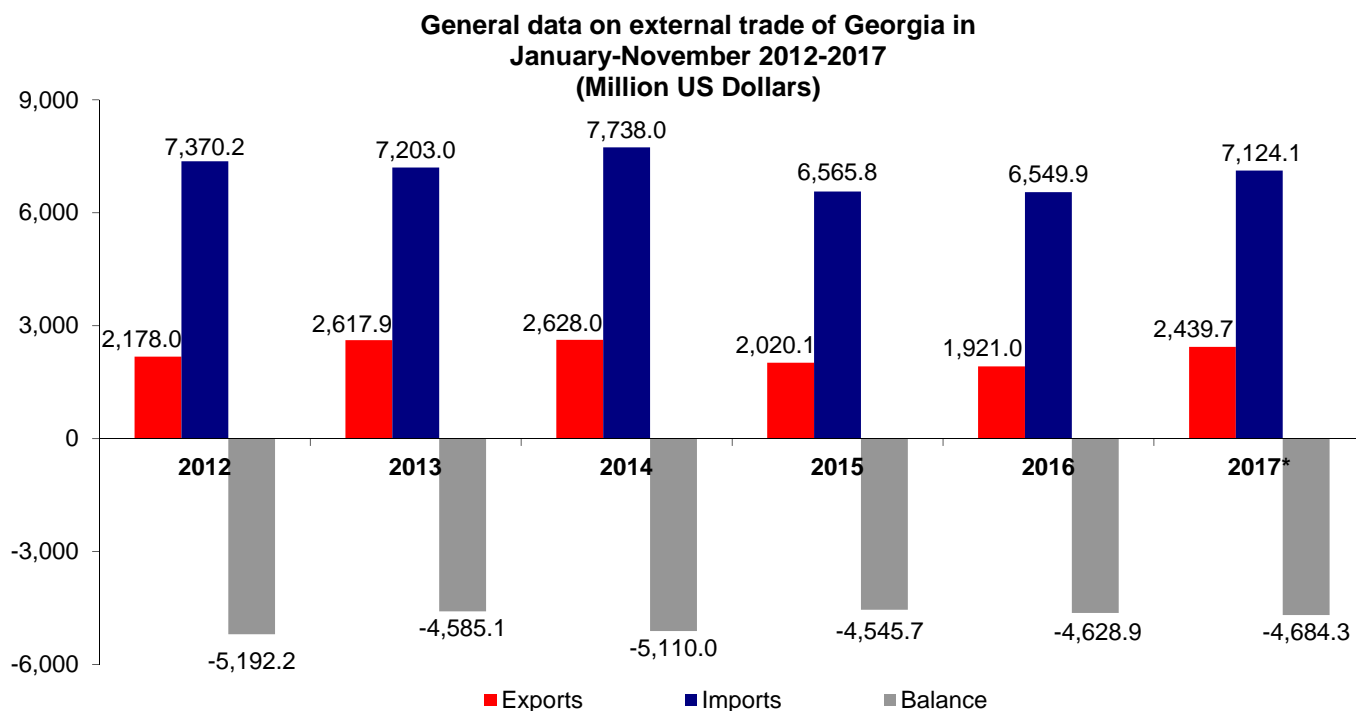
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## External Trade of Georgia in January-November 2017 (Preliminary)

