3. Statistical presentation

3.1. Data description

The process of collecting social protection statistics involves collection, processing, and presentation of Institutional statistics data by LEPL Social Service Agency under the Ministry of Internally Displaced Persons from the Occupied Territories, Labor, Health and Social Affairs of Georgia to disseminate them to the Geostat under various State Social Security programs. Statistical Indicators of Accumulative Pension provided by Lepl Pension Agency also. Persons receiving a pension package; Persons receiving a social package by type; Number of registered and subsistence allowance recipient families; Number of persons in nursing homes for elderly and disabled; Number of persons in child care institutions, Number of beneficiaries with disabilities using oncology drugs funded by the Universal health care program by age groups, status and sex, Number of beneficiaries with disabilities receiving planned outpatient services by sex and regions, Number of patients with disabilities under the Universal health care program and number of reported cases by status and sex; registered participants in the Funded Pension Scheme, amount of pension fund asset portfolio (value of the fund), proceeds, number of participants who have been assigned Funded Pensions etc.

3.4. Statistical concepts and definitions

Pension Package (old age) – A monthly state disbursement to a certain category of the citizens permanently residing on the territory of Georgia, as well as the citizens of foreign states that have been legally residing on the territory of Georgia for the past 10 years and the persons without citizenship, disbursed on the basis of reaching the retirement age, in order to provide them with minimum subsistence means.

Social Package – A monthly state disbursement to a certain category of the citizens of Georgia in the presence of relevant grounds set forth in the law.

Subsistence Allowance – A monetary social assistance intended for improving the social and economic conditions of deprived families identified by the evaluation system.

Defined contribution scheme – A pension scheme where pension contributions to be made in favour of a participant are calculated in accordance with the procedure determined by this Law and are reflected in an individual retirement account, and the final benefit is calculated only after taking into account the implemented pension contributions and revenue, expense, surplus revenue, loss and other incomes (if any) credited to an individual retirement account, and the pension is paid in accordance with this Law.

Participant of pension scheme – A natural person who makes pension contributions and/or in favour of whom pension contributions are made in the funded pension scheme of the Pension Agency.

3.5. Statistical unit

Women of retirement age (60 years and older), Men of retirement age (65 years and older), Recipients of separate categories of social packages, and participants of pension scheme.

3.6. Statistical population

Population of relevant category of Georgia.

3.7. Reference area

The data covers the whole territory of Georgia, except the occupied territories.

7. Confidentiality

7.1. Confidentiality – policy

- 1. The Law of Georgia on Official Statistics:
 - According to the article 5 of the law Statistical confidentiality and exclusive use for statistical purposes individual data collected or received by the producer of official statistics, relating to natural or legal persons, must be strictly confidential and used only for statistical purposes.
 - According to the article 34 (Observing Confidentiality of Statistical Data) of the law 1. Data collected, processed, and stored to produce official statistics are confidential if they enable the direct or indirect identification of a statistical unit. In addition, aggregated data are subject to statistical confidentiality: a) Aggregates composed of 1 to 3 units, when the unit is a natural or legal person if one of these units could be identified indirectly, thereby disclosing individual data about this unit. Aggregates composed of more than 3 units may be declared confidential by the Executive Director if required to ensure statistical confidentiality; b) Information declares as a state secret on the basis of the "Law of Georgia on State Secrets". 2. Confidential data about the administrative body cannot be considered confidential information, except for the information determined by the Law of Georgia "On State Secrets". 4. Individual data obtained from publicly available sources, which are defined as public information in accordance with the legislation of Georgia, shall not be considered confidential (individual) data may be published if there is written consent from the statistical unit regarding the publication of such data. 6. It is not allowed to disseminate and distribute confidential data or use it for non-statistical purposes.
 - According to the article 38 (Confidentiality commitments) of the law the confidential statistical data collected and processed for statistical purposes shall not be used or disseminated either for personal, academic, research
