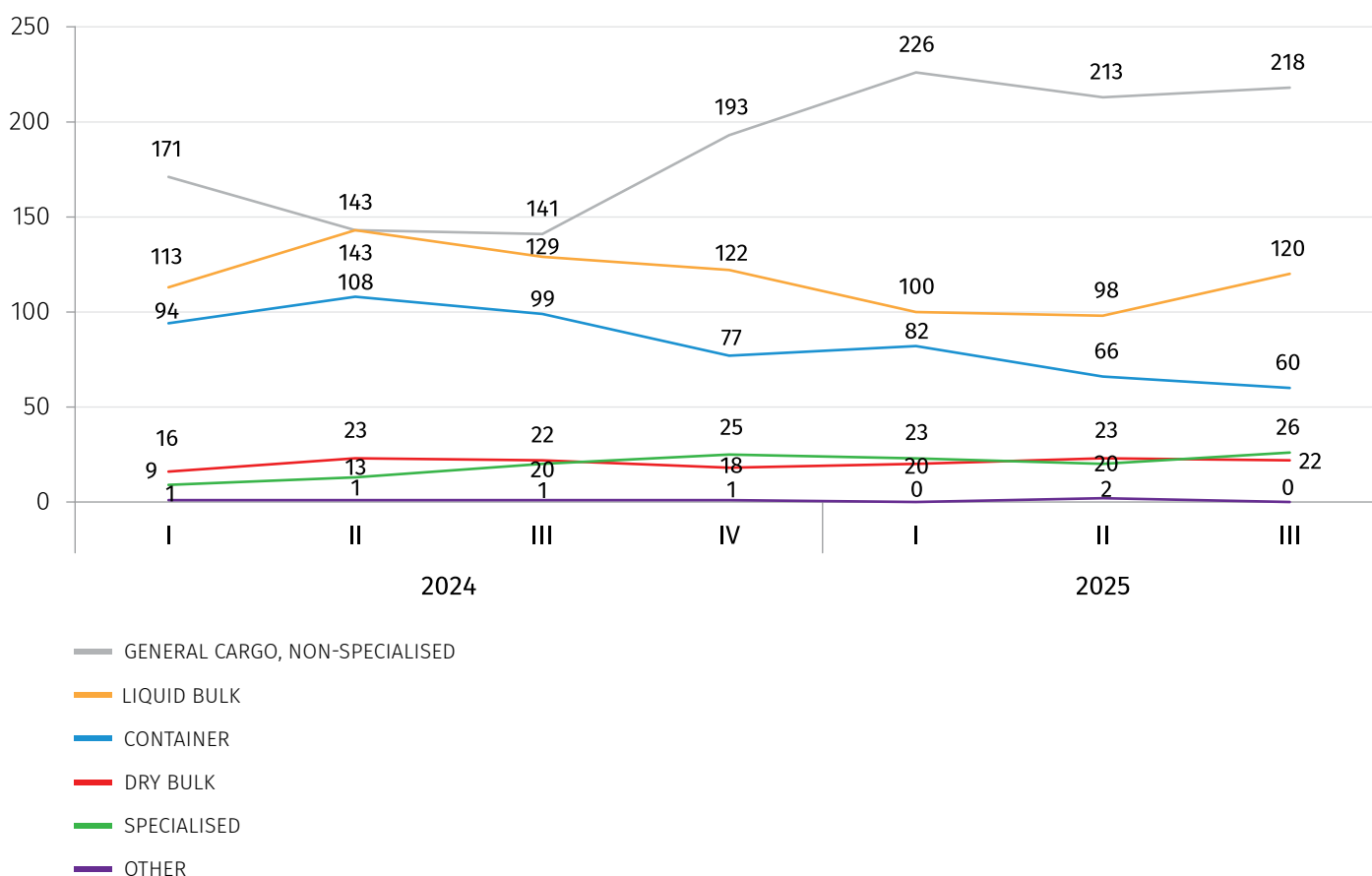

MAJOR INDICATORS OF SEAPORTS AND TERMINALS (2025, III QUARTER)

In the III quarter of 2025, 446¹ ships entered the ports and terminals of Georgia. 48.9 percent of those ships were general cargo carriers, 26.9 percent were liquid bulk, 13.4 percent – container ships, and the rest of 10.8 percent were distributed among dry bulk carriers and specialized ships.

In the III quarter of 2025, compared to the corresponding period of the previous year, the ports and terminals of Georgia received 54.6 percent more general cargo carriers, 30.0 percent more – specialized carriers, 39.4 percent less – container ships, and 7.0 percent less – liquid bulk.

