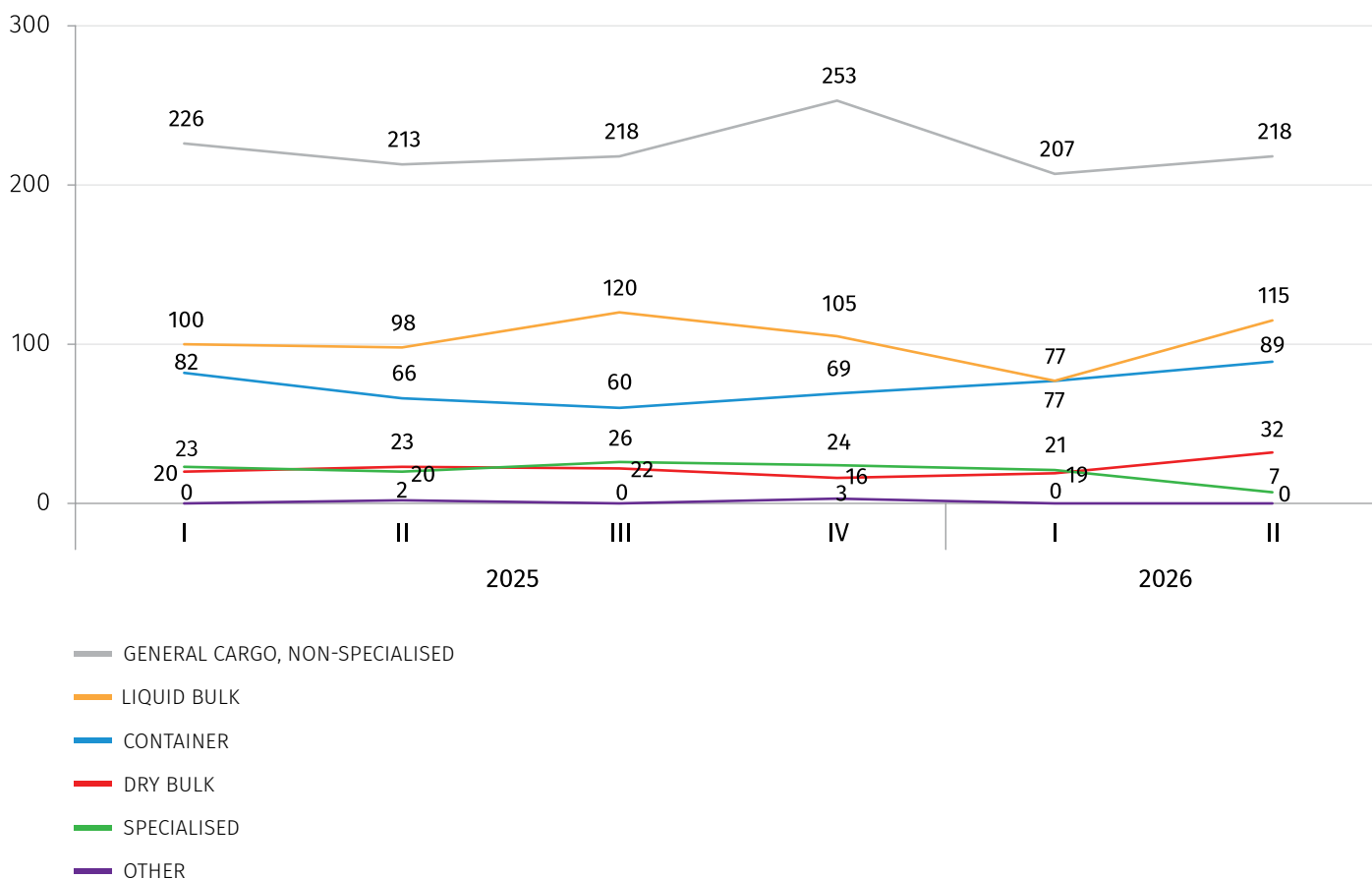

MAJOR INDICATORS OF SEAPORTS AND TERMINALS (2026, II QUARTER)

In the II quarter of 2026, 461¹ ships entered the ports and terminals of Georgia. 47.3 percent of those ships were general cargo carriers, 24.9 percent were liquid bulk, 19.3 percent – container ships, and the rest of 8.5 percent were distributed among dry bulk carriers and specialized ships.

In the II quarter of 2026, compared to the corresponding period of the previous year, the ports and terminals of Georgia received 39.1 percent more dry bulk, 34.8 percent more – container ships, 17.3 percent more – liquid bulk, 2.3 percent more – general cargo carriers, 65.0 percent less – specialized carriers.

