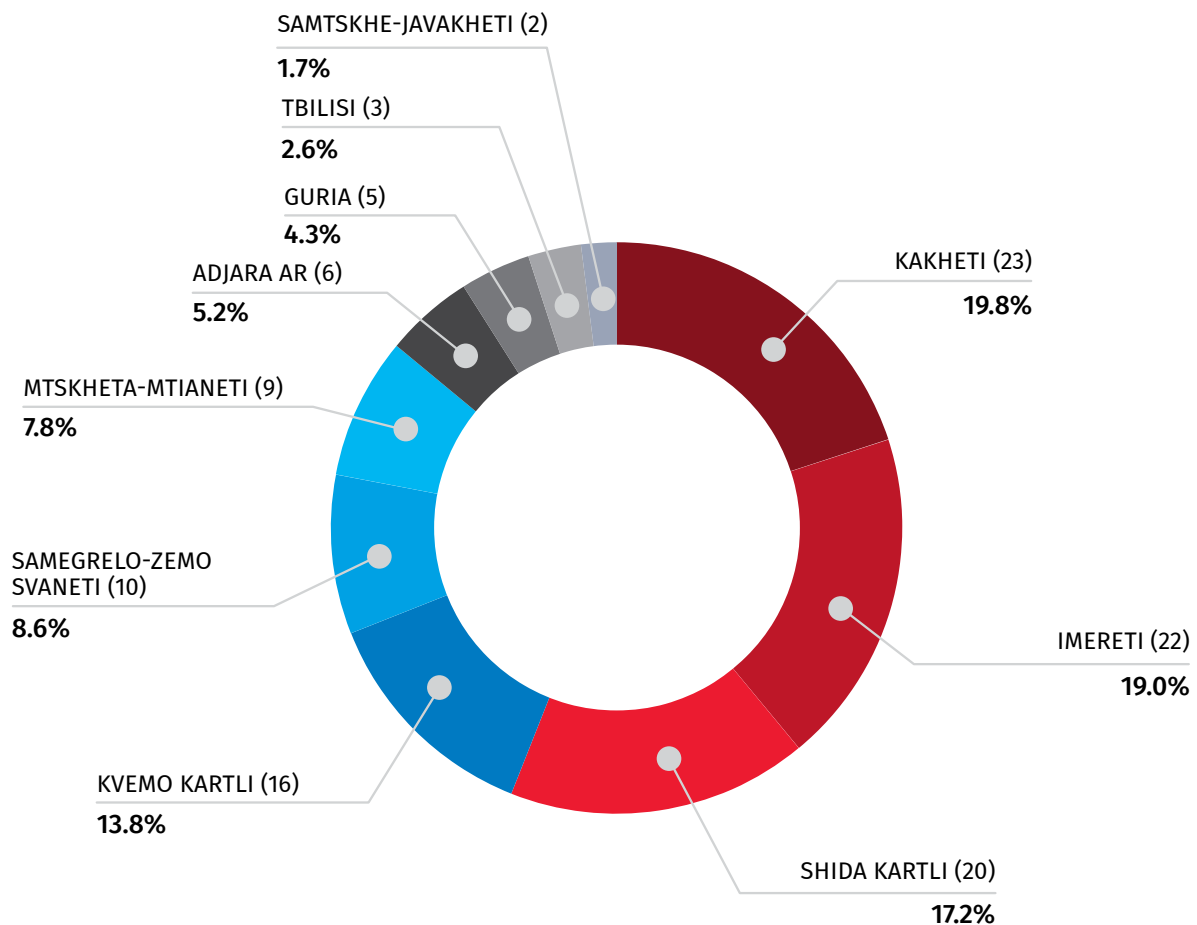

**SURVEY RESULTS FOR LIVESTOCK SLAUGHTERHOUSES,
ELEVATORS AND COLD STORAGE FACILITIES
(II QUARTER, 2026)**

SLAUGHTERHOUSES

The total number of active livestock and poultry slaughterhouses in Georgia in the II quarter of 2026 was 116, of which 19.8 percent were located in Kakheti region, 19.0 percent in Imereti region, 17.2 percent in Shida Kartli region, 13.8 percent in Kvemo Kartli region, 8.6 percent in Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region, 7.8 percent in Mtskheta-Mtianeti region and the remaining 13.8 percent — in other regions:

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According to the survey, 128.1 thousand heads of livestock were slaughtered in slaughterhouses in the II quarter of 2026, of which 27.3 percent were cattle, 65.6 percent – pigs and 4.1 percent – sheep and goats. The share of other livestock (excluding poultry) slaughtered was 3.0 percent. In addition, the number of poultry slaughtered in slaughterhouses during the reporting period amounted to 2 942.1 thousand.

In total 14.3 thousand tons of meat (i.e. slaughtered weight, including poultry meat) was produced by slaughterhouses during the II quarter of 2026, of which 31.9 percent was beef, 25.0 percent – poultry, 42.5 percent – pork, 0.6 percent – mutton and goat meat, while the share of other meat was negligible.

The service was provided to 7.8 thousand persons, 48.8 percent of which were households. Average monthly number of persons employed in slaughterhouses equaled 1 076 persons.

The average prices of the slaughter services were: 47.0 GEL per cattle, 36.7 GEL per pig, and 16.4 GEL per sheep or goat.

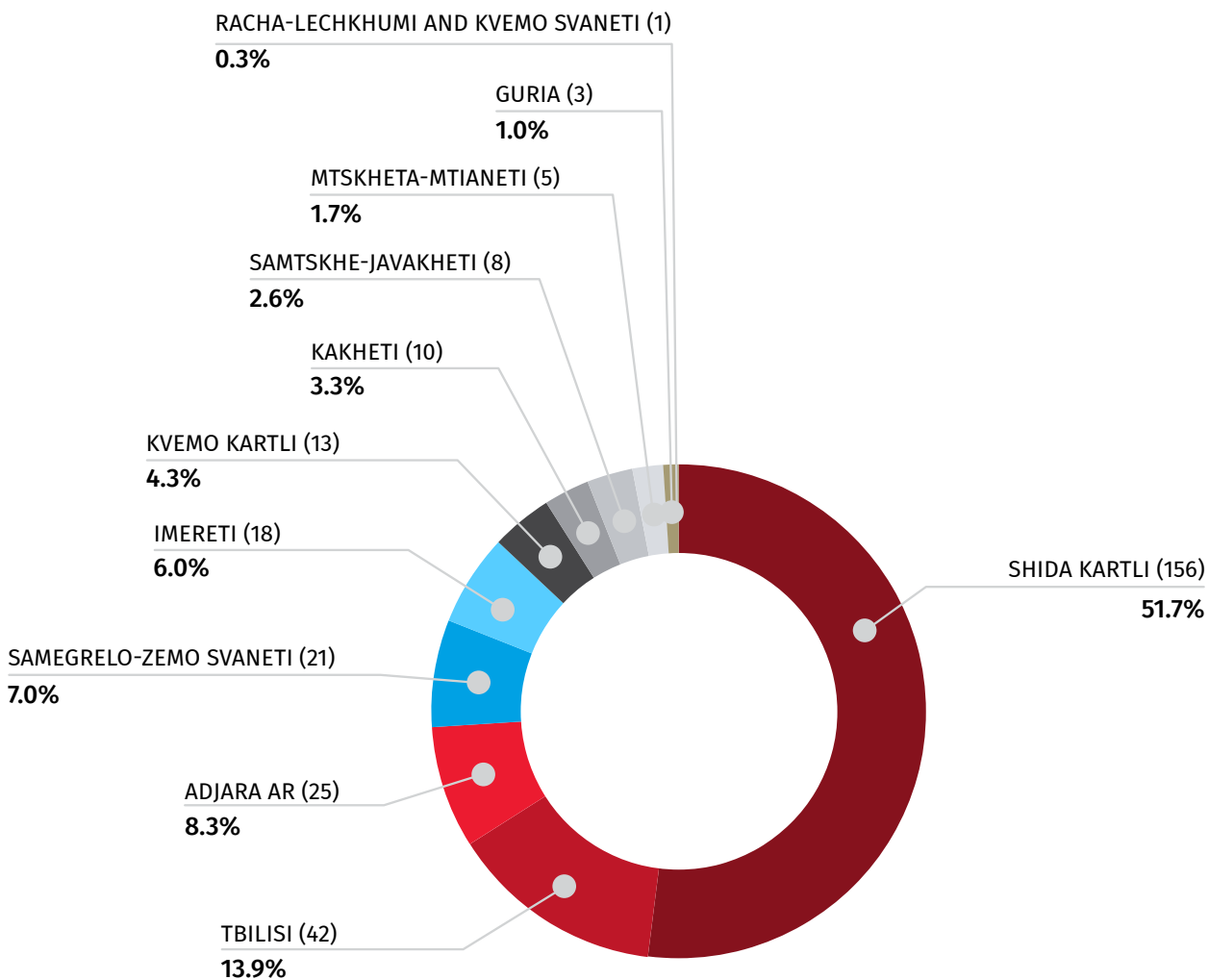
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COLD STORAGE FACILITIES

