

SURVEY RESULTS FOR LIVESTOCK SLAUGHTERHOUSES, ELEVATORS AND COLD STORAGE FACILITIES (II QUARTER, 2022)

(SLAUGHTERHOUSES)

The total number of active livestock and poultry slaughterhouses in Georgia in the II quarter of 2022 were 123, of which 17.9 percent were located in Kvemo Kartli region, 16.3 percent in Kakheti region, 16.3 percent in Shida Kartli region, 13.8 percent in Imereti region, 10.6 percent in Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region and remained 25.2 percent in other regions:

According to the survey, 94.7 thousand head of livestock were slaughtered in slaughterhouses in the II quarter of 2022, of which 44.0 percent were cattle, 39.6 percent - pigs and 8.9 percent - sheep and goats. The share of other livestock (excluding poultry) slaughtered is 7.6 percent. In addition, the number of poultry slaughtered in slaughterhouses during the reporting period amounted to 3 057.1 thousand.

In total 12.9 thousand tons of meet (i.e. slaughtered weight, including poultry meat) was produced by slaughterhouses during the II quarter of 2022, of which 38.4 percent is beef, 41.1 percent – poultry, 19.4 percent – pork, 1.0 percent – sheep and goat meat, while the share of other meet is not significant.

The service was provided to 13.6 thousand persons, 33.2 percent of which were households. Average monthly number of persons employed in slaughterhouses equaled 982 persons.

The average prices of the slaughter services were: 31.5 GEL per cattle, 12.4 GEL per sheep or goat and 26.9 GEL per pig.



COLD STORAGE FACILITIES

In the II quarter of 2022 the number of active cold storage facilities in Georgia was 176 and most of them were located in Shida Kartli region (48.9 percent). Active cold storage facilities were also located in Tbilisi (13.6 percent), Kakheti region (10.2 percent), Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region (8.5 percent), Adjara AR (5.7 percent), Kvemo Kartli region (4.5 percent), Imereti region (4.0 percent), Guria region (1.7 percent), Mtskheta-Mtianeti region (1.7 percent) and Samtskhe-Javakheti region (1.1 percent):

ACTIVE COLD STORAGE FACILITIES IN GEORGIA BY REGIONS, II QUARTER, 2022





In the II quarter of 2022, the service was provided to 311 customers. The number of producers and resellers, from whom the products was purchased, amounted to 587 persons. Average monthly number of persons employed in cold storage facilities were 1 267.

In total 75.1 thousand tons of products were stored in cold storage facilities during the II quarter of 2022, of which 45.9 percent was chicken meat (including frozen meat), 13.1 percent – fruit and vegetable, 15.7 percent – meat and meat products (including semi-finished products, excluded chicken meat), 13.7 percent – fish, while remaining products had a small share:

PRODUCTS STORED IN COLD STORAGE FACILITIES, II QUARTER, 2022



In the II quarter of 2022, the share of own production in the total volume of products stored in cold storage facilities was 15.1 percent, while the share of products purchased for further realization was 17.9 percent and the share of products stored as services was 67.0 percent. The service fee at the same period amounted to 5.0 million GEL.

In the II quarter of 2022, the total cost of products (18.5 thousand tones) sold by cold storage facilities amounted 132.0 million GEL, of which the share of imported products was 14.8 percent, share of own production was 31.2 percent and the share of products (local) purchased for resale was 54.1 percent. Herewith, 57.4 percent of own production sold by cold storage facilities was

chicken meat. Significant share of imported products was Chicken meat (including frozen) (44.7 percent), meat and meat products (including semi-finished products) (26.6 percent) and fish (14.3 percent).

In the II quarter of 2022, the value of products sold by cold storage facilities on the foreign market amounted to 35.0 million GEL, which consists 26.5 percent of the total value of products sold in the same period. Mostly fruits, vegetables, chicken meat and fish products were sold on the foreign markets.

According to the survey results, the average daily load per storage (out of total storage capacity in percent) was 44.3 percent in April, 59.4 percent in May and 54.6 percent in June.





ELEVATORS

The total number of active elevators in Georgia in the II quarter of 2022 were 30 and most of them were located in Kvemo Kartli region (33.3 percent) while 23.3 percent of active elevators were located in Tbilisi, 10.0 percent in Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region, 10.0 percent in Imereti, 6.7 percent in Shida Kartli, 6.7 percent in Kakheti region, 6.7 percent in Guria region and 3.3 percent in Adjara:

ACTIVE ELEVATORS IN GEORGIA BY REGIONS, II QUARTER, 2022



In the II quarter of 2022, the service was provided to 7 customers. The number of producers and resellers, from whom the product were purchased, was 114 persons, while the average monthly number of persons employed in cold storage facilities equaled 519.

In total 112.2 thousand tons of products were stored in elevators during the II quarter of 2022, 76.9 percent of which was wheat. The share of products purchased by the elevators for resale in the total amount of products stored in the elevators was 91.8 percent at the same period.

Total amount of products sold by the elevators during the II quarter of 2022 amounted 106.7 thousand tones (total cost – 66.1 million GEL), 48.1 percent of which was own production.

The biggest share among own production had wheat flour, which consist 89.4 percent of total own production sold by the elevators at the same period.

According to survey results, average daily load per storage (out of total capacity of storages in percent) amounted to 44.6 percent in April, 44.6 percent in May and 46.6 percent in June.
