INDICATORS OF VOCATIONAL EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (2025)

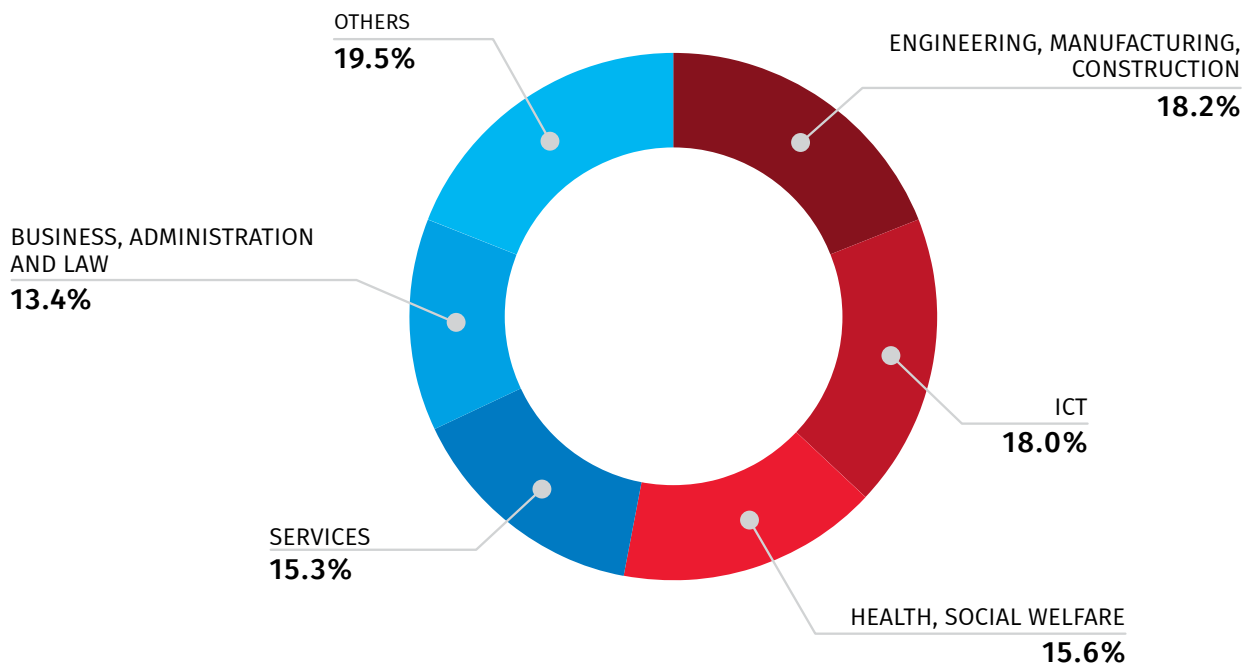
In 2025, 191 educational institutions (140 public and 51 private) were operating in Georgia that conducted admission of students in vocational education programs.

In 2025, 19.7 thousand students were admitted, 53.7% of whom are women and 46.3% men. Compared to 2024, student admissions have increased by 15.3%.

The chart below presents the number of admitted students by vocational education programs in 2025.

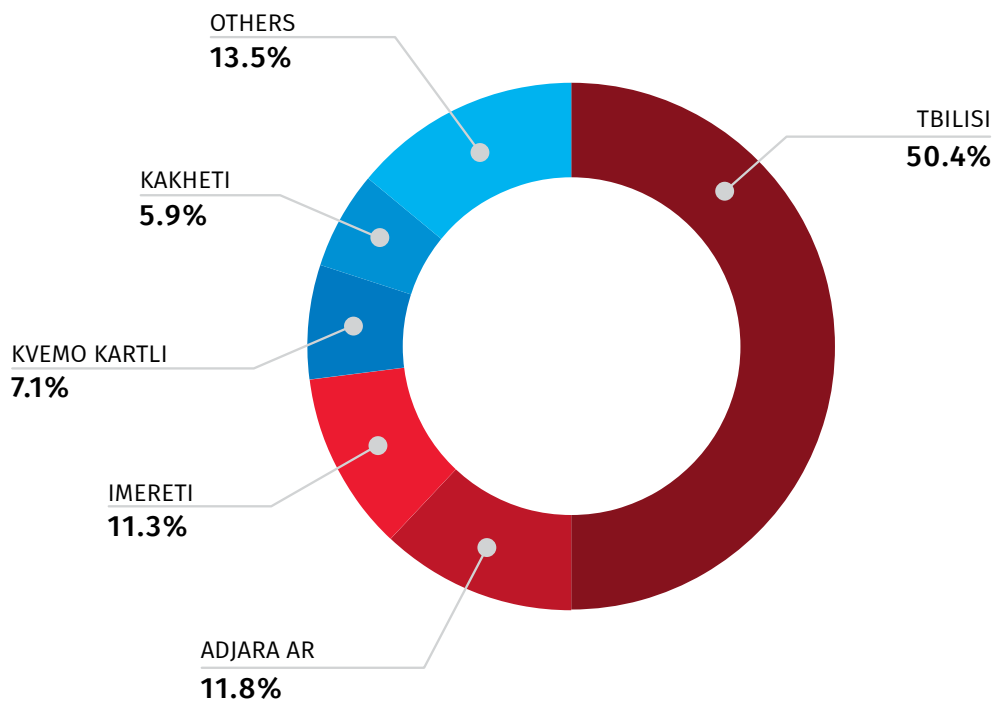
As for the data by regions, the highest number of students was admitted in the city of Tbilisi (40.1%), followed by Adjara AR (19.3%), Imereti (11.5%), Kvemo Kartli (10.0%), Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti (7.4%), Kakheti (4.1%).