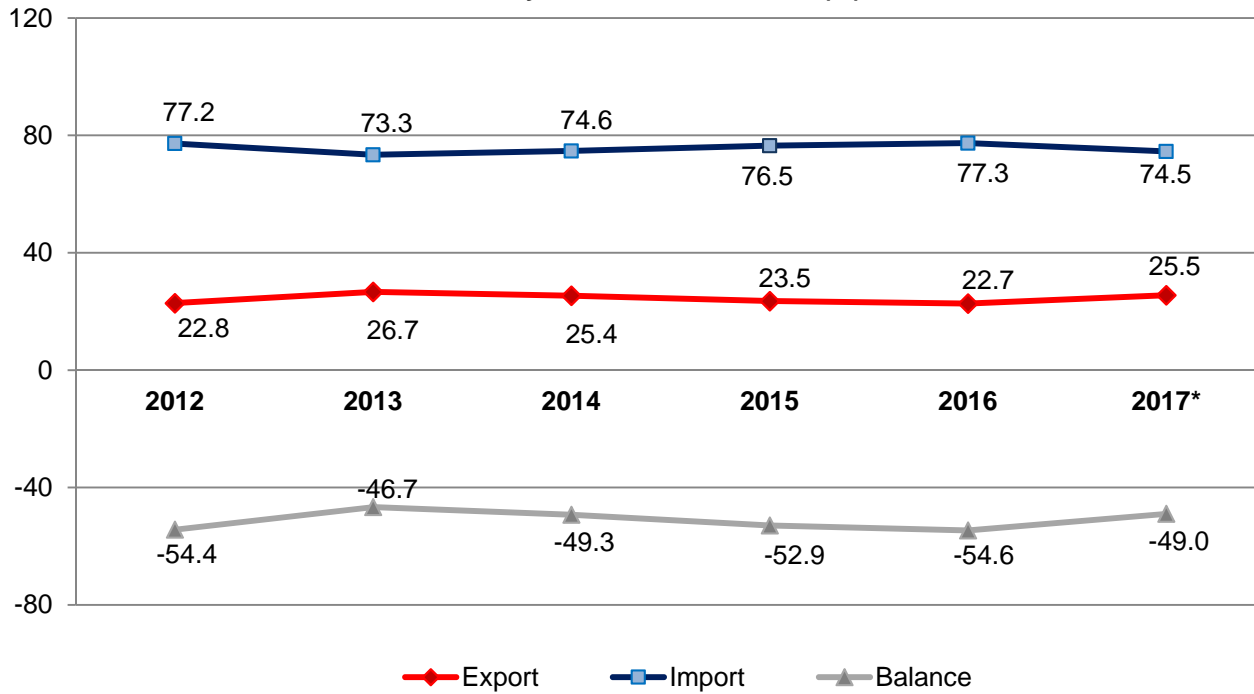
In January-November 2017 external merchandise trade (excluding non-declared trade) in Georgia amounted to USD 9563.8 million, 12.9 percent higher year-on-year. The exports equaled USD 2439.7 million (27.0 percent higher), while the imports stood at USD 7124.1 million (8.8 percent higher). The negative trade balance was USD 4684.3 million in January-November 2017 and its share in external trade turnover constituted 49.0 percent. Export excluding re-export amounted to USD 1871.1 million, 24.2 percent higher year-on-year.

