
INCOMES

In 2023, the average monthly income (cash and non-cash inflows) per household in Georgia increased by 18.4 percent compared to the previous year, reaching 1 722 GEL. The average monthly income per capita increased by 20.5 percent, amounting to 521 GEL.

The chart below presents average monthly cash and non-cash inflows per household and per capita for 2013-2023 years.



According to the survey results, the main source of household income is cash incomes and transfers. In 2023, this share increased by 0.7 percentage points compared to the previous year, amounting to 87.7 percent. The figure was 92.0 percent in urban areas and 79.7 percent in rural areas.

The chart below presents distribution of average monthly cash and non-cash inflows of households by main sources and settlement type for 2020-2023 years.

The average monthly income per household in urban areas increased by 24.9 percent, amounting to 1 756 GEL, while in rural areas it increased by 8.4 percent, equaling 1 664 GEL.

In the structure of cash incomes and transfers, the largest share is held by incomes received from wages, which increased by 1.8 percentage points compared to the previous year, reaching 48.0 percent. The share of self-employment income decreased by 0.6 percentage points, amounting to 11.8 percent. The share of income from pensions, scholarships, and social assistance increased by



0.2 percentage points, reaching 21.8 percent. The structure of cash incomes and transfers differs between urban and rural settlements.

The chart below presents distribution of cash incomes and transfers by categories and settlement type for 2023 year.


EXPENDITURES

In 2023, the average monthly expenditures per household in Georgia increased by 16.7 percent compared to the previous year, reaching 1 649 GEL, while the average monthly expenditures per capita increased by 18.7 percent, amounting to 499 GEL.

The chart below presents the average monthly expenditures per household and per capita for 2013-2023.



According to the survey results, in 2023, the share of household cash consumption expenditure in total expenditures decreased by 1.3 percentage points compared to the previous year, amounting to 70.2 percent.

The chart below presents distribution of average monthly expenditures of households by main categories and settlement type for 2020-2023 years.

The average monthly expenditures per household in urban areas increased by 23.5 percent, amounting to 1 706 GEL, while in rural areas it increased by 5.7 percent, equaling 1 551 GEL.


In the structure of cash consumption expenditure, the largest share is held by expenditures on food, beverages and tobacco, which decreased by 3.1 percentage points compared to the previous year, reaching 38.7 percent. The structure of cash consumption expenditure differs between urban and rural settlements.

The chart below presents distribution of cash consumption expenditure by categories and settlement type for 2023 year.
