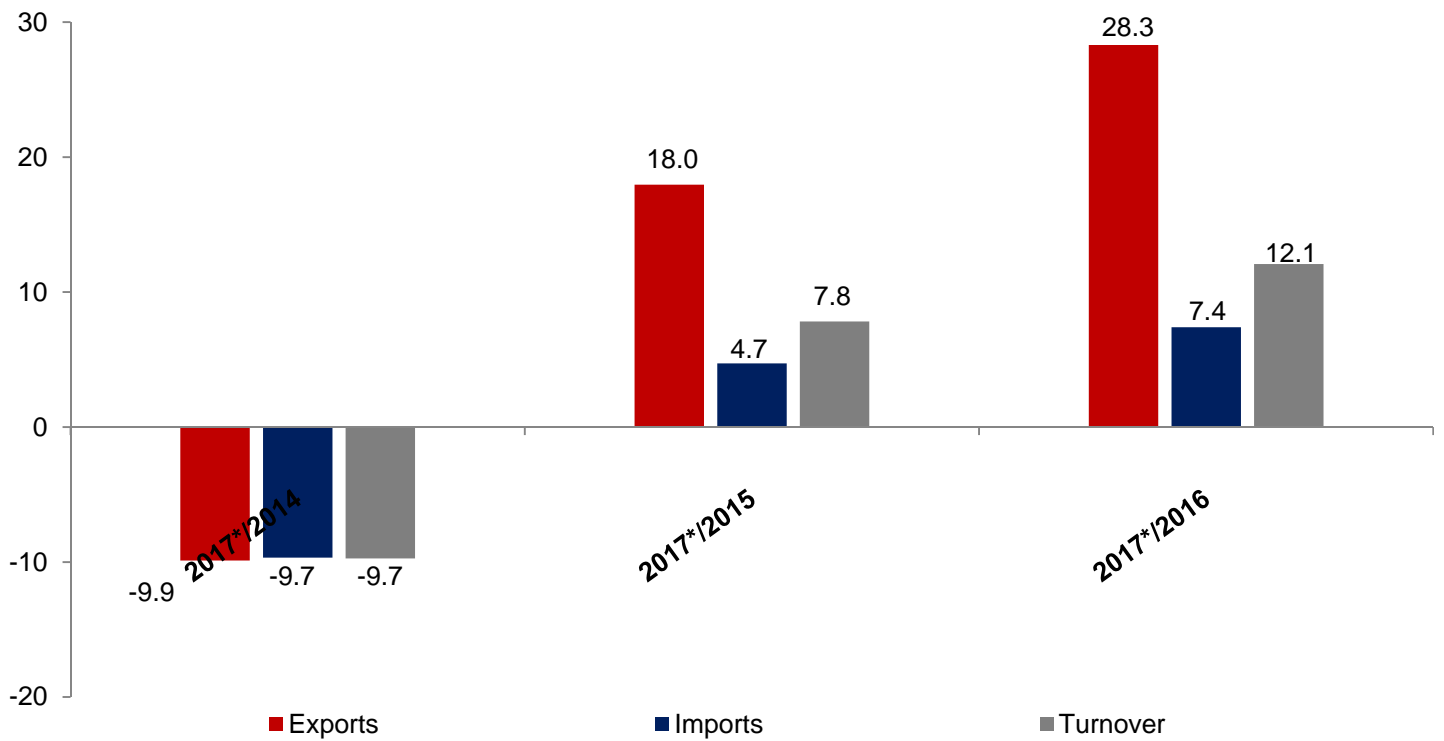

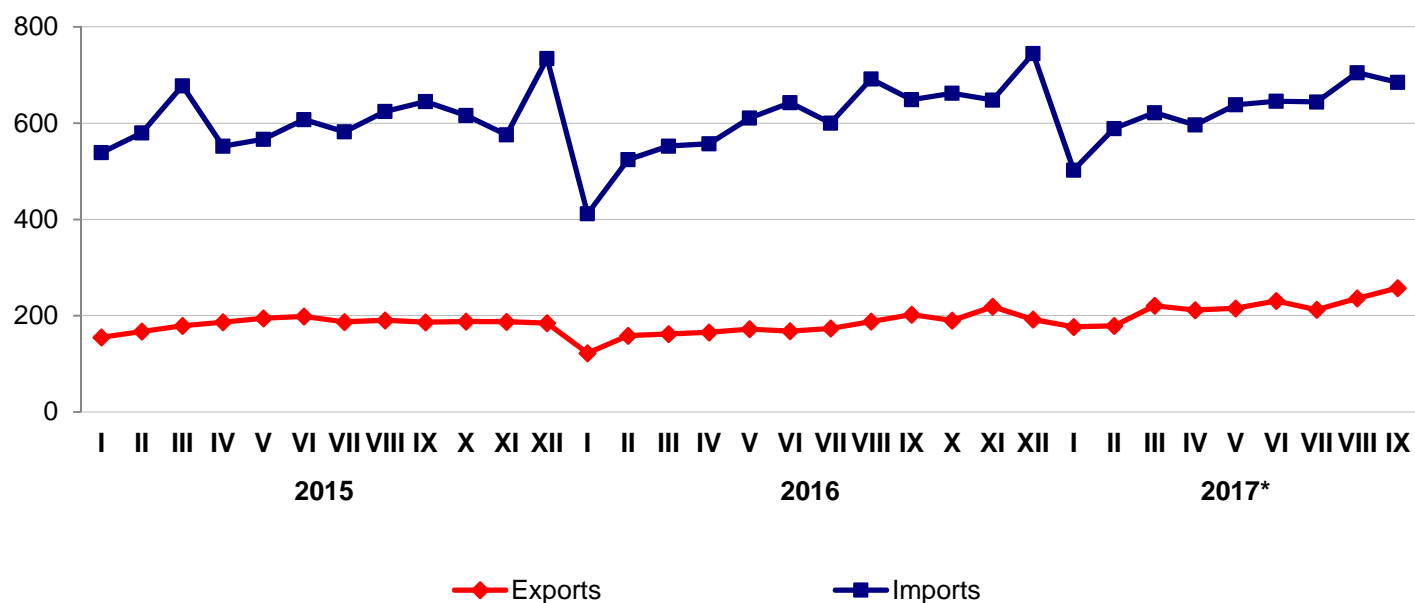

(Million US Dollars)



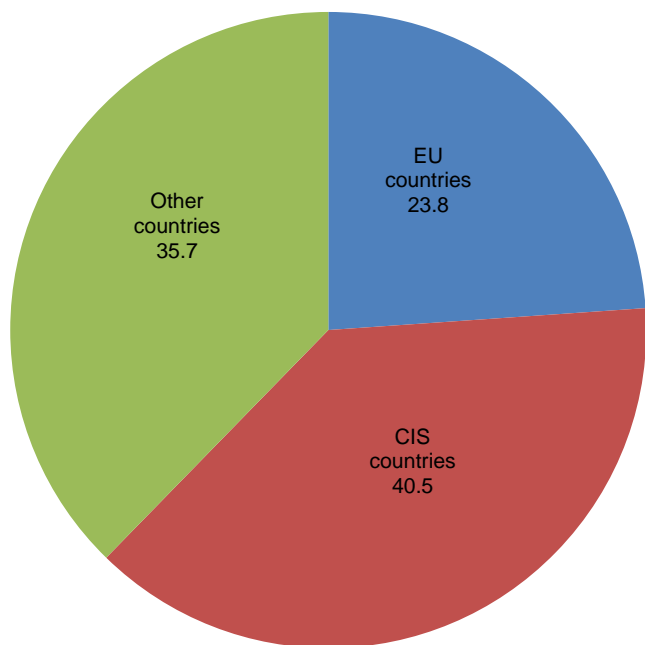

In January-September 2017 the external trade turnover of Georgia with the EU countries amounted to USD 2064.9 million, grew by 5.6 percent compared to the corresponding indicator of the previous year. Exports amounted to USD 462.4 million (18.9 percent higher), while imports amounted to USD 1602.6 million (2.3 percent higher). The share of these countries in the external trade turnover of Georgia amounted to 27.3 percent, 23.8 percent in exports and 28.5 percent in imports (in January-September 2016 29.0, 25.7 and 29.9 percent correspondingly). 30.9 percent of the trade deficit came to the EU countries (31.6 percent in January-September 2016).