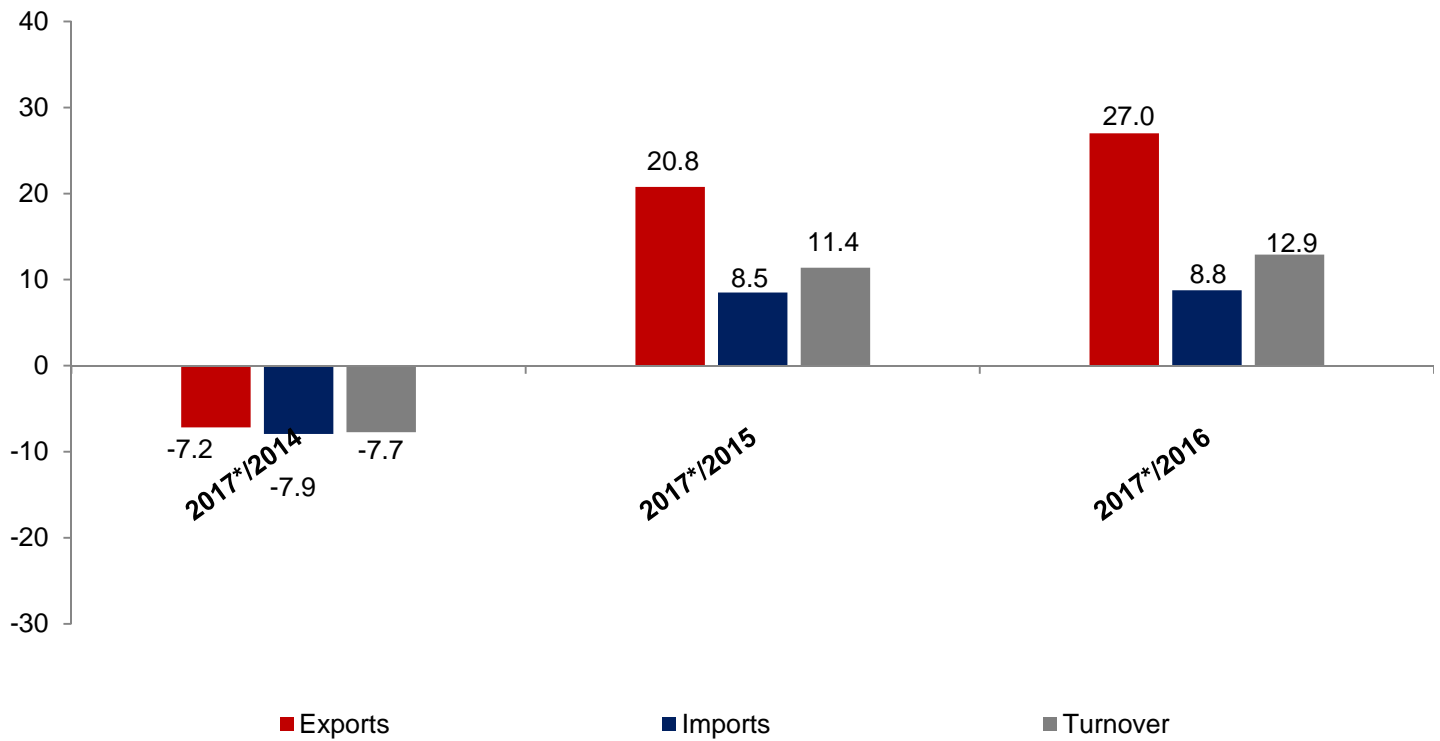

**Percentage changes in January-November 2017 compared to the same period of the previous years (%)**



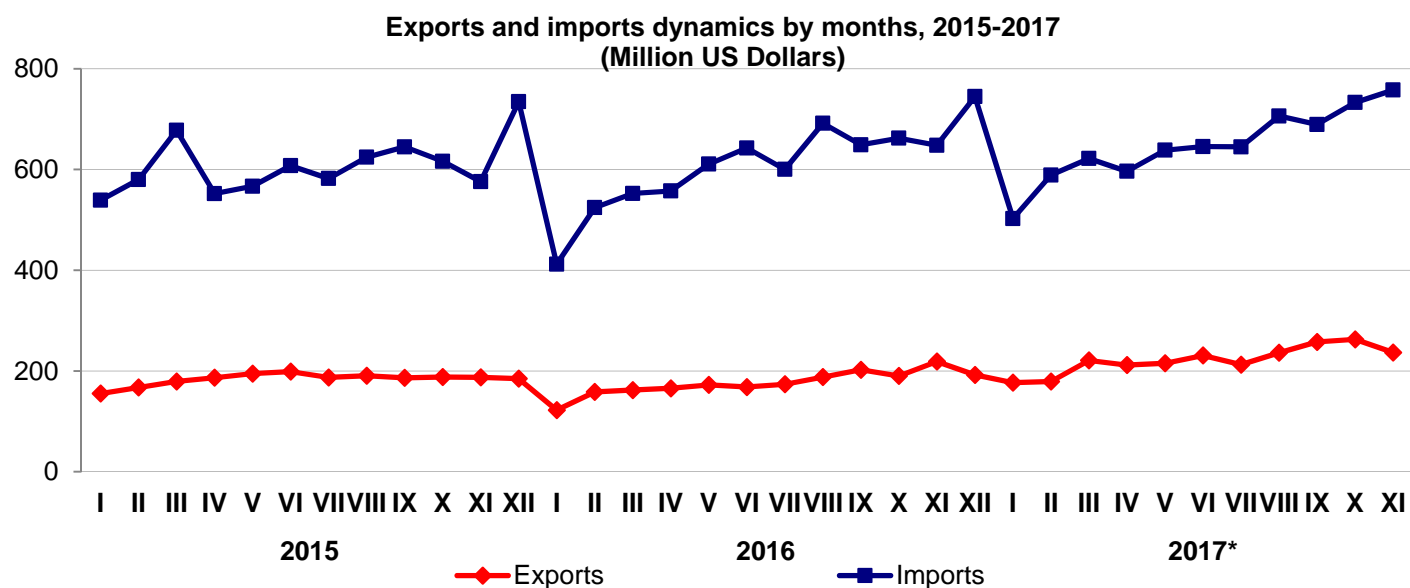

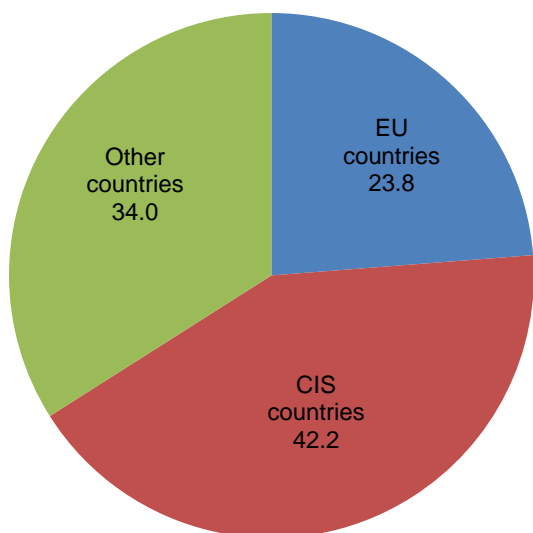

In January-November 2017 the external trade turnover of Georgia with the EU countries amounted to USD 2565.8 million, grew by 3.0 percent compared to the corresponding indicator of the previous year. Exports amounted to USD 579.8 million (12.8 percent higher), while imports amounted to USD 1986.1 million (0.5 percent higher). The share of these countries in the external trade turnover of Georgia amounted to 26.8 percent, 23.8 percent in exports and 27.9 percent in imports (in January-November 2016 29.4, 26.8 and 30.2 percent correspondingly). 30.0 percent of the trade deficit came to the EU countries (31.6 percent in January-November 2016).

