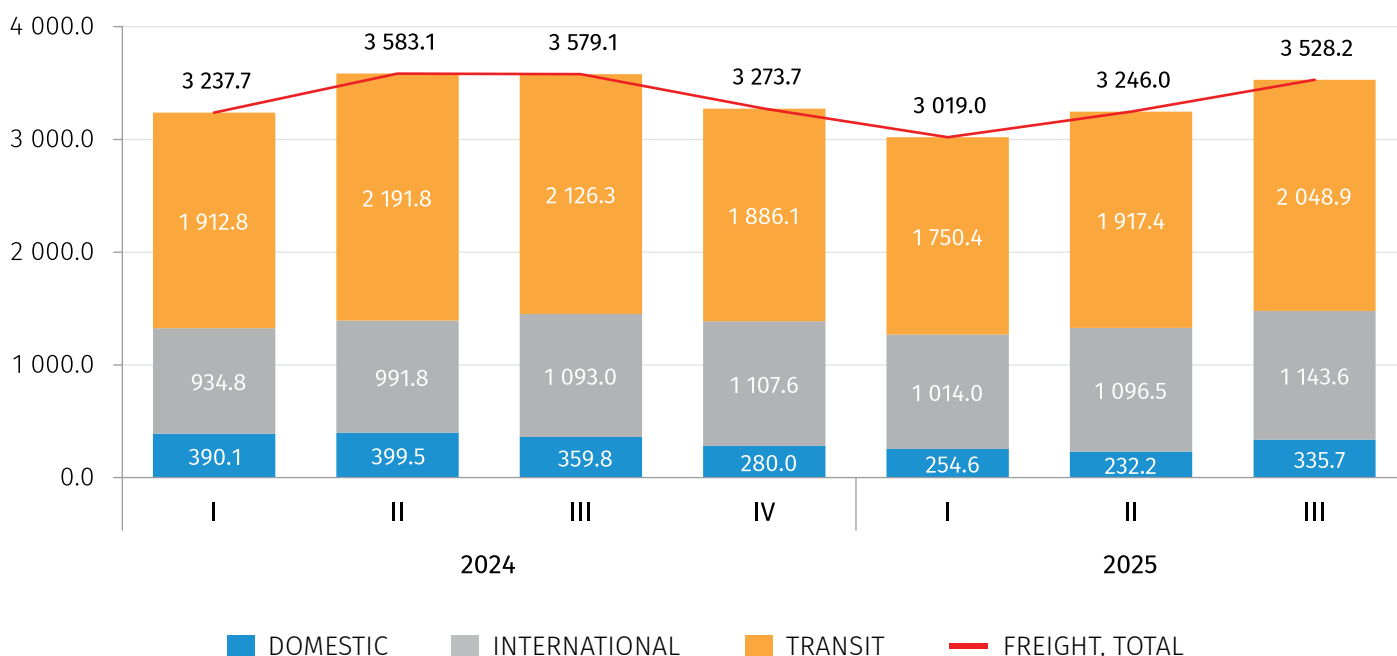

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MAIN INDICATORS OF RAILWAY (2025, III QUARTER)

In the III quarter of 2025, rail transported 3.5 million tons of freight, which is 1.4 percent less than the respective figure of the previous year. 9.5 percent of the total freight was transported domestically, 32.4 percent was transported internationally (excluding transit), and 58.1 percent was transit.

RAILWAY TRANSPORTED FREIGHTS BY TYPE OF TRANSPORT, (THOUSAND TONS)