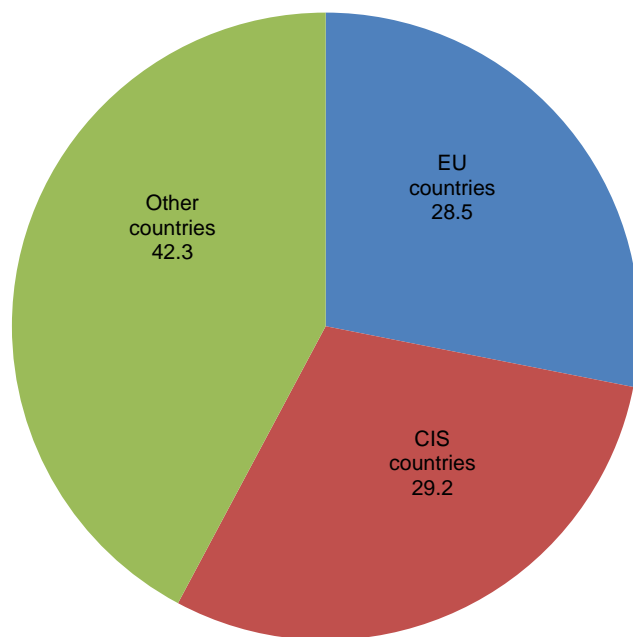
In January-September 2017 the external trade turnover of Georgia with the CIS countries totaled USD 2428.2 million (higher by 31.2 percent compared to January-September 2016). Exports stood at USD 785.4 million (59.0 percent higher), while imports equaled USD 1642.8 million (21.0 percent higher). The share of the CIS countries in the external trade turnover of Georgia constituted 32.1 percent, 40.5 percent in exports and 29.2 percent in imports (In January-September 2016 27.4, 32.7 and 25.9 percent, respectively). In January-September 2017 compared to the corresponding period of the previous year, CIS countries accounted for 23.3 percent of the overall trade deficit (23.2 percent in January-September 2016).

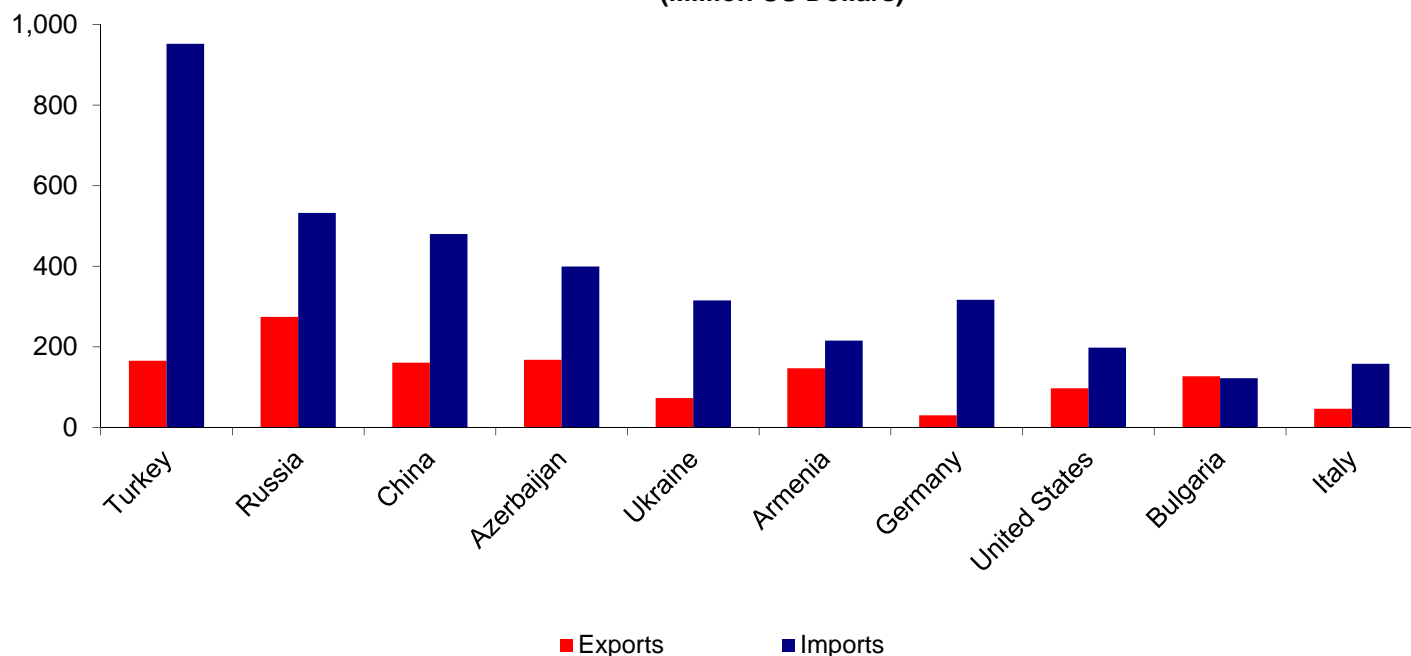
In January-September 2017 share of the top ten trading partners in the total external trade turnover of Georgia amounted to 65.7 percent. The top trading partners were Turkey (USD 1117.7 million), Russia (USD 806.3 million) and China (USD 640.6 million).