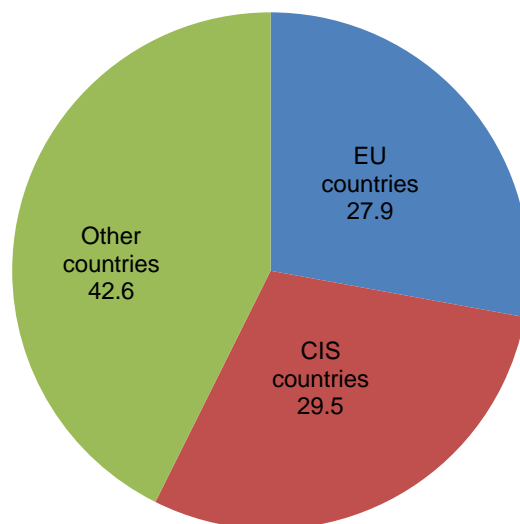
In January-November 2017 the external trade turnover of Georgia with the CIS countries totaled USD 3130.6 million (higher by 30.6 percent compared to January-November 2016). Exports stood at USD 1030.6 million (56.5 percent higher), while imports equaled USD 2100.0 million (20.8 percent higher). The share of the CIS countries in the external trade turnover of Georgia constituted 32.7 percent, 42.2 percent in exports and 29.5 percent in imports (In January-November 2016 28.3, 34.3 and 26.5 percent, respectively). In January-November 2017 compared to the corresponding period of the previous year, CIS countries accounted for 22.8 percent of the overall trade deficit (23.3 percent in January-November 2016).

