





Percent distribution of household population by age group and sex



Percent distribution of women and men age 15-49 by background characteristics Data for Men's Marital/Union status "Separated" are based on 25-49 unweighted cases


#### Children's living arrangements\*






Percent of households by selected characteristics

### **Key Messages**

- The questionnaires of households, children aged 5-17 and children under 5 are 89% or more.
- 1578 child's blood was extracted for lead test, which is almost 60 percent of eligible amount.
- response rates for the 3% of children under 17 years live The 96% of children under 17 with neither of the biological parents.
  - Nearly one third of households (32%) is headed by a female.
  - The average family size is 3.4. One third of the population (34%) lives in Tbilisi.
- years has health insurance.
- More than 93% of population aged 15-49 has health insurance.