(Million US Dollars)



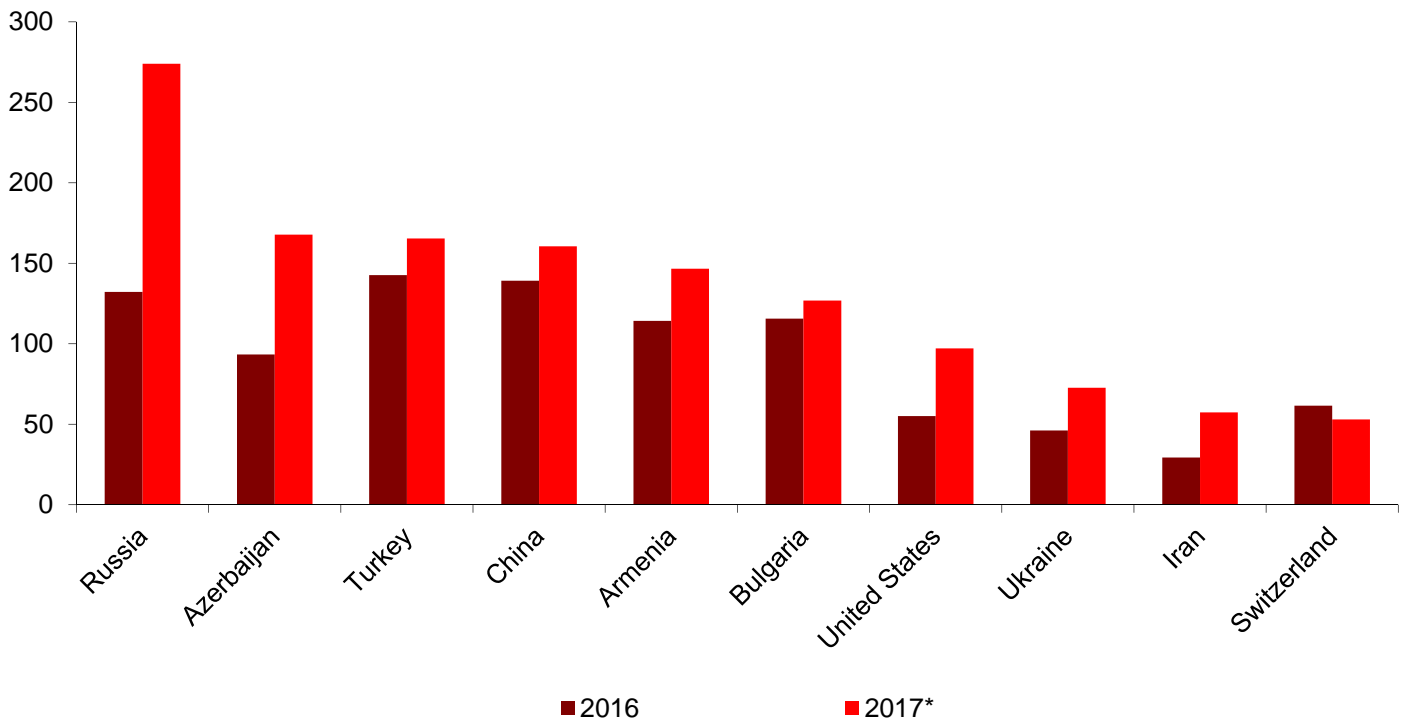

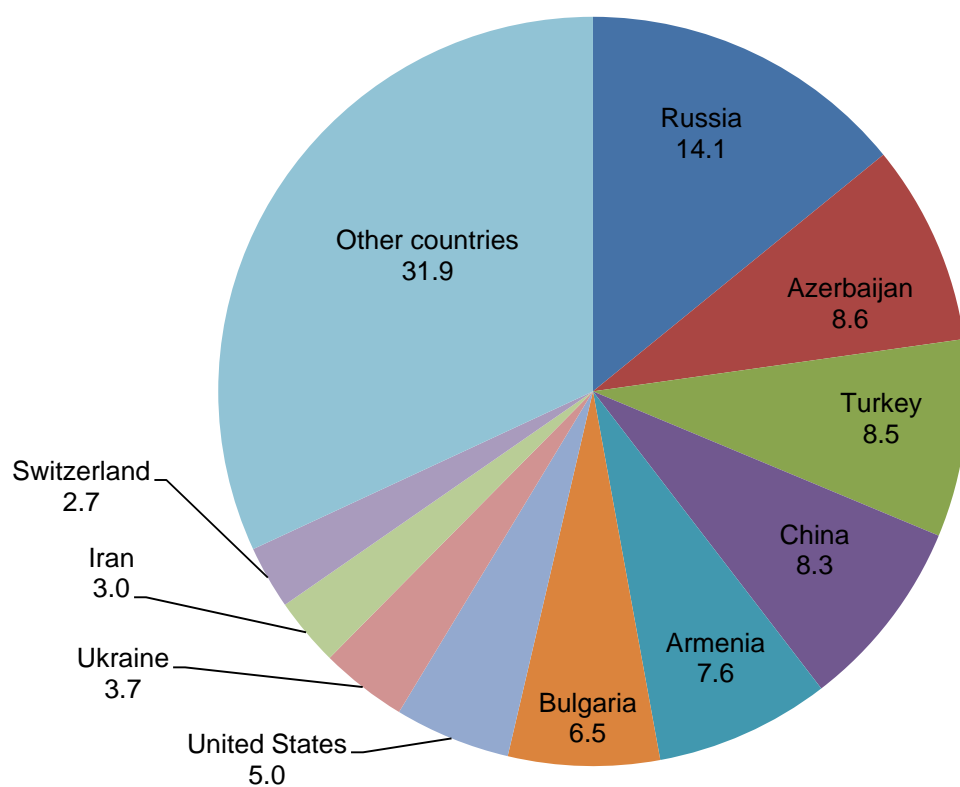

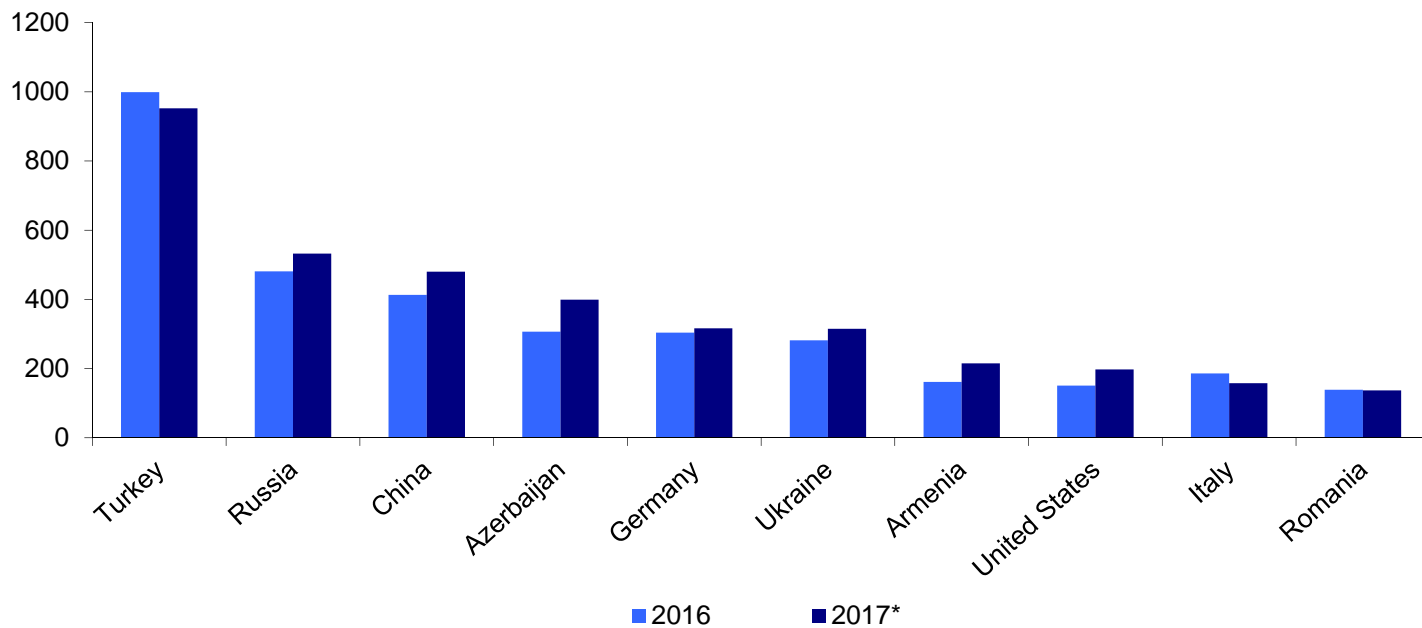

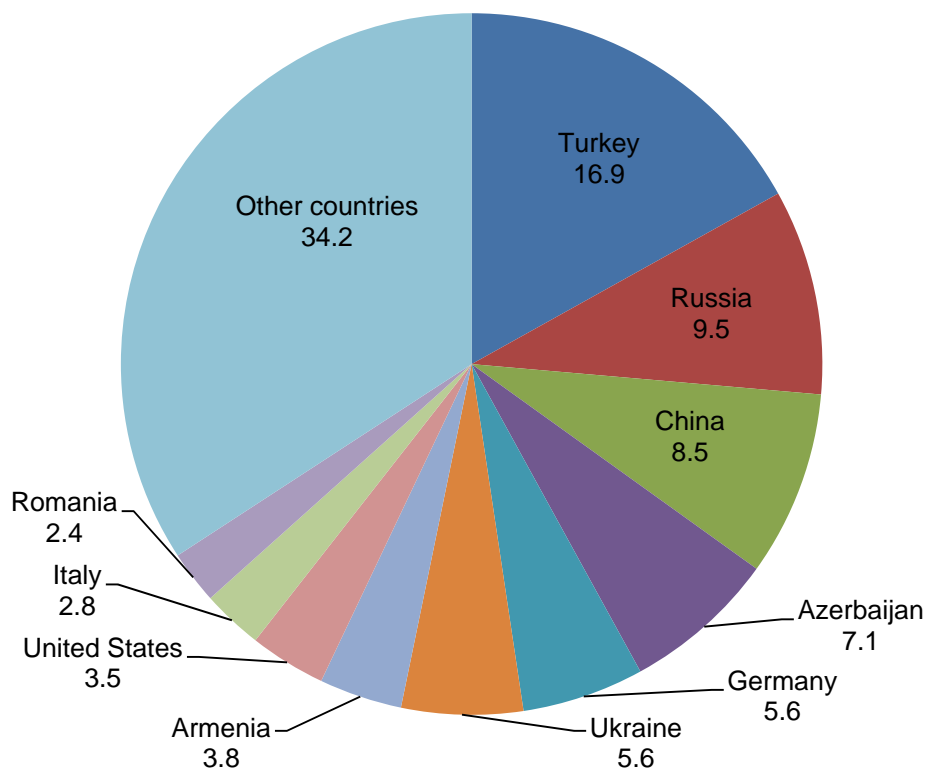


**Top trading partners by imports in January-September 2016-2017

## Major commodity groups by exports