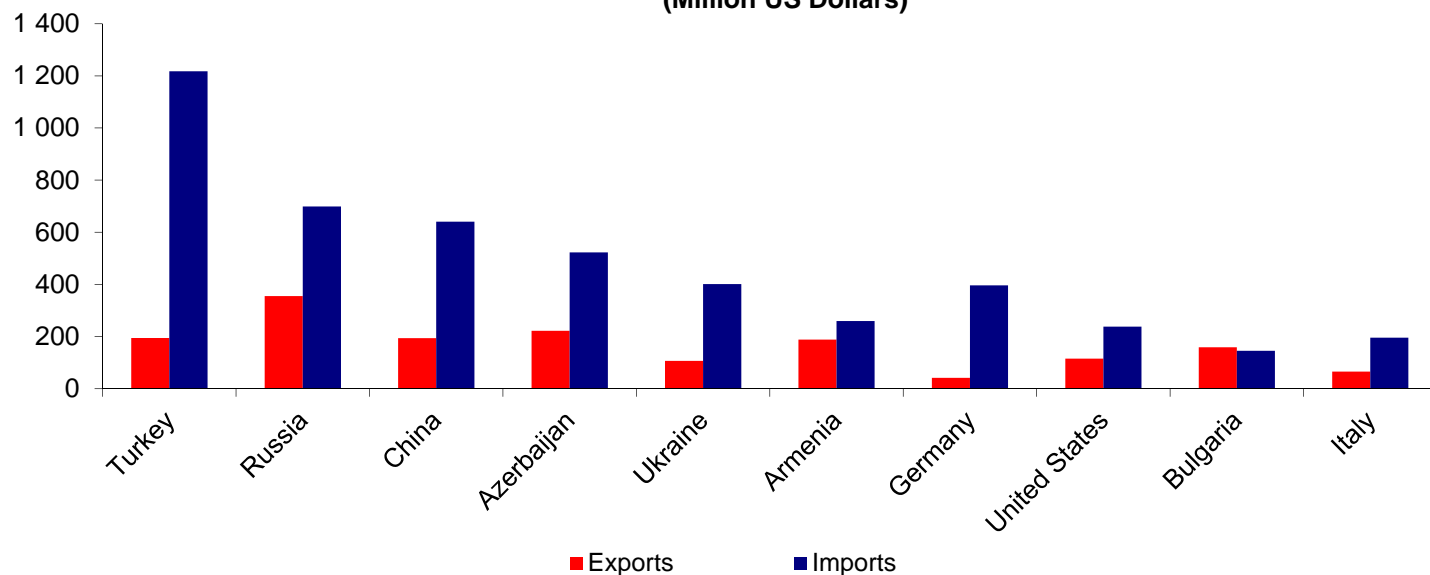
In January-November 2017 share of the top ten trading partners in the total external trade turnover of Georgia amounted to 66.5 percent. The top trading partners were Turkey (USD 1412.0 million), Russia (USD 1054.6 million) and China (USD 834.3 million).

(Million US Dollars)



