Gross Domestic Product of Georgia Third quarter of 2017


In Q3 2017 the real growth of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) amounted to 4.4 percent year-on-year, while the GDP deflator increased by 6.6 percent. The nominal GDP totaled GEL 9 941.6 million.



Real growth was registered in the following activities: Hotels and restaurants (12.6 percent), Mining and Quarrying (10.6 percent), Construction (9.3 percent), Trade (9.3 percent), Financial Intermediation (7.2 percent), Real estate, renting and business activities (6.3 percent), Public administration (5.1 percent), Electricity, Gas and Water Supply (5.0 percent), Communication (4.9 percent).

A decrease in the real value-added occurred in Agriculture, Hunting and Forestry; Fishing (-2.8 percent).

Adjusted data will be published by November 15, 2018.

The largest shares of GDP by activity are held by Trade services (18.7 percent) and Industry (17.0 percent), followed by Transport and communication services (10.7 percent), Construction (10.2 percent), Agriculture, hunting and forestry, fishing (8.6 percent), Real estate, renting and business activities (7.1 percent), Public administration (6.8 percent), Health and social work (5.6 percent).

Information Note

Calculation of the quarterly Gross Domestic Product is based on a monthly and quarterly data.

Therefore, there arises necessity to adjust the GDP taking into account annual data. Data from annual

surveys usually differ from the quarterly data.

Before receiving annual data, the annually adjusted data from the previous year are

used in quarterly calculations. For example, preliminary data for 2016 were used during the

initial calculations of the GDP for the first and the second quarter of 2017. In November 2017

data for the first and the second quarters of 2017 were corrected taking into consideration

annually adjusted data for 2016 and changed data for quarters of 2016. Finally adjusted data

for 2017 will be published by the end of November 2018, when the annual data for 2017

become available.
