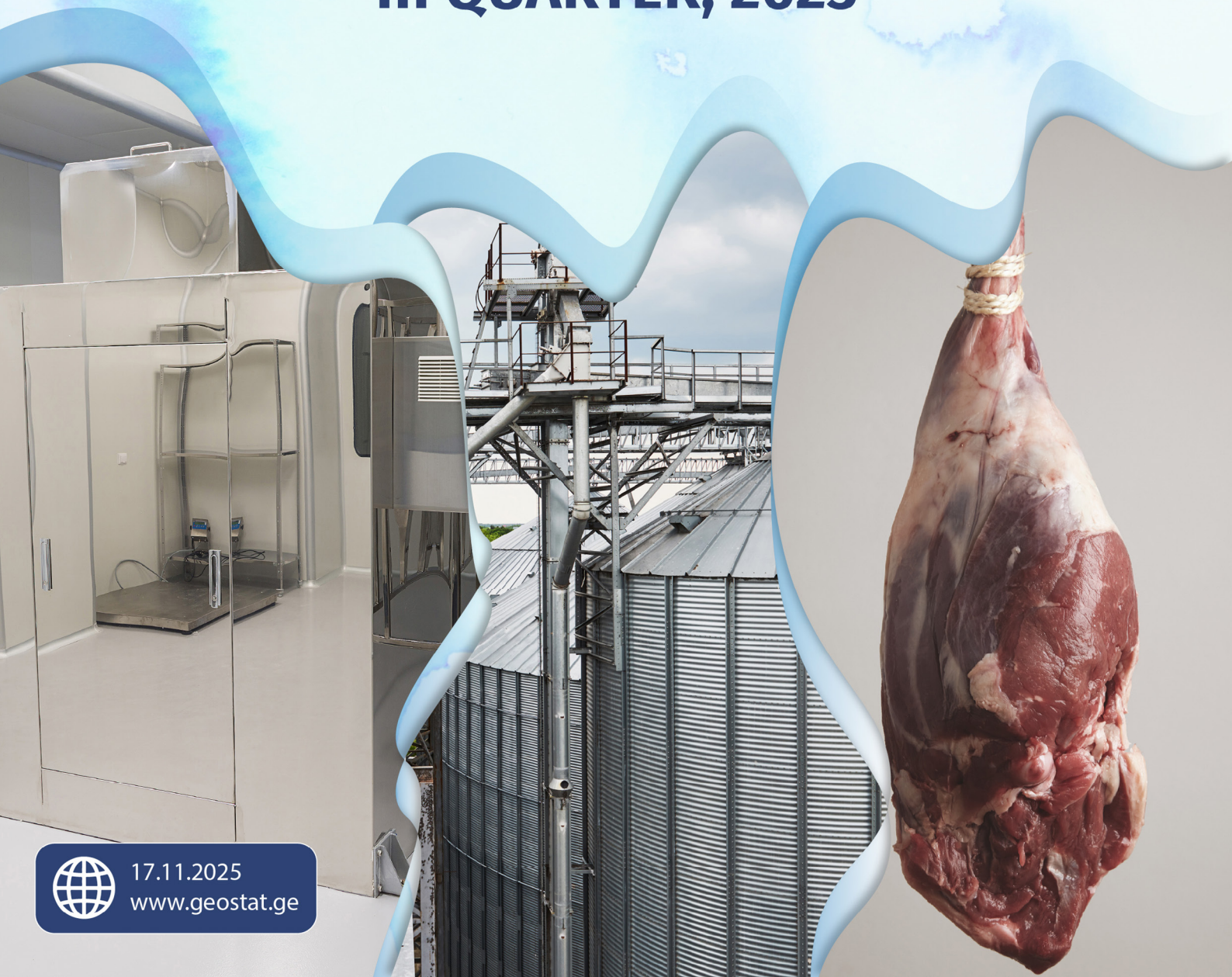

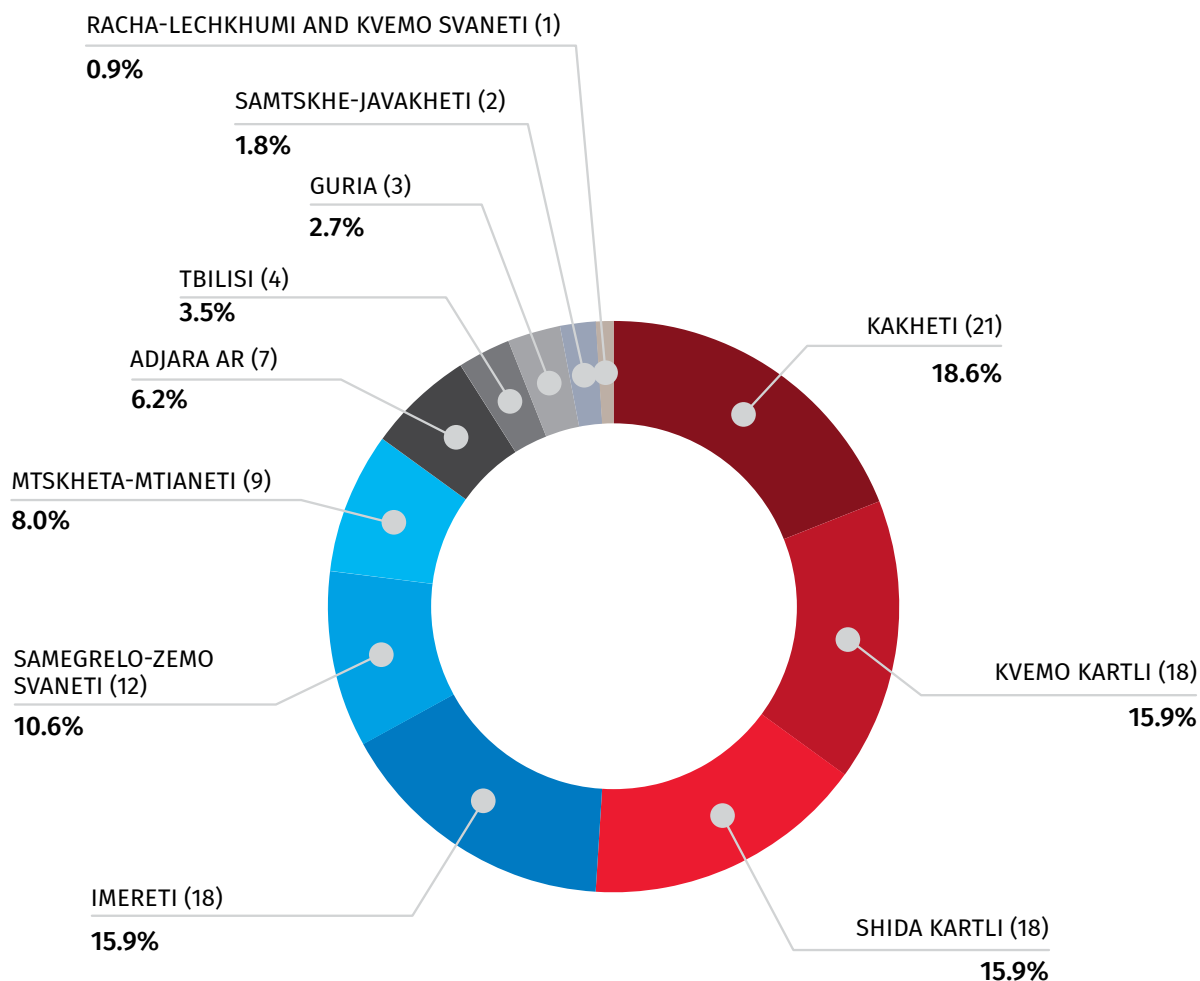

SURVEY RESULTS FOR LIVESTOCK SLAUGHTERHOUSES, ELEVATORS AND COLD STORAGE FACILITIES (III QUARTER, 2025)