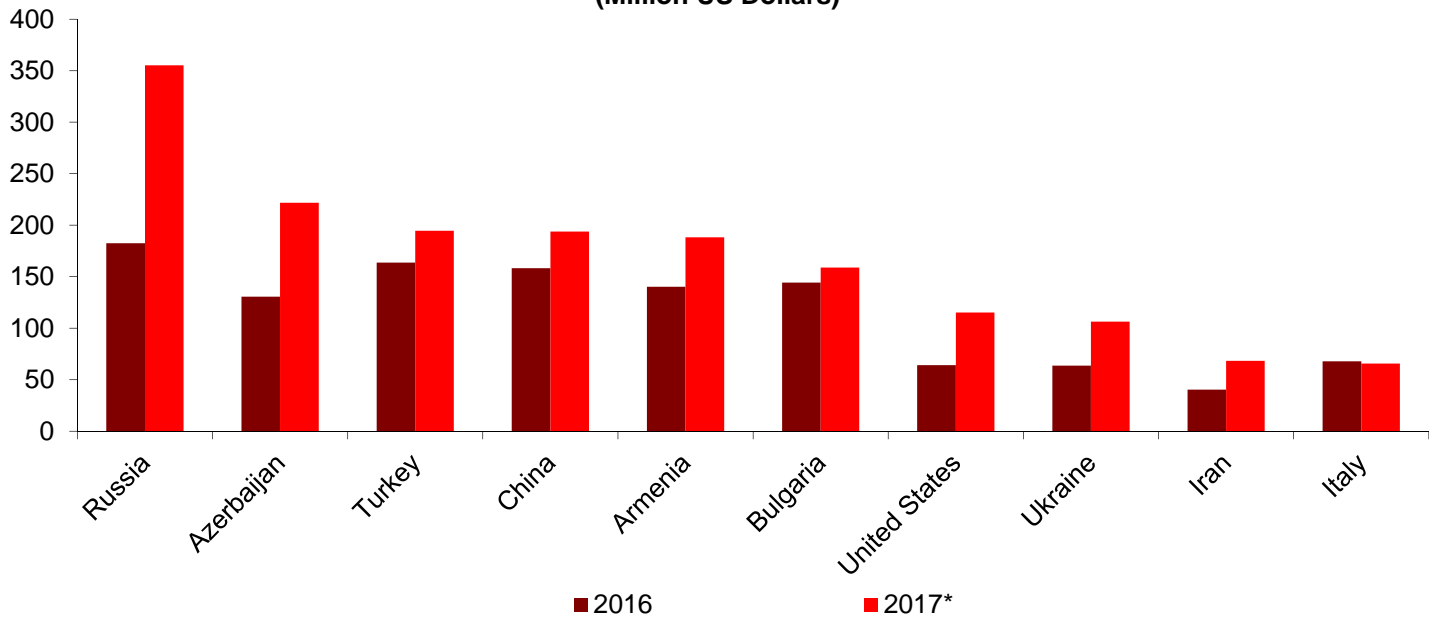

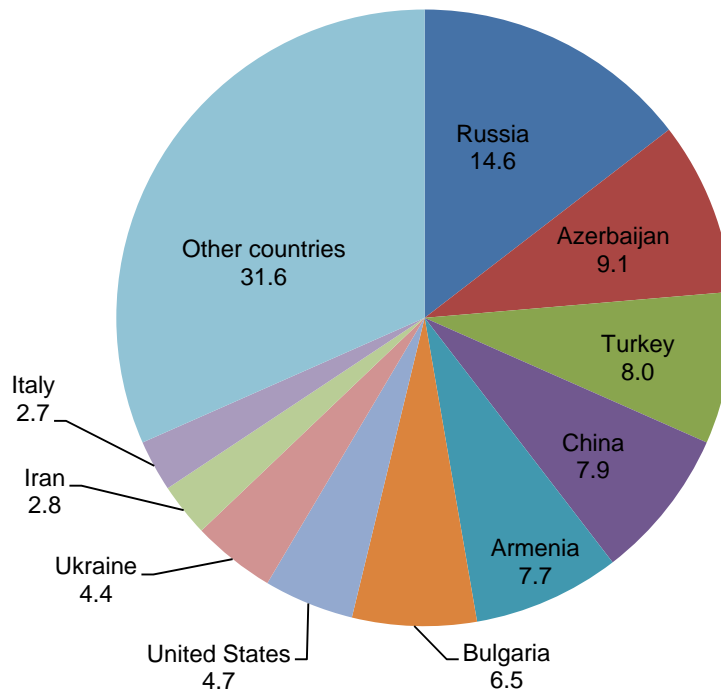

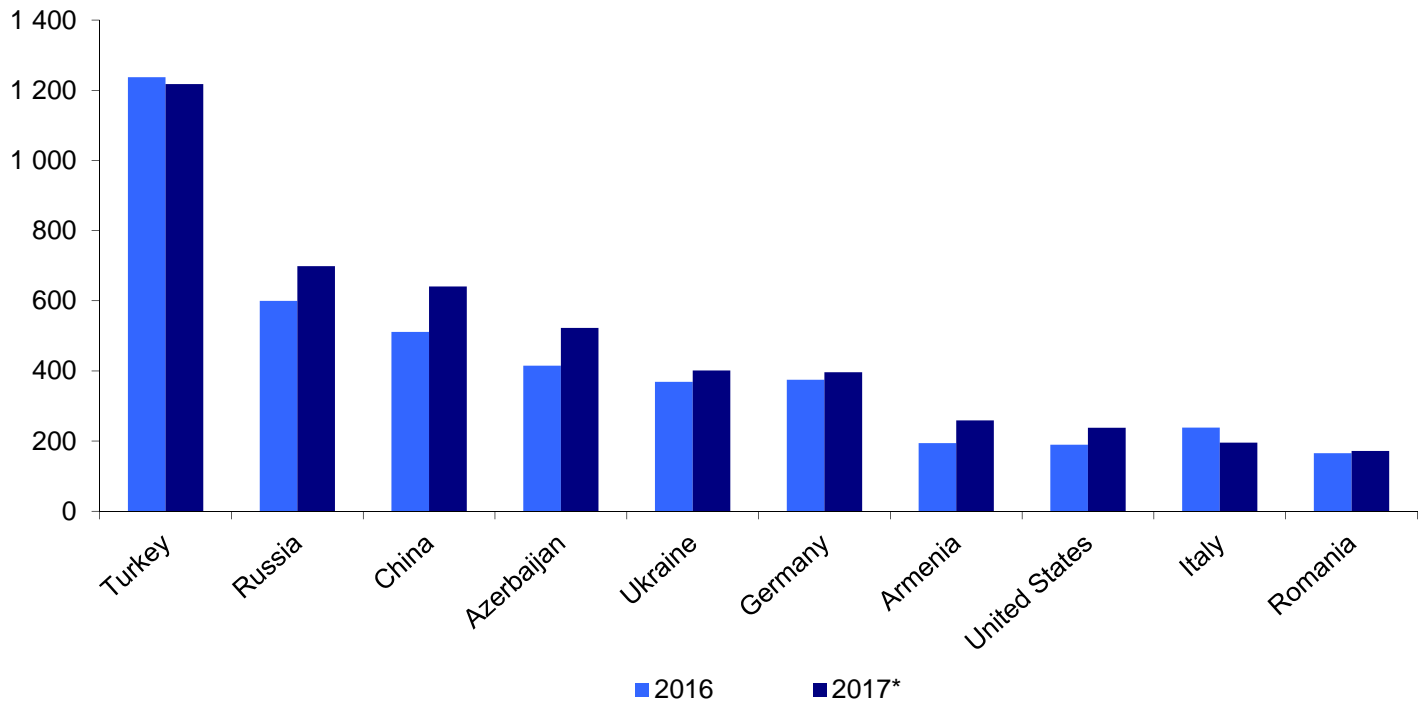

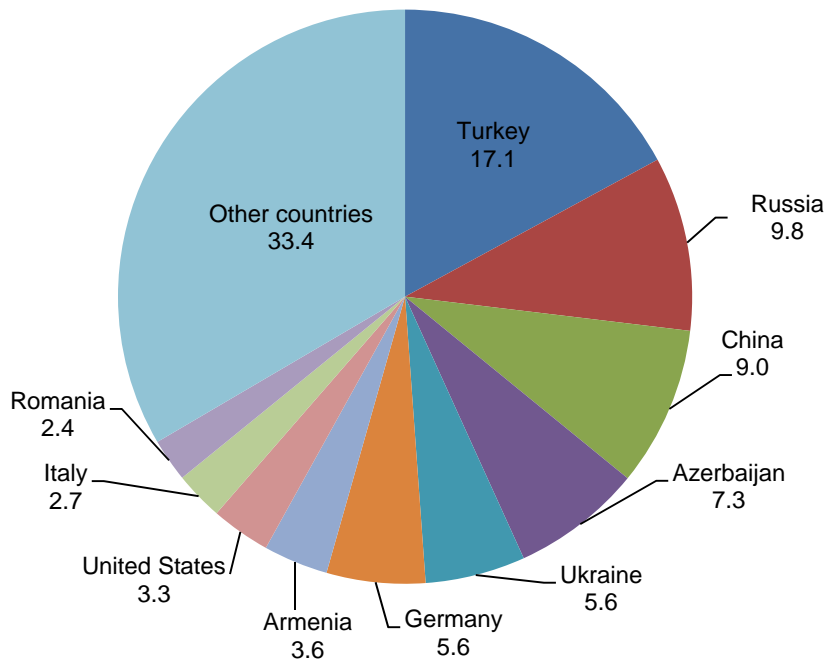


**Top trading partners by imports in January-November 2016-2017

## Major commodity groups by exports and imports

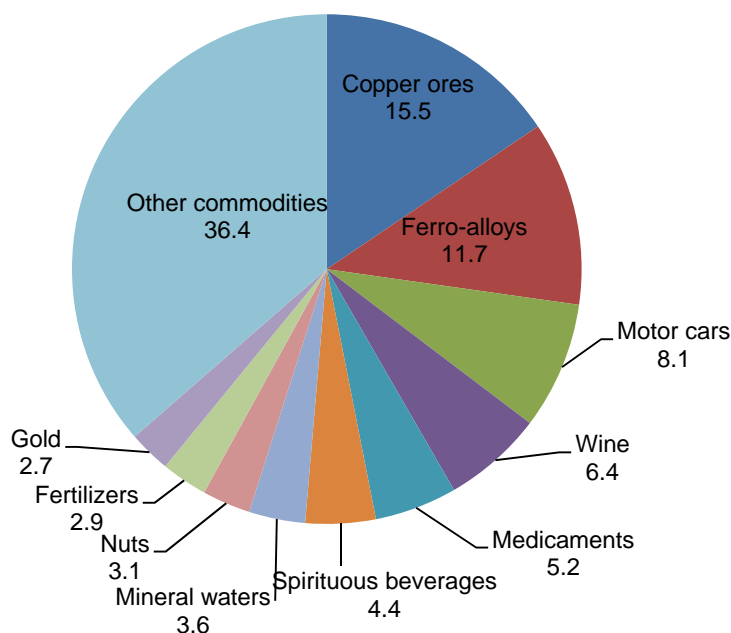