NUMBER OF SHIP BY TYPE (UNIT)



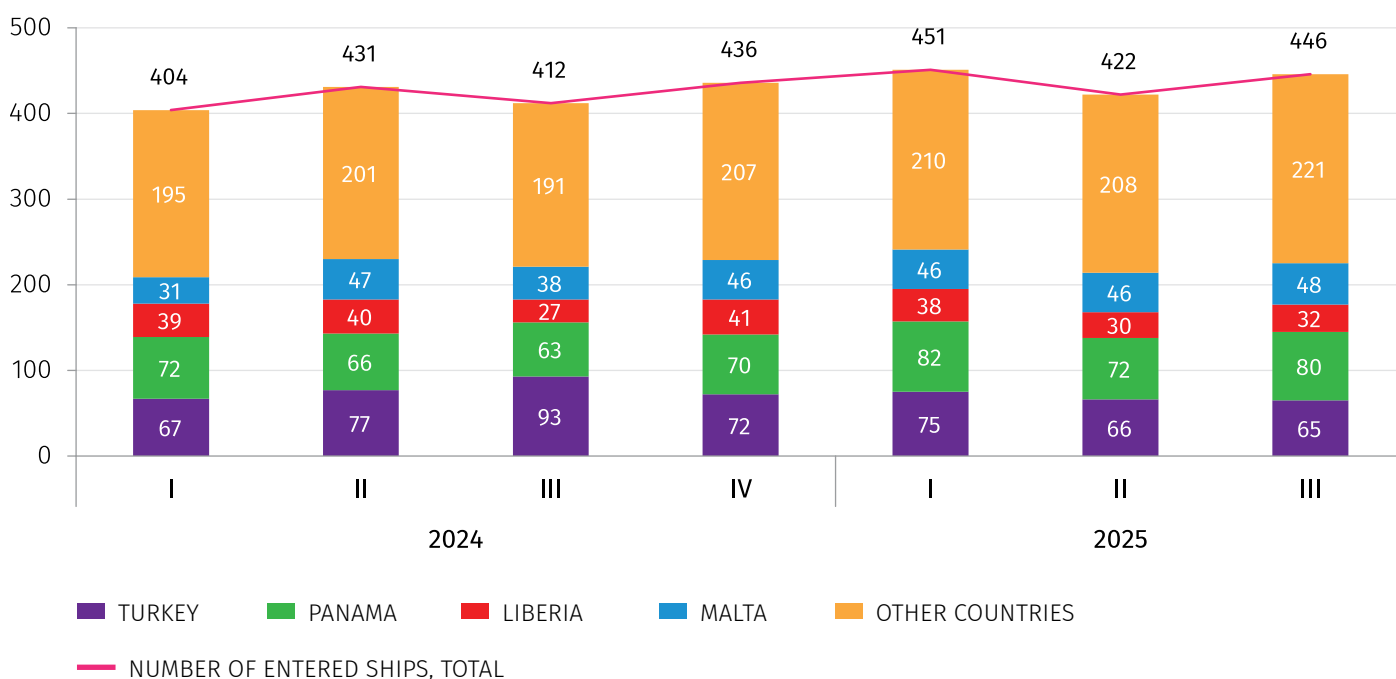

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In the III quarter of 2025, 17.9 percent of the ships arriving at the ports and terminals of Georgia sailed under the flag of Panama, 14.6 percent – under the flag of Turkey, 10.8 percent – under the flag of Malta, 7.2 percent – under the flag of Liberia, and the rest of 49.5 percent were distributed among other countries.