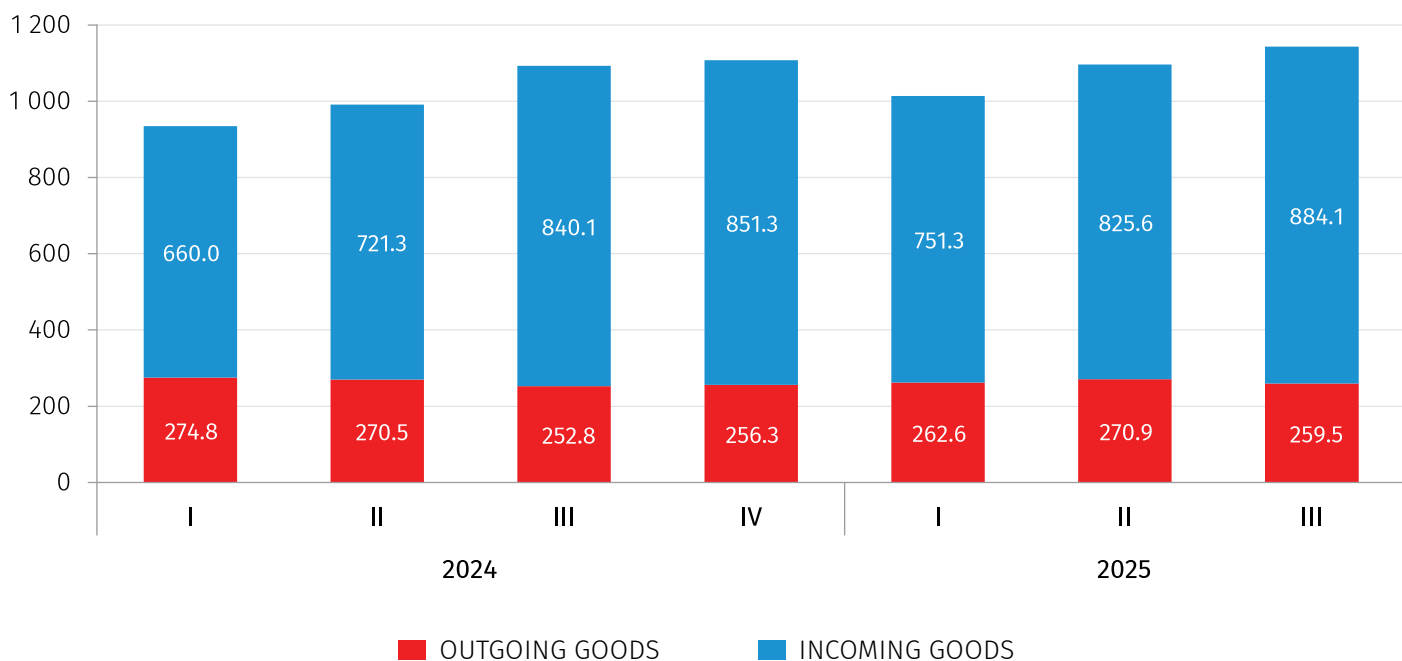


In the III quarter of 2025, the share of incoming freight represented 77.3 percent of the railway-transported freights, while the share of outgoing freight was 22.7 percent.

The chart below shows the structure of internationally transported freights by quarters:

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STRUCTURE OF INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTED GOODS, (THOUSAND TONS)



In the III quarter of 2025, the sender country of 32.0 percent of total incoming rail freight was Azerbaijan, 29.1 percent was sent by Russian Federation. The share of other countries sending cargo was less than ten percent each (38.9 percent combined).

In the III quarter of 2025, Armenia was the final destination for 22.1 percent of total outgoing freight, for 11.6 percent it was Kazakhstan, for 6.3 percent – Russian Federation. The share of other individual receiving countries was relatively small (60.0 percent combined).

In the III quarter of 2025, the breakdown of the total transit freight¹ by the final destination country was as follows: the Netherlands – 16.2 percent, Turkey – 10.0 percent, China – 7.2 percent, Italy – 2.9 percent, Ukraine – 2.4 percent, Romania – 0.7 percent, and elsewhere was for the rest. In the same period, Brazil was the sender country of 9.2 percent of the total transit freight, Turkey – 2.6 percent and other countries sent the rest.

In the reporting period, 37.7 percent of the total freight were coke and refined petroleum products, 20.6 percent were chemicals, chemical products, and man-made fibers; rubber and plastic products, and 12.6 percent were metal ores and other mining and quarrying products.

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The distribution by type of goods was different in case of freights transported domestically in the III quarter of 2025, as the share of metal ores and other mining and quarrying products equaled 59.8 percent of total, and the share of coke and refined petroleum products amounted to 20.2 percent; while the share of transport equipment amounted to 9.0 percent.