SLAUGHTERHOUSES

The total number of active livestock and poultry slaughterhouses in Georgia in the III quarter of 2025 was 113, of which 18.6 percent were located in Kakheti region, 15.9 percent in Kvemo Kartli region, 15.9 percent in Shida Kartli region, 10.6 percent in Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region, 8.0 percent in Mtskheta-Mtianeti region and the remaining 15.0 percent — in other regions:

According to the survey, 129.4 thousand heads of livestock were slaughtered in slaughterhouses in the III quarter of 2025, of which 31.7 percent were cattle, 61.3 percent – pigs and 5.7 percent – sheep and goats. The share of other livestock (excluding poultry) slaughtered was 1.3 percent. In addition, the number of poultry slaughtered in slaughterhouses during the reporting period amounted to 3 274.3 thousand.

In total 16.7 thousand tons of meat (i.e. slaughtered weight, including poultry meat) was produced by slaughterhouses during the III quarter of 2025, of which 29.1 percent was beef, 35.0 percent – poultry, 35.2 percent – pork, 0.7 percent – mutton and goat meat, while the share of other meat was negligible.

The service was provided to 8.9 thousand persons, 46.4 percent of which were households. Average monthly number of persons employed in slaughterhouses equaled 966 persons.

The average prices of the slaughter services were: 39.9 GEL per cattle, 31.8 GEL per pig, and 14.2 GEL per sheep or goat.

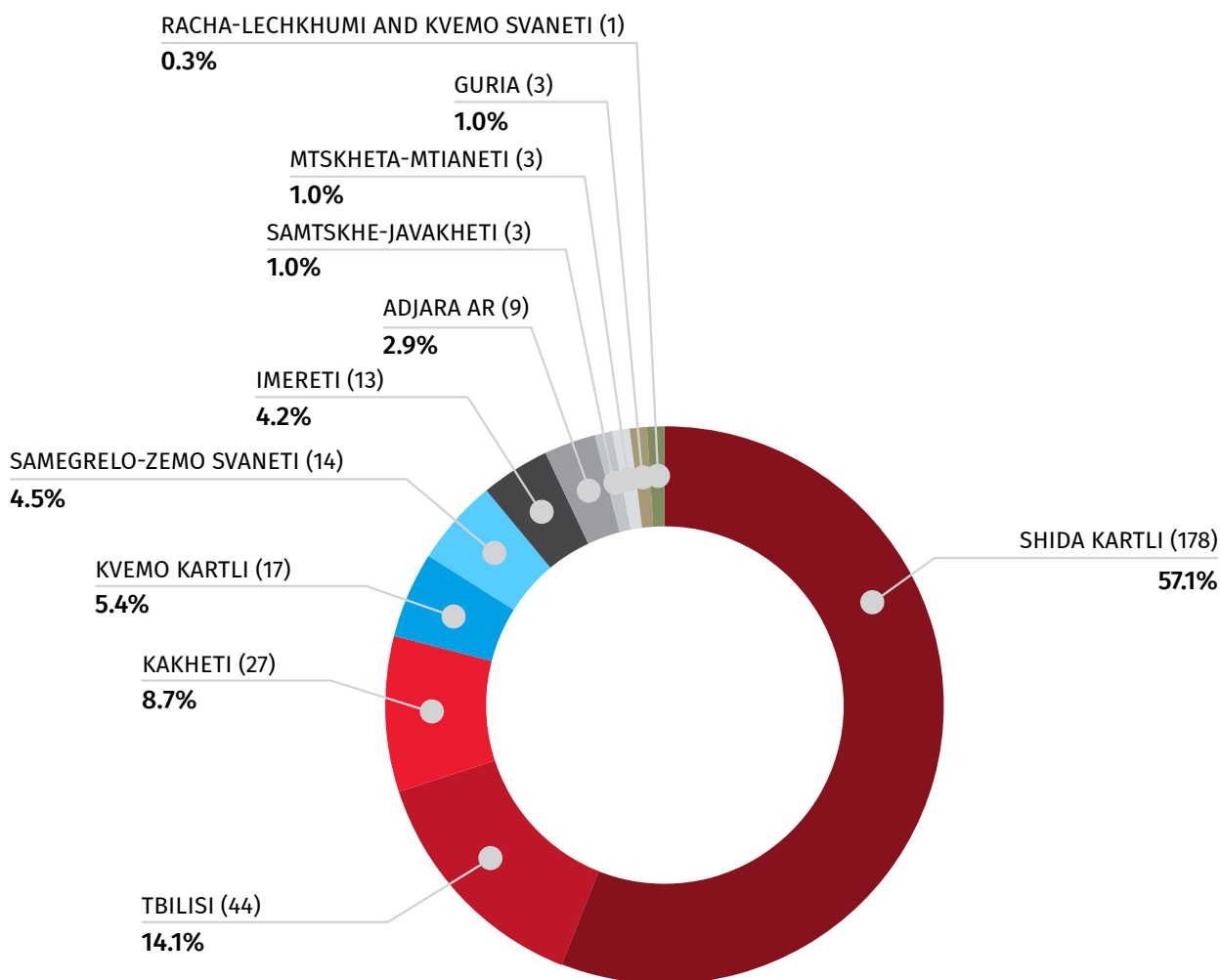
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COLD STORAGE FACILITIES