(UNIT)**

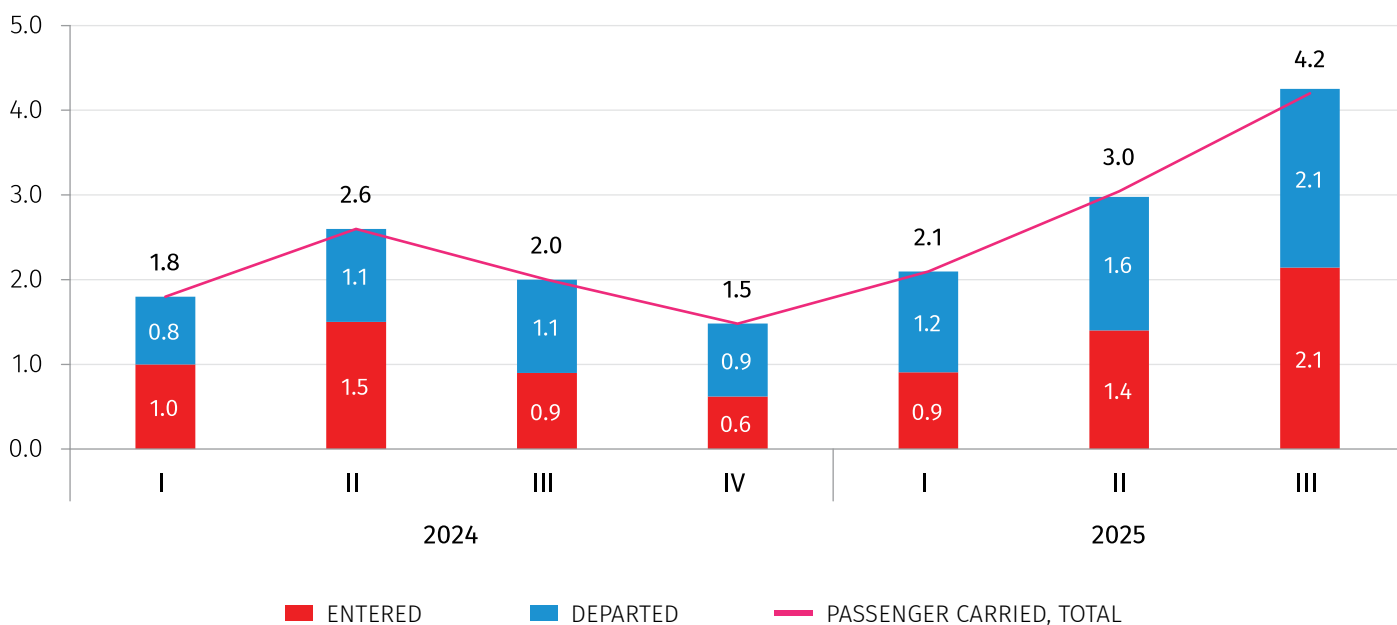


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In the III quarter of 2025, Georgian seaports served 4.2 thousand passengers, which is 2.1 times more compared to the corresponding figure of the previous year. Note, the share of passengers departed was slightly higher than the share of passengers entered and stood at 50.4 percent.

PASSENGERS CARRIED IN PORTS AND TERMINALS OF GEORGIA (THOUSAND PERSONS)

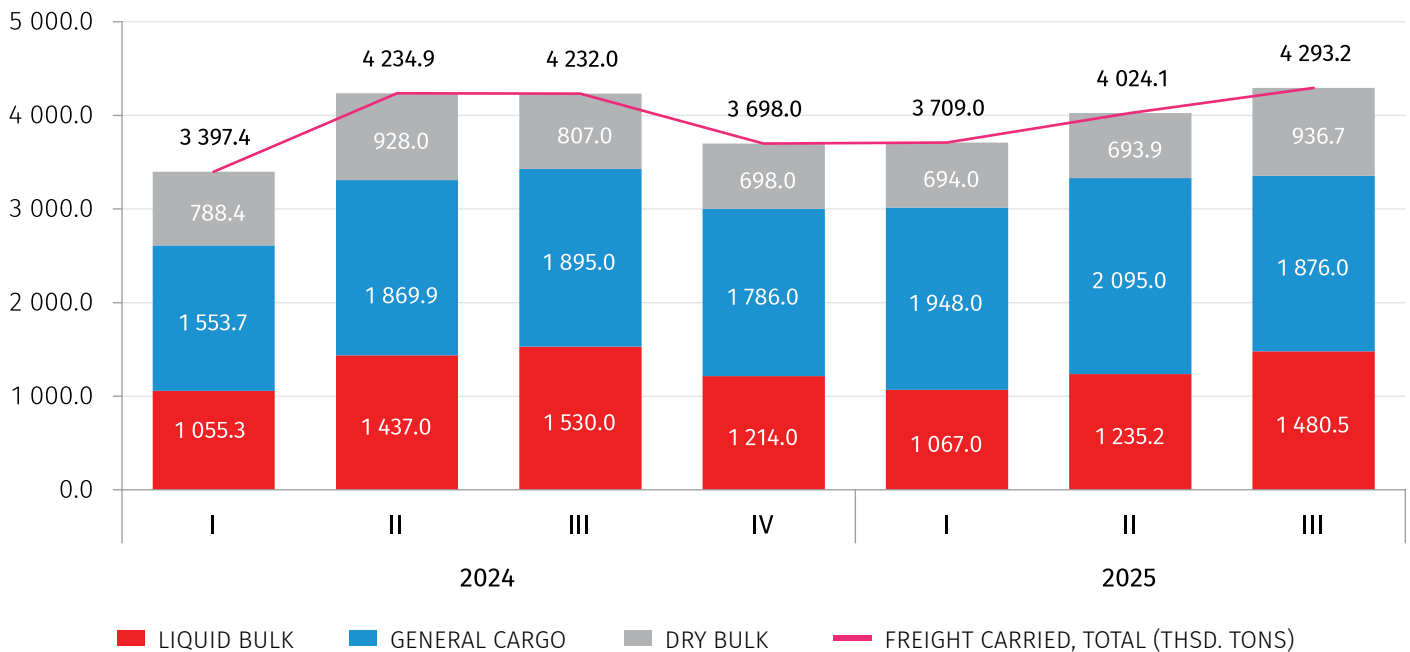


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In the III quarter of 2025, ports and terminals of Georgia processed 4 293.2 thousand tons of cargo, 1.4 percent more compared to the corresponding figure of the previous year. 43.7 percent of freight carried was general cargo, 34.5 percent was liquid bulk, and 21.8 percent – dry bulk.