In the II quarter of 2026 the number of active cold storage facilities in Georgia was 302 and most of them were located in Shida Kartli region (51.7 percent). Active cold storage facilities were also located in Tbilisi (13.9 percent), Adjara AR (8.3 percent), Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region (7.0 percent), Imereti region (6.0 percent), Kvemo Kartli region (4.3 percent), Kakheti region (3.3 percent), Samtskhe-Javakheti region (2.6 percent), Mtskheta-Mtianeti region (1.7 percent), Guria region (1.0 percent) and Racha-Lechkhumi and Kvemo Svaneti region (0.3 percent):

ACTIVE COLD STORAGE FACILITIES IN GEORGIA BY REGIONS, II QUARTER, 2026

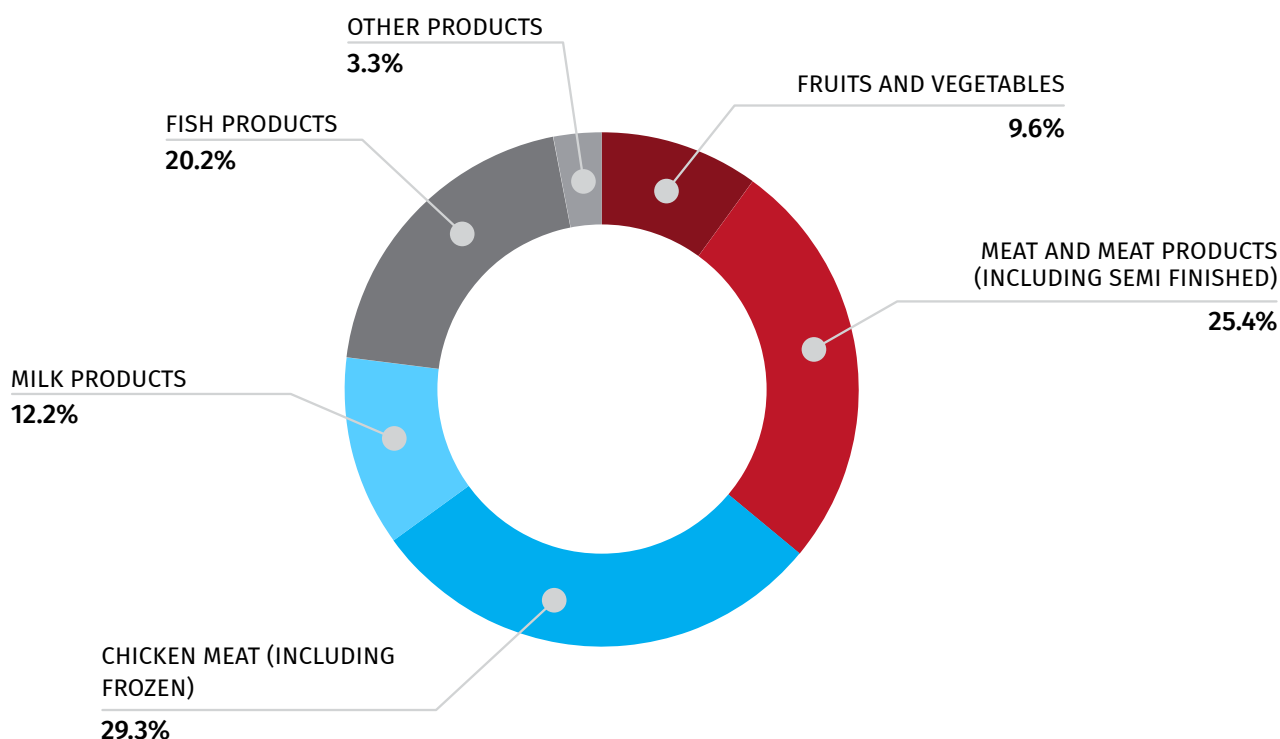


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In the II quarter of 2026, the service was provided to 361 customers. The number of producers and resellers, from whom the products were purchased, amounted to 863 persons and the average monthly number of persons employed in cold storage facilities was 1 698.

In total 119.4 thousand tons of products were stored in cold storage facilities during the II quarter of 2026, of which 29.3 percent was chicken meat (including frozen meat), 25.4 percent – meat and meat products (including semi-finished products, excluding chicken meat), 20.2 percent – fish, 9.6 percent – fruits and vegetables, 12.2 percent – milk products and 3.3 percent – other products:

**PRODUCTS STORED IN COLD STORAGE FACILITIES,
II QUARTER, 2026**



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In the II quarter of 2026, the share of own production in the total volume of products stored in cold storage facilities was 22.1 percent, while the share of products purchased for further resale was 21.7 percent and the share of products stored as services was 56.1 percent. The service fee collected in the same period amounted to 7.8 million GEL.

In the II quarter of 2026, the total value of products (32.1 thousand tons) sold by cold storage facilities amounted to 302.0 million GEL, of which the share of imported products was 35.3 percent, share of own production was 19.1 percent and the share of products (local) purchased for resale was 45.7 percent. Herewith, 66.4 percent of own production sold by cold storage facilities was meat and meat products (including semi-finished products). In the same period, significant share of imported products was milk products (40.0 percent), meat and meat products (including semi-finished products) (22.5 percent), chicken meat (including frozen) (13.5 percent) and fish (7.8 percent).

In the II quarter of 2026, the value of products sold by cold storage facilities on the foreign market amounted to 3.8 million GEL, which constituted to 1.2 percent of the total value of products sold in the same period. Mostly fruits and vegetables were sold on the foreign markets.

According to the survey results, the average daily load per storage (out of total storage capacity in percentage) was 48.6 percent in April, 45.7 percent in May and 52.3 percent in June.