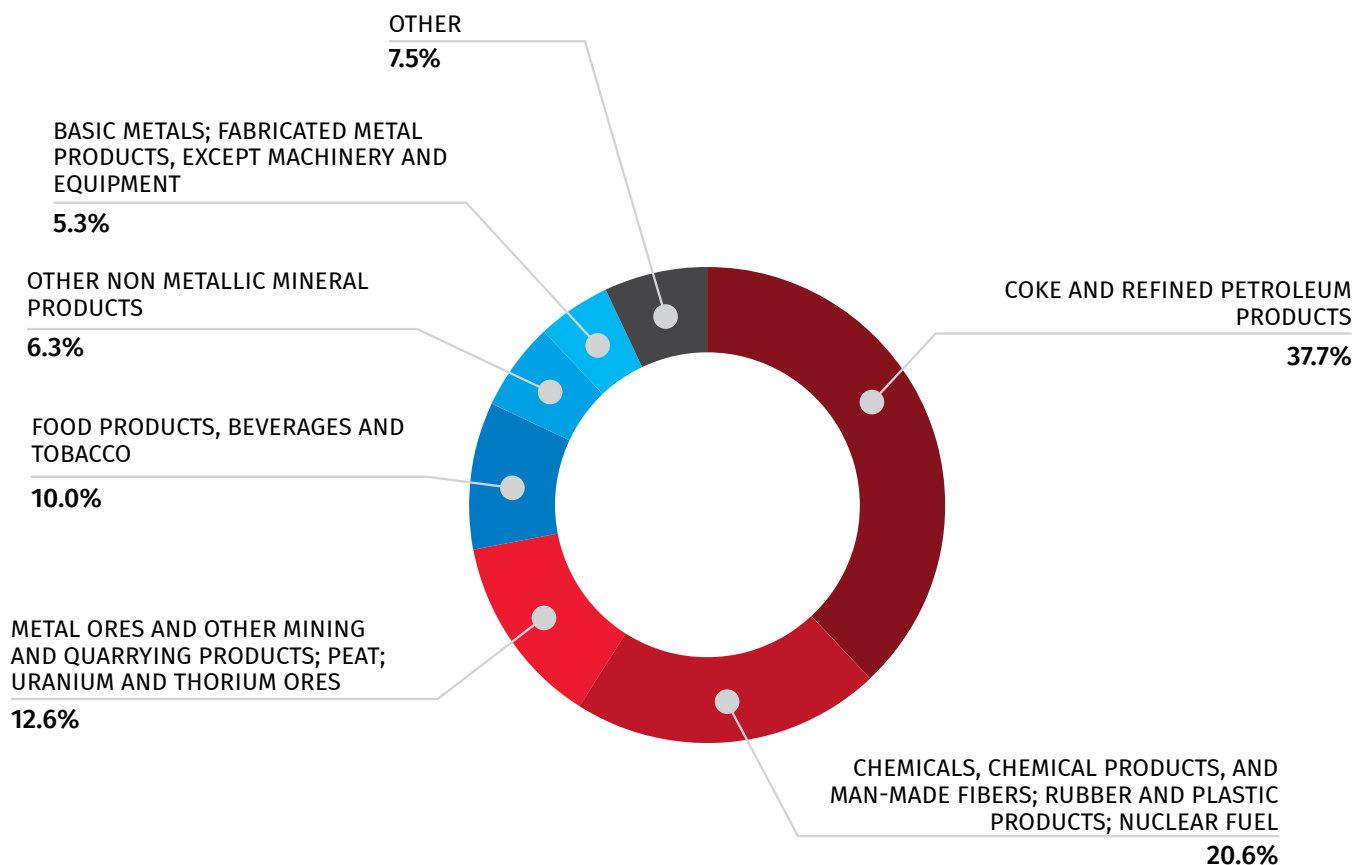
As for the freights transported internationally, in the reporting period, incoming goods were mainly coke and refined petroleum products (47.7 percent), other nonmetallic mineral products (18.9 percent), metal ores and other mining and quarrying products (14.5 percent), products of agriculture, hunting, and forestry (3.8 percent), coal and lignite; crude petroleum and natural gas (3.5 percent), basic metals (3.2 percent) and chemicals, chemical products, and man-made fibers (2.9 percent); while outgoing goods were mainly chemicals, chemical products, and man-made fibers (25.3 percent), food products, beverages and tobacco (24.9 percent), basic metals (16.1 percent) and metal ores and other mining and quarrying products (13.6 percent).

