Instructions for Interviewers

During the interview, the household member/members who are informed about the volume of expenditures incurred by the household in relation to the activities presented in the questionnaire during 2022 should be interviewed. The year 2022 refers to the calendar year.

The survey covers only informal activities of household members related to the production of goods and provision of services without establishing a legal entity.

Note:

In cases where it is impossible to interview the selected household, another household located in the same enumeration area must be interviewed in order to ensure the number of sampled households determined by the sample design.

The survey shall not include activities for which any household member is registered as a taxpayer.

To complete the questionnaire, it is necessary to assess expenditures incurred on goods and services used for the production of the products listed in the headings. For example, if the household uses flour obtained from own-produced grain or purchased flour, as well as self-produced or purchased firewood, brushwood, other fuel or electricity for baking bread, the value of flour, firewood, other fuel or electricity used specifically for bread baking should be recorded in this questionnaire.

The interviewer should obtain from the respondent assessments of production expenditures (goods and services used) at producer prices, i.e. prices prevailing at retail or wholesale markets available to the respondent.

Intermediate consumption expenditures should be recorded both in value terms and, in certain cases, in natural units (kilograms, liters, etc.).

As respondents may experience difficulties estimating annual expenditures in some cases, during the interview they should be asked about local selling prices during the most recent period (previous day, week or month), and annual expenditures should then be estimated on this basis. If it is impossible to determine the monetary equivalent of intermediate consumption in this way, the respective field should remain blank.

If the price is unknown, the household should leave the value field blank, but should complete the quantity field for products consumed in kind using the appropriate unit of measurement (grapes – kg, firewood – cubic meter, etc.). If the price of the consumed product is known, both the value and quantity fields should be completed accordingly.

In some cases, when certain products are produced daily or every other day, households may find it difficult to estimate annual quantities. In such situations, quantities should be estimated on a weekly or monthly basis and then extrapolated to the annual level.

Example:

If a household produced an average of 10 kilograms of cheese per week and used 10 liters of milk to produce 1 kilogram of cheese, then the household consumed 100 liters of milk weekly as intermediate consumption for cheese production. Annual intermediate milk consumption should be estimated based on average weekly intermediate consumption.

In the first section of the questionnaire, irrigation water should include only the direct expenditure on water. For example, if the household uses its own well for irrigation and electricity is used to operate the well, this should be recorded as electricity expenditure and not as irrigation water expenditure.

In the third section, capital repairs and current repairs are distinguished from one another.

Capital repair refers to substantial changes in the structure or appearance of buildings and constructions. Examples include roof replacement, replacement of electrical wiring and water pipes, dismantling old doors/windows and replacing them with new ones.

Current repair refers to restoration of the previous condition of buildings and constructions without substantial structural changes and does not imply enlargement of the dwelling. Examples include replacement of damaged parts, roof repair, replacement of window frames, replacement of wallpaper, and painting of walls and ceilings.

Unlike current repairs, capital repairs extend the service life of the dwelling.