and imports

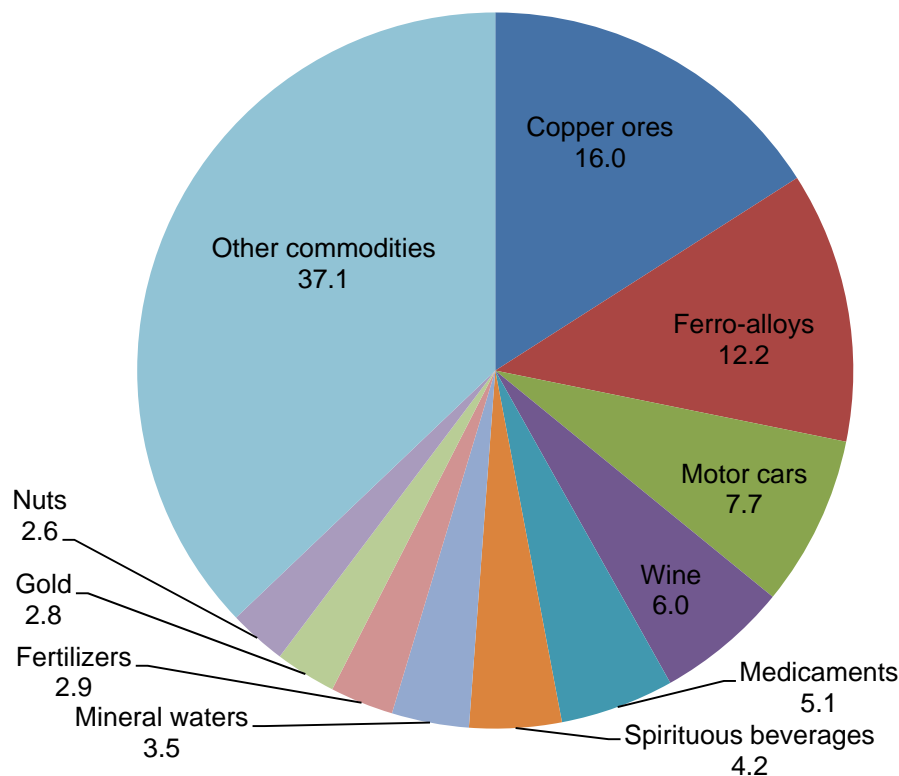
In January-September 2017 Copper ores and concentrates reclaimed the first place in the list of top export items, equaling USD 309.7 million, or 16.0 percent of total exports. Exports Ferro-alloys totaled USD 237.2 million and its share