In the III quarter of 2025 the number of active cold storage facilities in Georgia was 312 and most of them were located in Shida Kartli region (57.1 percent). Active cold storage facilities were also located in Tbilisi (14.1 percent), Kakheti region (8.7 percent), Kvemo Kartli region (5.4 percent), Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region (4.5 percent), Imereti region (4.2 percent), Adjara AR (2.9 percent), Samtskhe-Javakheti region (1.0 percent), Mtskheta-Mtianeti region (1.0 percent), Guria region (1.0 percent) and Racha-Lechkhumi and Kvemo Svaneti region (0.3 percent):

ACTIVE COLD STORAGE FACILITIES IN GEORGIA BY REGIONS, III QUARTER, 2025

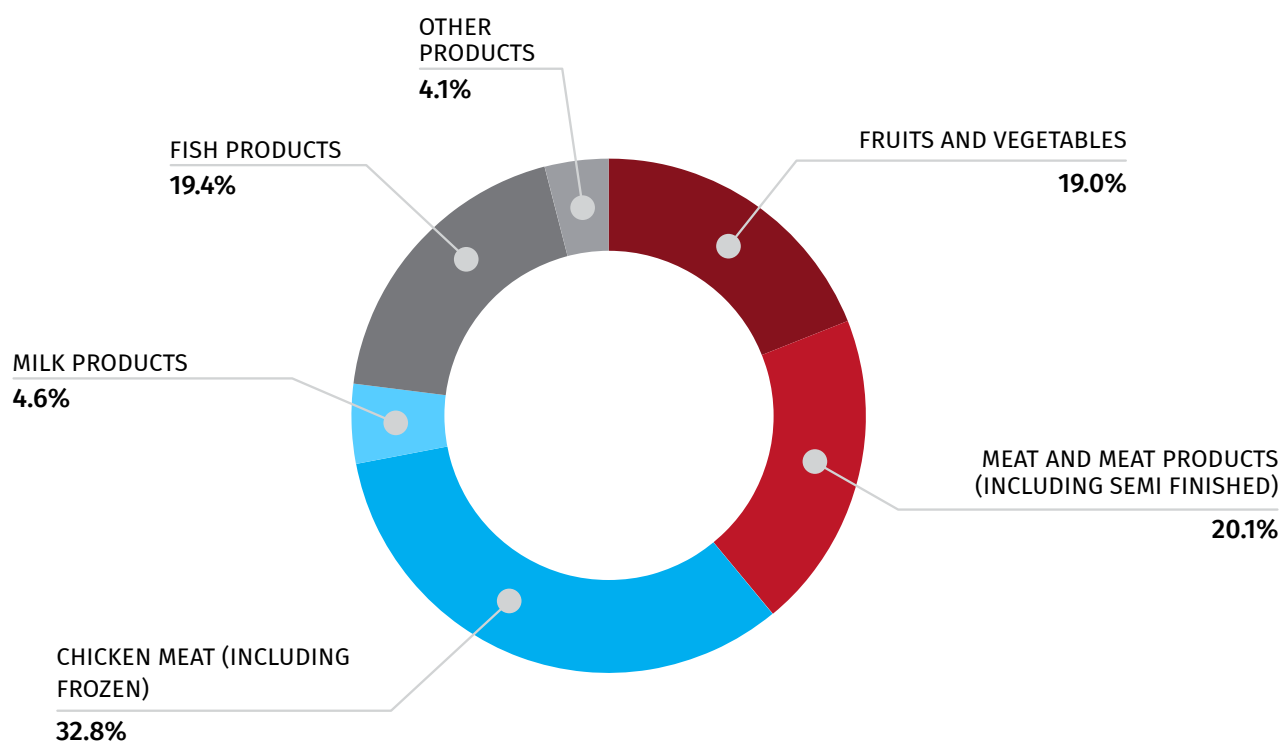

In the III quarter of 2025, the service was provided to 373 customers. The number of producers and resellers, from whom the products were purchased, amounted to 748 persons. Average monthly number of persons employed in cold storage facilities was 1 740.

In total 108.1 thousand tons of products were stored in cold storage facilities during the III quarter of 2025, of which 32.8 percent was chicken meat (including frozen meat), 20.1 percent – meat and meat products (including semi-finished products, excluded chicken meat), 19.4 percent – fish, 19.0 percent – fruits and vegetables, 4.6 percent – milk products and 4.1 percent other products:

In the III quarter of 2025, the share of own production in the total volume of products stored in cold storage facilities was 24.4 percent, while the share of products purchased for further resale was 25.7 percent and the share of products stored as services was 49.9 percent. The service fee in the same period amounted to 6.2 million GEL.

In the III quarter of 2025, the total cost of products (24.5 thousand tons) sold by cold storage facilities amounted to 207.0 million GEL, of which the share of imported products was 40.8 percent, share of own production was 16.8 percent and the share of products (local) purchased for resale was 42.5 percent. Herewith, 32.1 percent of own production sold by cold storage facilities was chicken meat. Significant share of imported products was milk products (38.5 percent), meat and meat products (including semi-finished products) (18.6 percent), chicken meat (including frozen) (16.7 percent) and fish (8.0 percent).

In the III quarter of 2025, the value of products sold by cold storage facilities on the foreign market amounted to 11.1 million GEL, which constituted to 5.4 percent of the total value of products sold in the same period. Mostly chicken meat, fruits and vegetables were sold on the foreign markets.

According to the survey results, the average daily load per storage (out of total storage capacity in percentage) was 55.1 percent in July, 51.5 percent in August and 48.8 percent in September.