NUMBER OF ENTERED SHIP BY TYPE, (UNIT)



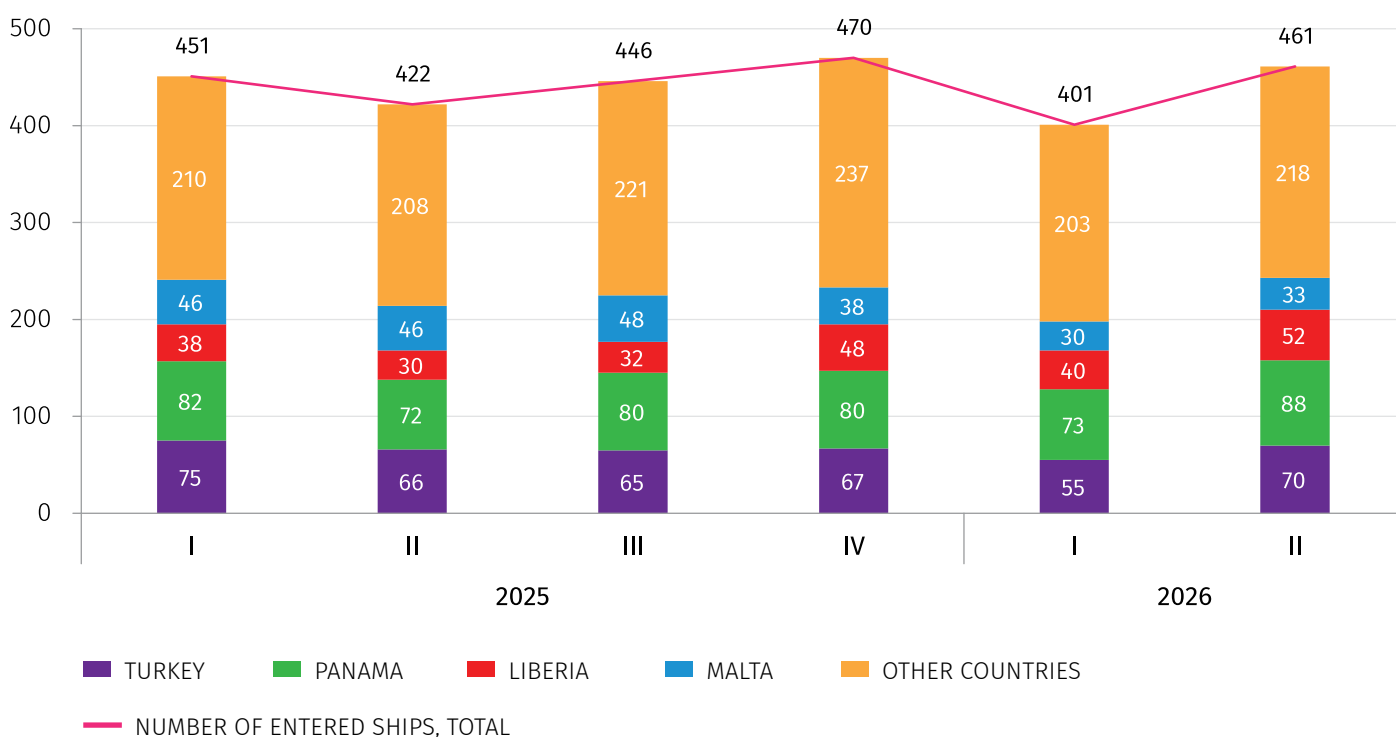

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In the II quarter of 2026, 19.1 percent of the ships arriving at the ports and terminals of Georgia sailed under the flag of Panama, 15.2 percent – under the flag of Turkey, 11.3 percent – under the flag of Liberia, 7.2 percent – under the flag of Malta, and the rest of 47.3 percent were distributed among other countries.