in the total exports amounted to 12.2 percent. Motor cars occupied the third place. Exports of this commodity group stood at USD 149.4 million and 7.7 percent of the total exports.

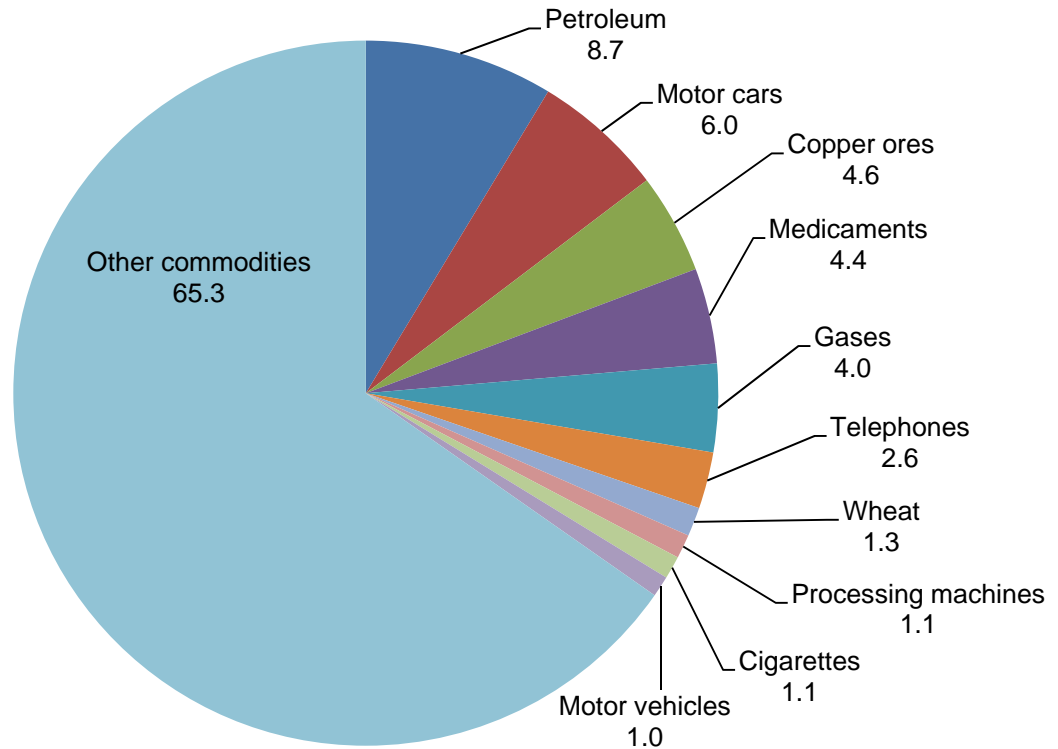
The top import commodity In January-September 2017 were, Petroleum and petroleum oils imports of which amounted to USD 487.0 million and 8.7 percent of the total imports. Motor cars commodity group followed in the list with USD 338.8 million, or 6.0 percent of imports. Copper ores and concentrates came third with USD 258.9 million (4.6 percent of imports).