In 2025, 238 students were admitted with special educational needs, 35.7% of whom are women and 64.3% men. As for the data by regions, Tbilisi has the leading position with the number of admitted students (50.4%).

The chart below presents the number of admitted students with special educational needs by regions in 2025.

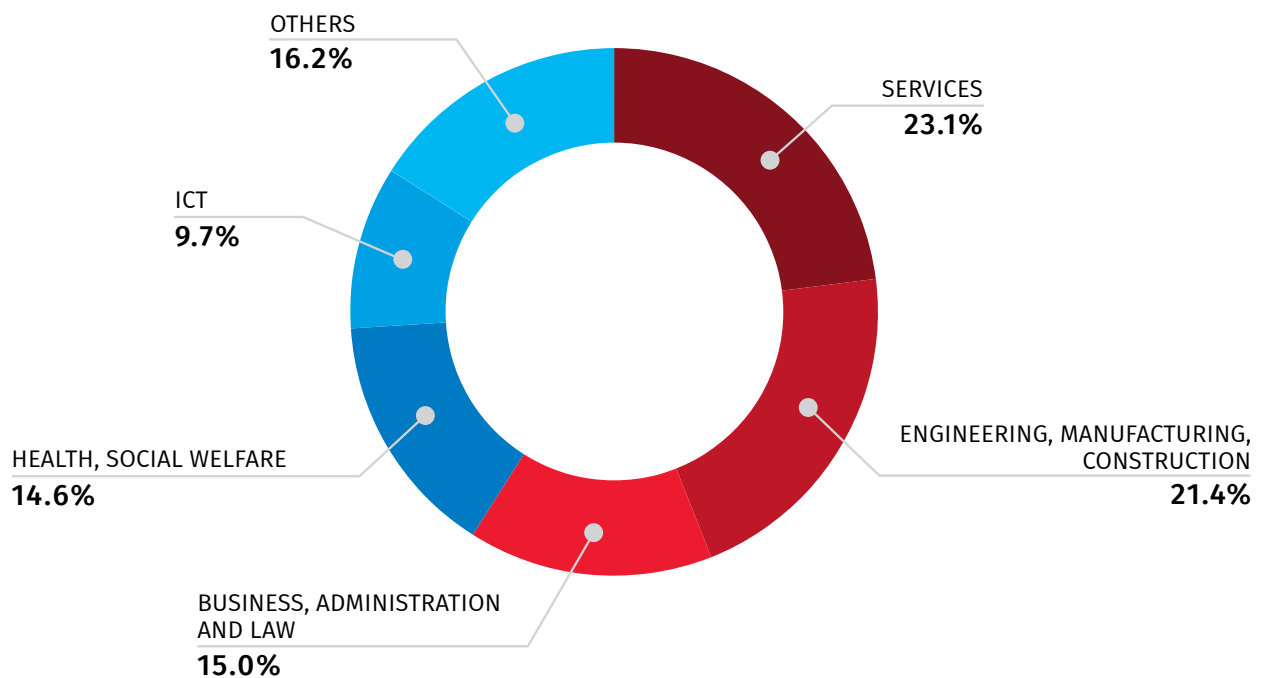

In 2025, the number of graduates was 10.5 thousand, out of which 47.1% were women and 52.9% - men. Most of them come from Services (23.1%), Engineering, Manufacturing, Construction (21.4%), and Business, Administration and Law (15.0%) programs.
