

By the end of 2019, Ministry of Justice has launched the new version of criminal case management system (Crimcase-2), which was adopted by investigative entities gradually, based on a pre-agreed schedule. Since the integration of the new system is on-going, till its fully implemented, processing of statistics is underway in a pilot regime and is being tested. Current statistics are derived using both modules (Crimcase-1 and Crimcase-2).

<sup>1</sup> It should be taken into consideration, that the sum of prosecution initiation indicators counted in relation to the relevant articles of the Criminal Code often exceeds prosecution initiation overall indicator, which is due to the fact, that the prosecution initiation indicator is concerned with respect to each article when there is a combination of crimes (e.g., a person committed two or more crimes). Additionally, from the software standpoint, it is also perceived as the beginning of prosecution if charges already filed against the accused are specified (procedurally it means that a new resolution on “charges against a person” needs to be issued by the prosecutor), which naturally increases overall indicator.