(UNIT)**

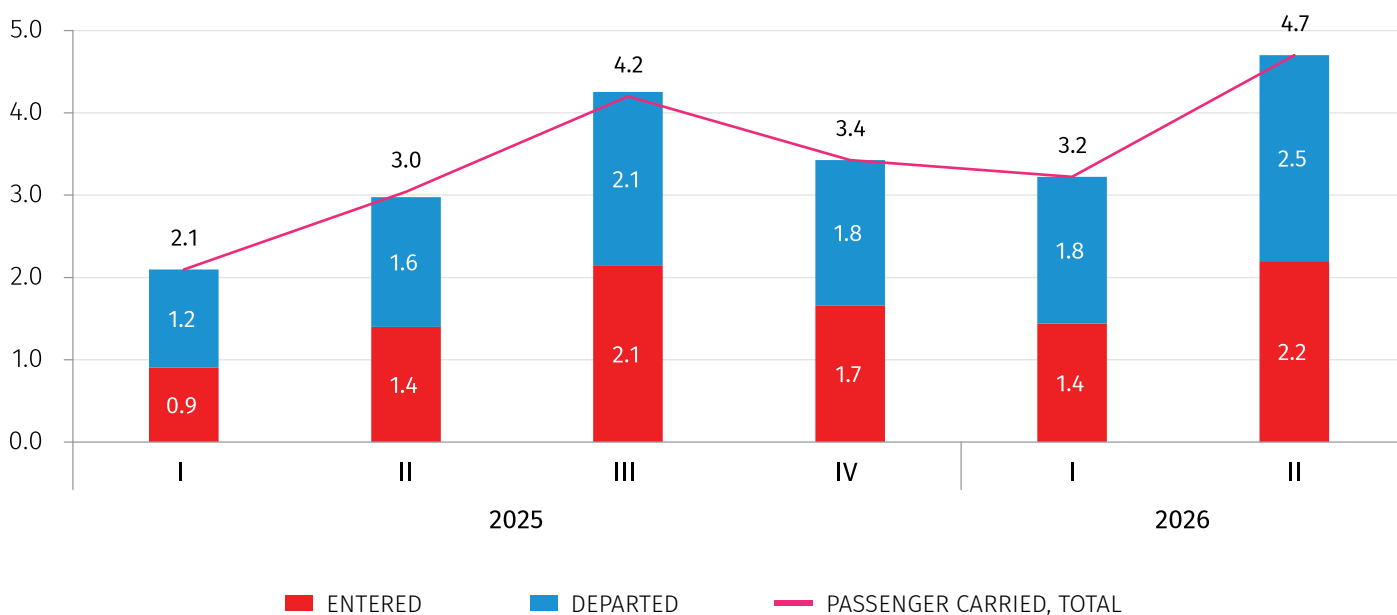


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In the II quarter of 2026, Georgian seaports served 4.7 thousand passengers, which is 54.5 percent more compared to the corresponding figure of the previous year. Note, the share of passengers departed was higher than the share of passengers entered and stood at 53.2 percent.

PASSENGERS CARRIED IN PORTS AND TERMINALS OF GEORGIA, (THOUSAND PERSONS)

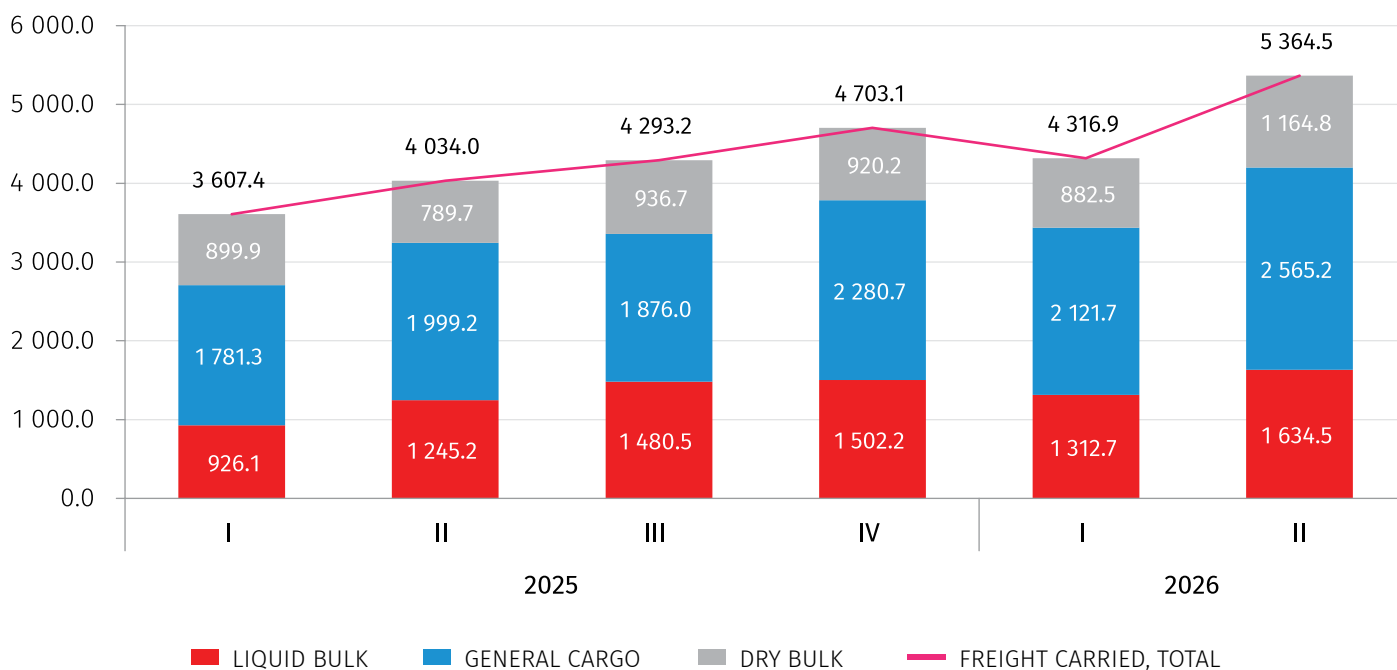


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In the II quarter of 2026, ports and terminals of Georgia processed 5 364.5 thousand tons of cargo, 33.0 percent more compared to the corresponding figure of the previous year. 47.8 percent of processed freight was general cargo, 30.5 percent was liquid bulk, and 21.7 percent – dry bulk.
