3. Statistical presentation

3.1. Data description

General education statistics are conducted by the Ministry of Education and Science of Georgia which ensures the collection, processing and submission of relevant data for dissemination to the Geostat.

Departmental statistics are conducted by LEPL Education Management Information System. Geostat coordinates the production of general education statistics in Georgia. The received data is placed in databases, on the website in the form of tables and graphs, on the gender statistics portal and in yearbooks.

3.2. Classification system

3.3. Sector coverage

The survey covers all general education institutions, both public and private.

- Distribution of general education schools by region and school type;
- Distribution of general education school pupils by region and school type;
- Pupils in general education schools by grade and school status;
- Pupils in general education schools by grade and age;
- Distribution of teachers in general education schools by municipalities, school status and gender;
- Distribution of administrative staff in general education schools by region, district, school status and gender;
- Distribution of support staff in general education schools by region, district, school status and gender.

3.4. Statistical concepts and definitions

General education – Education with the aim of educating and training the citizens of Georgia for professional and public life following general education. A complete general education in Georgia comprises 12 years of schooling. A general education institution/ school - A legal entity under public law or an entrepreneurial or non-entrepreneurial (non-commercial) legal entity under private law, authorised in the manner prescribed by the Minister of Education and Science of Georgia that carries out general educational activities under the National Curriculum and completely covers at least one level of general education.

A private school – A general education institution established as a legal entity under private law.

A class – A group of pupils of a general education institution who meet on a temporary basis for at least one academic year in accordance with the recommendations of the National Curriculum and the statute of the educational institution, and study the general educational programmes of any of the levels of general education mainly together.

A teacher – A person with professional knowledge, skills and appropriate qualifications determined by the Professional Standards for Teachers who teaches at least one subject at a general education institution.

A pupil – A person enrolled in a general education institution as provided for by the legislation of Georgia.

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7. Confidentiality

7.1. Confidentiality – policy

- 1. The Law of Georgia on Official Statistics:
 - According to the article 4 of the law individual data collected by statistical agencies for statistical compilation, whether they refer to natural or legal persons, are to be strictly confidential and used exclusively for statistical purposes.
 - According to the article 28 (Observing Confidentiality of Statistical Data) of the law 1. The data collected for the purpose of producing official statistics shall be confidential if it allows for identification of observation unit or r it is possible to identify such data through it. 2. The confidential statistical data shall not be issued or disseminated or used for a non-statistical purpose but for the exceptions envisaged by the Georgian legislation.
 - 3. When producing the official statistics, it is obligatory to destroy or store separately the identity data including the questionnaires containing such data and used for statistical surveys according to the rules defined in the Georgian legislation.
 - According to the article 29 (The Obligations and Responsibilities of the Employees of the Geostat) of the law the confidential statistical data collected and processed for the purpose of statistical survey shall not be used or disseminated by the employees of the units of the Geostat.

These documents ensure the standardization of statistical processes and products and the establishment of a unified quality assurance system.