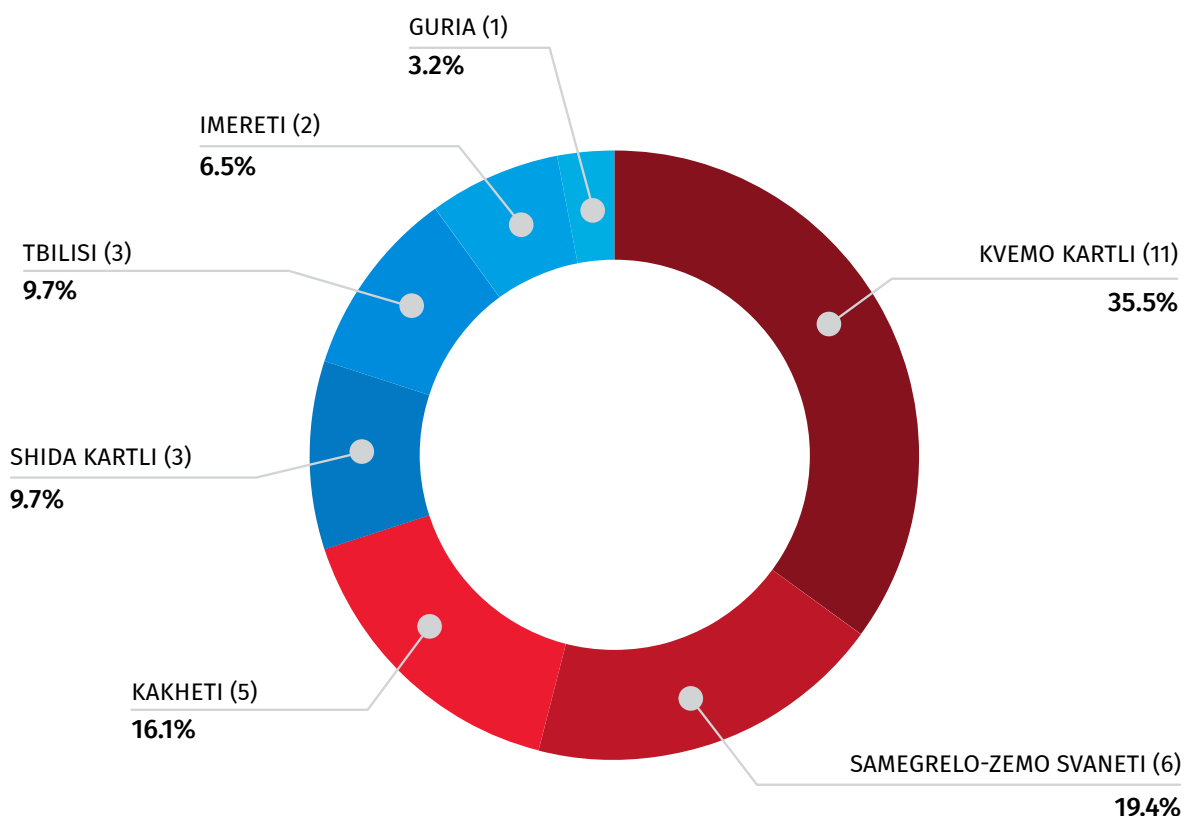
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ELEVATORS

The total number of active elevators in Georgia in the III quarter of 2025 was 31 and most of them were located in Kvemo Kartli (35.5 percent) region, while 19.4 percent of active elevators were located in Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region, 16.1 percent in Kakheti region, 9.7 percent in Shida Kartli region, 9.7 percent in Tbilisi, 6.5 percent in Imereti region and 3.2 percent in Guria region:

In the III quarter of 2025, the service was provided to 11 customers. The number of producers and resellers, from whom the product were purchased for resale, was 54 persons, while the average monthly number of persons employed in elevators equaled 403.

In total 136.7 thousand tons of products were stored in elevators during the III quarter of 2025, 70.3 percent of which was wheat and 15.9 percent – soybean meal. The share of products purchased by the elevators for resale in the total amount of products stored in the elevators was 71.8 percent in the same period.

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Total amount of products sold by the elevators during the III quarter of 2025 amounted to 76.9 thousand tons (total value – 75.7 million GEL), 29.8 percent of which was imported production and 60.3 percent was local (own produced) products.

The biggest share in own production, in terms of volume as well as value, had wheat flour, which constituted to 77.4 percent of total own production sold by the elevators in the same period.

According to survey results, average daily load of storages (out of total capacity of storages in percentage) amounted to 49.2 percent in July, 49.4 percent in August and 49.9 percent in September.