In January-November 2017 Copper ores and concentrates reclaimed the first place in the list of top export items, equaling USD 379.1 million, or 15.5 percent of total exports. Exports Ferro-alloys totaled USD 285.4 million and its share in the total exports amounted to 11.7 percent. Motor cars occupied the third place. Exports of this commodity group stood at USD 197.1 million and 8.1 percent of the total exports.

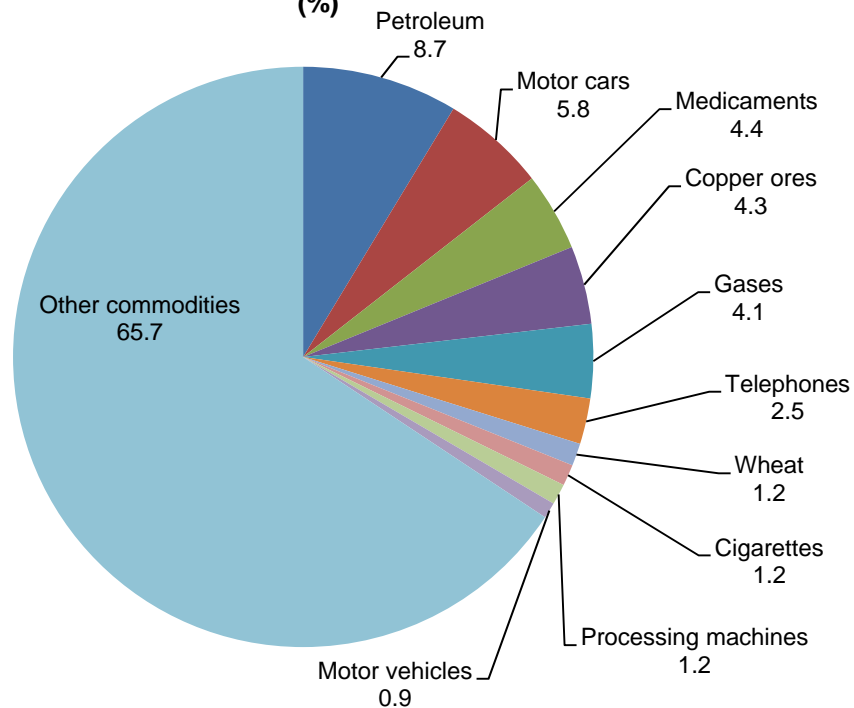
The top import commodity In January-November 2017 were Petroleum and petroleum oils imports of which amounted to USD 617.3 million and 8.7 percent of the total imports. Motor cars commodity group followed in the list with USD 412.7 million, or 5.8 percent of imports. Medicaments came third with USD 310.9 million (4.4 percent of imports).