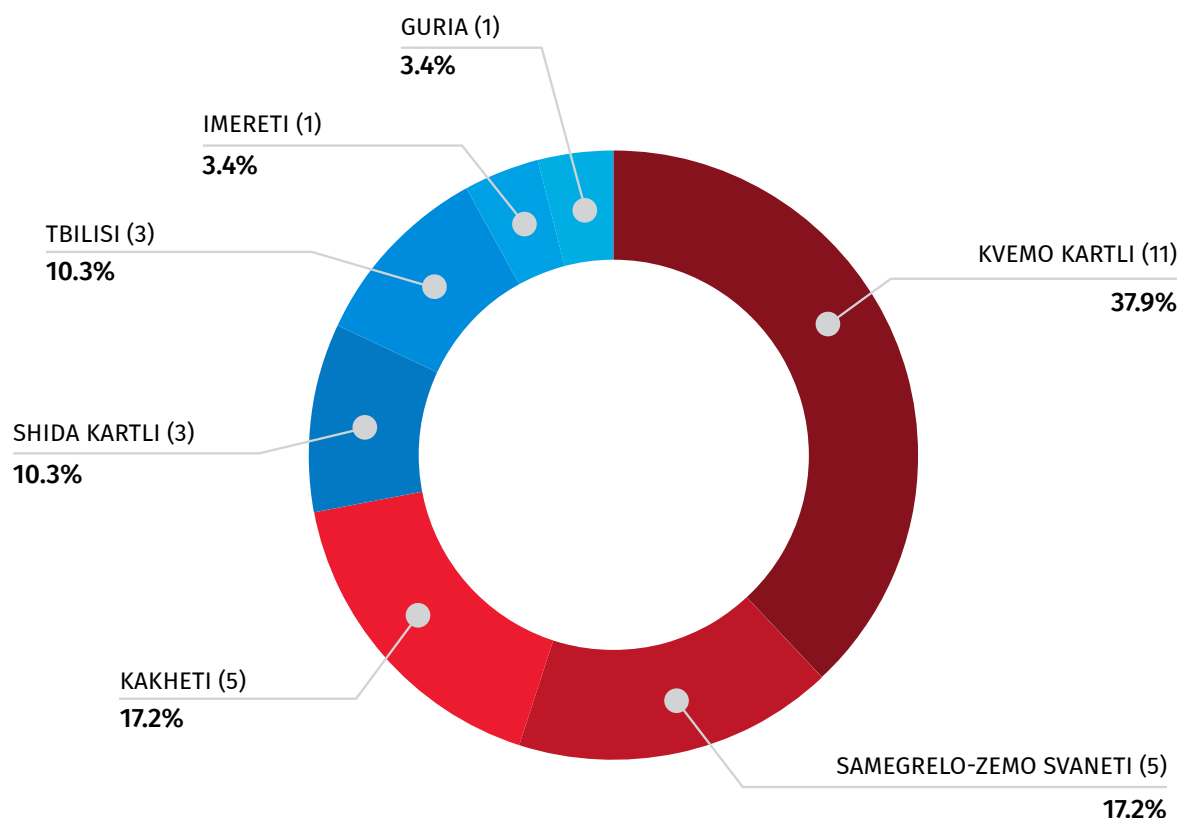
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ELEVATORS

The total number of active elevators in Georgia in the II quarter of 2026 was 29 and most of them were located in Kvemo Kartli (37.9 percent) region, while 17.2 percent of active elevators were located in Samegrelo-Zemo Svaneti region, 17.2 percent in Kakheti region, 10.3 percent in Shida Kartli region, 10.3 percent in Tbilisi, 3.4 percent in Imereti region and 3.4 percent in Guria region:

**ACTIVE ELEVATORS IN GEORGIA BY REGIONS,
II QUARTER, 2026**



In the II quarter of 2026, the service was provided to 24 customers. The number of producers and resellers, from whom the product were purchased for resale, was 49 persons, while the average monthly number of persons employed in elevators equaled 381.

In total 116.1 thousand tons of products were stored in elevators during the II quarter of 2026, 55.1 percent of which was wheat and 21.4 percent – soybean meal. The share of products purchased by the elevators for resale in the total amount of products stored in the elevators was 69.6 percent in the same period.

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Total amount of products sold by the elevators during the II quarter of 2026 amounted to 69.4 thousand tons with total value of 70.3 million GEL. 44.1 percent of this value was imported products and 47.0 percent was local (own produced) production.

The biggest share in own production, in terms of volume as well as value, had wheat flour, which constituted to 76.9 percent of total own production sold by the elevators in the same period.

According to survey results, average daily load of storages (out of total capacity of storages in percentage) amounted to 43.8 percent in April, 48.6 percent in May and 51.5 percent in June.