In the III quarter of 2025, three type of goods, namely coke and refined petroleum products (40.9 percent), chemicals, chemical products, and man-made fibers (31.1 percent), and food products, beverages and tobacco (12.9 percent) constituted for 84.9 percent of the total volume of transit freight.

The chart below shows the structure of rail-transported goods in Georgia by type In the III quarter of 2025:

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STRUCTURE OF RAILWAY-TRANSPORTED FREIGHTS BY TYPE OF GOODS



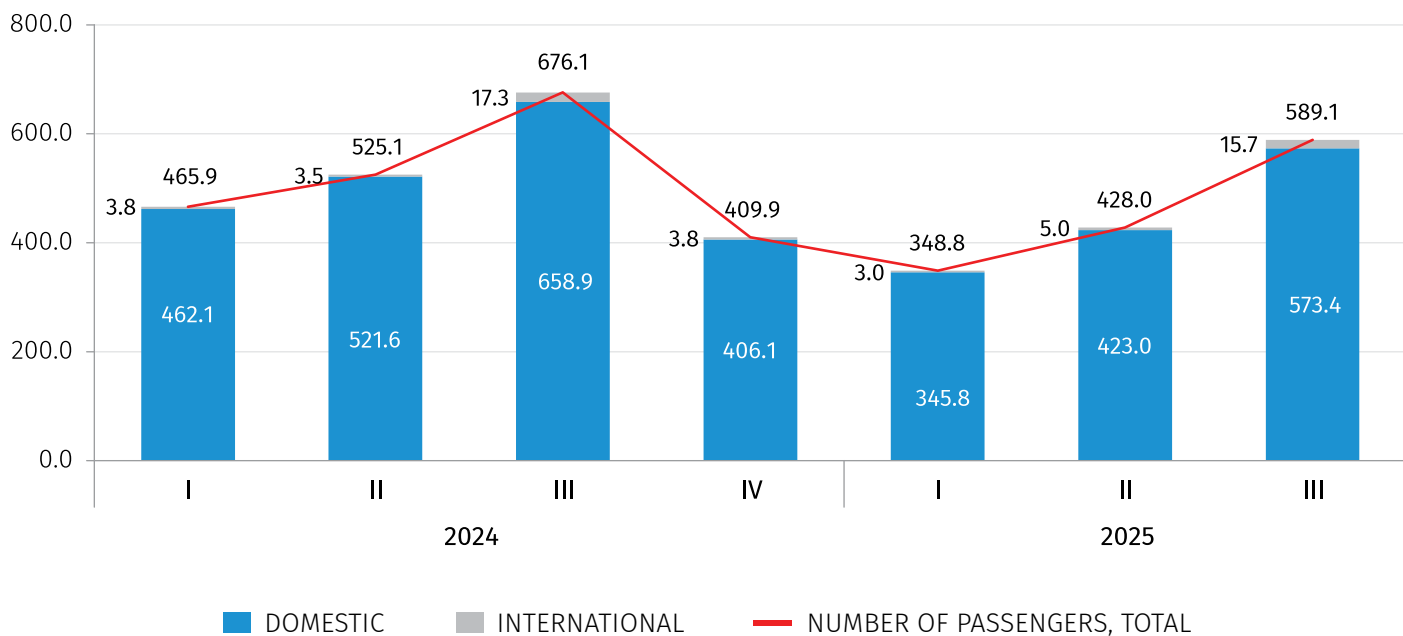
In the III quarter of 2025, the number of passengers transported by the Georgian Railway decreased by 12.9 percent compared to the corresponding period of the previous year and amounted to 589.1 thousand persons. At the same time, passenger turnover decreased by 10.9 percent and amounted to 144.9 million passenger-kilometer.

In the III quarter of 2025, the number of passengers transported within the country amounted to 573.4 thousand persons, which represents 97.3 percent of the total number of passengers carried and is 13.0 percent less than the same figure of 2024. At the same time, the number of passengers transported internationally amounted to 15.6 thousand, which is 9.3 percent less than the corresponding figure in the previous year. The country of embarkation was Armenia for 78.3 percent of internationally transported passengers, while the country of disembarkation was Armenia for 21.7 percent (no passengers were transported from/to any other neighboring country in the III quarter of 2025).
